The House of Charity provides the day-to-day operational income that supports the pastoral, charitable and social ministries of the Diocese, including: Catholic Charities, support for seminarian education and housing for retired priests, support for Vitality Catholic Healthcare Services, support for Catholic education, as well as support for our various pastoral ministries.

The House of Charity – Bishop's Annual Appeal supports people to people ministries that serve the South Jersey Community today. In service, we encounter those in need where they are, accompany them on their journey and bring them to a place of hope.

Monies that are raised in this fiscal year are expended next fiscal year. Without the House of Charity, the Diocese could not fulfill the mission that Christ gave us to care for His people.



CATHOLIC STRONG CAMPAIGN FOR THE CATHOLIC COMMUNITY OF SOUTH JERSEY

Of the funds raised through the Catholic Strong campaign, 70% will remain at the parish. There is no single case statement because each parish has been asked to identify their unique needs and way they will put their dollars to use. These needs could include updates to physical plant needs, new or expanded youth and pastoral ministries, and the hiring of staff to expand the effectiveness of parishes. Whatever the individual case, each parish has had the opportunity to identify their own needs and how they would like to spend the dollars raised to meet those needs.

At the same time, 30% of the dollars raised will be returned to the Diocese for use in creating new religious education, addiction support, and other ministries that cannot be supported by current funding sources. In addition, new evangelization efforts will be established to reach out to non-Catholics, people living on the fringes of our society, and to those who have left the faith.

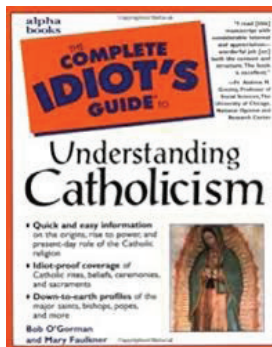

In honor of Black History Month, we would like to highlight some black saints.



St. Josephine Bakhita— Feast day February 8

For many years, Josephine Bakhita was a slave but her spirit was always free and eventually that spirit prevailed. Born in the Darfur region of southern Sudan, Josephine was kidnapped at the age of 7, sold into slavery and given the name Bakhita, which means fortunate. She was resold several times, finally in 1883 to Callisto Legnani, Italian consul in Khartoum, Sudan. Two years later, he took Josephine to Italy and gave her to his friend Augusto Michieli. Bakhita became babysitter to Mimmina Michieli, whom she accompanied to Venice's Institute of the Catechumens, run by the Canossian Sisters. While Mimmina was being instructed, Josephine felt drawn to the Catholic Church. She was baptized and confirmed in 1890, taking the name Josephine. When the Michielis returned from Africa and wanted to take Mimmina and Josephine back with them, the future saint refused to go. During the ensuing court case, the Canossian Sisters and the patriarch of Venice intervened on Josephine's behalf. The judge concluded that since slavery was illegal in Italy, she had actually been free since 1885.

Josephine entered the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1893 and made her profession three years later. She soon became well loved by the children attending the sisters' school and the local citizens. She once said, "Be good, love the Lord, pray for those who do not know Him. What a great grace it is to know God!" The first steps toward her beatification began in 1959. She was beatified in 1992 and canonized eight years later. She is the patron of Sudan and of human trafficking survivors.



St. Martin de Porres— Feast Day November 3

On May 16, 1962, Pope John XXIII made Martin de Porres the first black American saint. Martin was born on December 9, 1579, in Lima, Peru, the illegitimate son of Don Juan de Porres of Burgos a Spanish nobleman, and Ana Velasquez, a young freed Negro slave girl. From early childhood Martin showed great piety, a deep love for all God's Creatures and a passionate devotion to Our Lady. At the age of 11 he took a job as a servant in the Dominican priory and performed the work with such devotion that he was called "the saint of the broom".

Martin was placed in charge of the Dominican's infirmary where he became known for his tender care of the sick and for his spectacular cures. In recognition of his fame and his deep devotion, his superiors dropped the stipulation that "no black person may be received to the holy habit or profession of our order" and Martin was vested in the full habit and took the solemn vows as a Dominican brother. As a Dominican brother, he became more devout and more desirous to be of service. He established an orphanage and a children's hospital for the poor children of the slums. He set up a shelter for the stray cats and dogs and nursed them back to health. Many miraculous cures, including the raising of the dead, were attributed to Brother Martin. Today throughout South America, Central America and the islands of the Caribbean, people tell of the miraculous powers of St. Martin de Porres.

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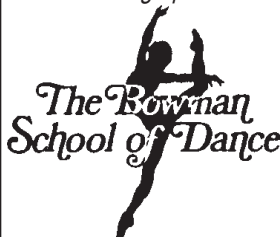
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
