Celebrating Pope Francis' Creation Care Legacy

Pope Francis will be remembered for making all things that
live on the earth a pastoral priority. He helped the world to
see caring for creation not as a political, social, scientific or
ideological battle, but as a moral imperative. This is because
the poor and future generations will suffer most from envi-
ronmental degradation. He taught that abusing our
"common home," (the earth, its ecosystems and all forms of
life that depend on it), "...is a grave sin."

Francis spoke of the growing environmental crises as signal-
ing broader broken relationships between man and God,
man and his fellow man, and man and nature. He also em-
phasized that social, economic, political and environmental
issues we're experiencing are not separate problems, but
are dimensions of one overarching crisis.

In his landmark encyclical *Laudato Si': On Care for our Com-
mon Home*, Francis spoke of an "integral ecology" and
demonstrated that everything is interconnected. To address
the environmental crisis, Francis taught that we need to fix
our relationship with God, our fellow humans, and be open
to an "ecological conversion." As part of his legacy, Pope
Francis solidly established ecology and stewardship of crea-
tion as a pro-life, pro-marginalized, and pro-family issue.

U.S. Bishops' Chairman on Doctrine Issues Clarification on Just War Theory

WASHINGTON – In light of recent public comments regarding the Catholic Church's teaching on war and peace, Bishop James Massa, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Doctrine, issued the following statement:

"For over a thousand years, the Catholic Church has taught just war theory and it is that long tradition the Holy Father carefully references in his comments on war. A constant tenet of that thousand-year tradition is a nation can only legitimately take up the sword 'in self-defense, once all peace efforts have failed' (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 2308). That is, to be a just war it must be a defense against another who actively wages war, which is what the Holy Father actually said: 'He does not listen to the prayers of those who wage war.'

"When Pope Leo XIV speaks as supreme pastor of the universal Church, he is not merely offering opinions on theology, he is preaching the Gospel and exercising his ministry as the Vicar of Christ. The consistent teaching of the Church is insistent that all people of good will must pray and work toward lasting peace while avoiding the evils and injustices that accompany all wars."



The Catechism of the Catholic Church on Just War Doctrine

All citizens and all governments are obliged to work for the avoidance of war. However, "as long as the danger of war persists and there is no international authority with the necessary competence and power, governments cannot be denied the right of lawful self-defense, once all peace efforts have failed." (CCC, no. 2308)

The strict conditions for *legitimate defense by military force* require rigorous consideration. The gravity of such a decision makes it subject to rigorous conditions of moral legitimacy. At one and the same time:

These are the traditional elements enumerated in what is called the "just war" doctrine. The evaluation of these conditions for moral legitimacy belongs to the prudential judgment of those who have responsibility for the common good.

(CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH, NO. 2309)

The Church and human reason both assert the permanent validity of the moral law during armed conflict. "The mere fact that war has regrettably broken out does not mean that everything becomes licit between the warring parties." (CCC, no. 2312)

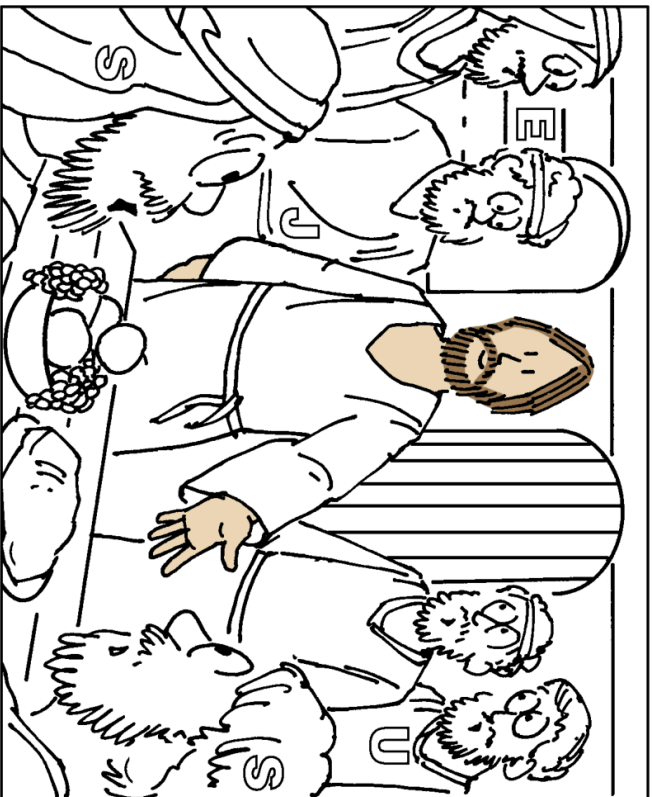

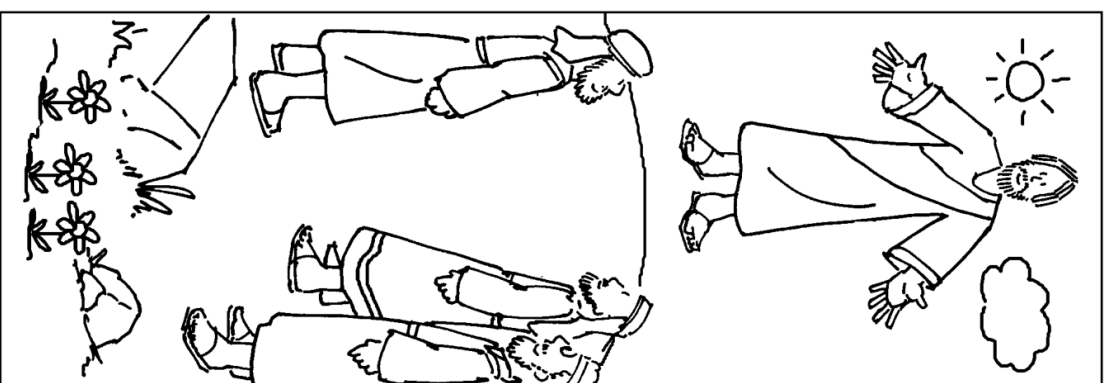
