The Word

Reading for December 29, 2019

Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

Adults: What experiences do you have of God “speaking to you” and directing your life and work?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God’s word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God’s word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God’s presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God’s presence and be still, surrounded by God’s love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God’s nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Teens: God speaks to us in our intuitions and imagination, as Joseph learned in his dream. What is your experience of hearing God speak to you?

Children: When you pray, how does God seem to speak to you?

Christmas Reflection

A Voice in the Silence

Long ago and far away, a prophet of the Lord declared, "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call Him Immanuel, which means God with us" (Isaiah 7:13-14).

From the time of Moses, down through the centuries, prophets such as Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, and Micah spoke vehemently and unrelentingly of the Savior who would carry the iniquities of the world. The people waited with great anticipation for the King that was coming soon.

Then one day, all fell silent. For 400 years no prophets rose up to tell the people of the Messiah that was soon to come. There was not a word, a sound, or a single prophecy professed to the world. Had God forgotten His promise?

It did not come as a loud trumpet, nor a roar from a stalwart, mighty lion. It did not come as a flash of lighting, nor a clap of incandescent thunder. But as the single cry of a baby in the darkness, announcing His arrival into the world.

It was a lovely scene when this child released His voice into the town of Bethlehem. The stable was small and humble, yet somehow undeniably reverent. The animals, too, seemed to understand what was taking place. The donkey was a mix of dark brown and gray, and had a gentle though self-assured way about him. The lamb cuddled close to the baby, seeking to keep him warm with its curly white locks. The moos of the cows, the bleating of the lambs, and the soft clucks of the chickens all blended together melodiously.

Then there were the people. Clothed in a light blue headdress, the mother held the baby close to her heart, her face serene and in awe of the precious child. The husband stood above her with his hand holding firmly to his staff, playing the role of a devoted father who was guarding his wife and son. The shepherds were simply dressed and approached the babe with a humble eagerness. Meanwhile, men clothed in royal garments came forth. Their sagacious, mature, and royal faces immediately becoming spellbound by the small, innocent baby. Each came bearing a single gift; one of gold, one of frankincense, and one of myrrh.

Then there was the baby Himself that they had come to see. His precious baby eyes, which had envisioned the creation of the world, were intense, beautiful, and healing. His smile possessed the light of the world and drove out the darkness around Him.

'Twas such a humble dwelling place for a mighty king that would bring salvation to the world. He could have been born wherever He so chose. But he wasn't born in a palace or in the presence of wealthy rulers. He was born before impoverished shepherds, bleating lambs, snorting pigs, clucking chickens, and whinnying horses. He had sought out the lonely, the empty, the hurt, the grieving, the depressed, and the outcast. He had come as a living prophecy that would pay with His own pure, sinless blood for the sins of His children.

In the end, not one of us is a reject, unwanted, too lonely, too flawed, or too broken. For on this day in the city of David, all are chosen daughters and sons of the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Rejection, severed relationships, and pain are healed and all is right with the world. The Christmas King, the baby in the manger, reaches up His hands to you, His blessed child. He looks into you with the eyes that envisioned the creation of the world and loves you. He is the father to the fatherless, the friend to the outcast, and the Savior to the lost. No, He isn't a king with a golden crown and royal purple garments; for He is already clothed in majesty. For there are Christmas trees dressed in tinsel, hot cocoa, presents, and caroling, but the greatest of all is the gift of love. Forever chosen. Forever loved. Forever healed. Forever Christmas.

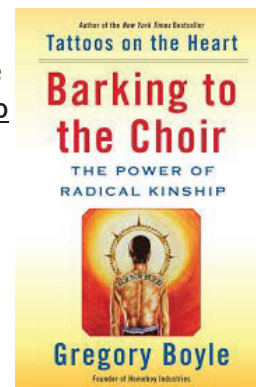

Mustard Seed Mission Trip Aug 15-22



Mustard Seed Communities began in 1978 in the impoverished community of Mona Common on the outskirts of Kingston, Jamaica, as a home for a handful of abandoned and disabled children. Today we serve over 400 children, young adults, and families who belong to the most vulnerable groups in Jamaican society. The populations of our homes include children and young adults with disabilities, children affected by HIV/AIDS, and teen mothers along with their babies. MSC Jamaica also manages a number of community outreach programs to combat poverty and provide education to local populations.

Diocesan Victim Compensation Program

NJ Independent Victims Compensation Program



The Diocese of Camden – along with the other Roman Catholic dioceses in New Jersey – has established an Independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as children or young adults, were sexually abused by a priest of the Diocese. The IVCP is independently administered by experienced victim compensation experts Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros.

The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and operates independently of the Diocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established Protocol. The amount of compensation for those who make a claim will be independently determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims – no matter when the abuse occurred – are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially.

Victims of clergy sexual abuse of a minor can begin the process of utilizing the program by going to www.njdiocesesivcp.com and reviewing the protocol for submitting a claim.

Bishop Sullivan strongly encourages anyone who was sexually victimized by a priest of the Diocese to participate in the IVCP, and has asked that anyone who knows of someone who was abused to contact them so that they are aware of the IVCP and can participate in it.
