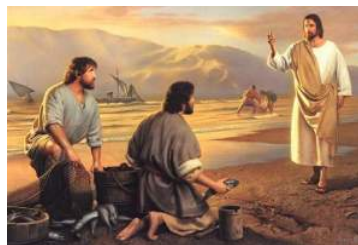

Come and See



In our first reading today, Isaiah speaks to a people living through discouraging and oppressive times. Through him, God communicates a message of encouragement and hope: "I give you as a light to the

nations, that my power may reach to the ends of the earth." Then, Saint Paul addresses the people of Corinth in a way that reminds them they are united as one with one another in Christ, the Light of the world. In the Gospel, we once again hear from John the Baptist, who spent his entire life pointing to Jesus. John now steps out of the way so that Jesus can more fully emerge among the people to show us what it means to be people of the Light.

Like the Baptist, we are all called to point the way to Jesus and to live as people of the Light. Light does not draw attention to itself; it simply reveals what is there and makes the way visible. When we live as people of the Light, we allow Christ's presence in the world to be seen, felt, and heard. We each do this in our own way. For some, it involves teaching or preaching about the God who loves each of us unconditionally. For others, it means healing bodies or aching hearts. Others reveal Christ by lifting spirits through a gentle word, a listening ear, compassionate service, or speaking up for powerless, voiceless, or vulnerable people in society. Still others remind people they are seen and valued through their kindness, welcoming spirit, or supportive presence. There are countless ways to reveal God-With-Us and to be the eyes and hands and feet of Christ, Light of the world. We point to Christ by being Christ-like.

As a parish, we are called the Catholic Community of Christ Our Light. "Community" comes from a Latin word suggesting a group of people sharing a common work or service. Our Mission Statement states our shared work: To embrace the Body of Christ and to reflect His Light to the world. Like the people of Corinth, we are united as one with one another in Christ. We gather as one every week to be nourished by the Word and Eucharist. Then, we are sent out to live our ordinary lives in ways that reveal what we have heard and received. How amazing it would be if someone says to us along the way: "I think you remind me of someone. . . . You remind me of . . . Jesus!"

Reading for January 18, 2026

John 1:29-34

Adults:

What has God sent you into the world to do? How do you live out this call?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Youth:

How are you living your life so that it points others to Jesus?

Children:

How do you share good news with people and how have people shared the Good News of Jesus with you?

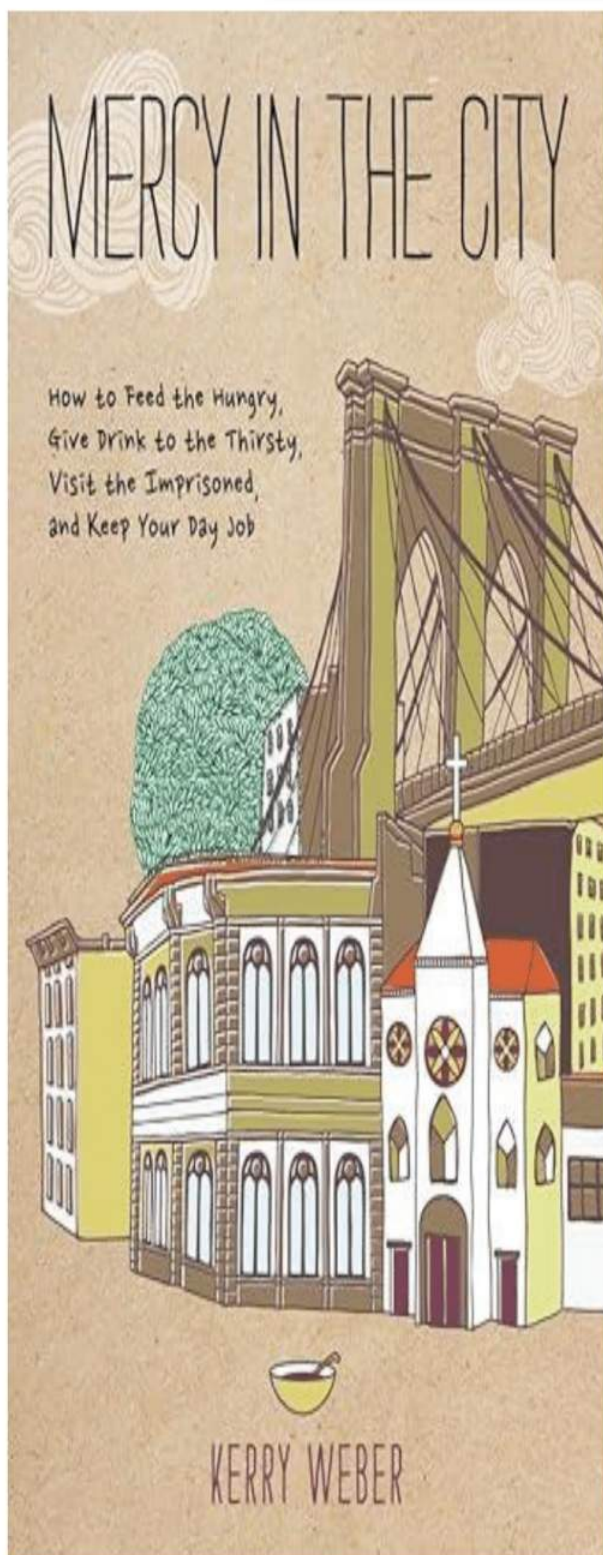
Rite of Welcome

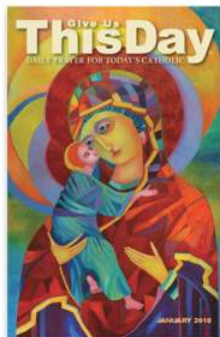

Our parish subscription to the daily devotional book Give Us This Day will expire in March.

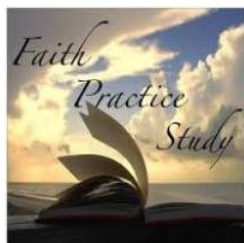
