Adults:

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Teens:

How can you spend time with each member of your family this week in a way that will communicate your love for them?

Children:

What could you do to show respect for Jesus this week as the Church remembers his Death and Resurrection?

Public Masses are still cancelled until further notice. School is now closed until at least April 20. Our school administration, faculty, parents and students continue to do a great job with remote learning and classes. The parish and school offices will continue to be closed until further notice.

Public Masses and Liturgies for Holy Week, the Triduum, and Easter will not be held. I will celebrate Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Sunday liturgies and those liturgies will be posted on our Parish Website as soon as possible after the celebration.

On Saturday, April 4 from 9:00 to 10:00 AM, our parish center will be open to accept sandwiches you are invited to make in your home and drop off. These sandwiches will be distributed to the poor and the people of Joseph's House in Camden. We, as a parish community, will continue to do all we can to support the sick, dying and most vulnerable of our community. Thank you for your continued generosity to our Food Pantry and for sending in your weekly financial contribution. I am most grateful.

All of the clergy, our seminarian, Ricardo, and our staff continue to be healthy and continue to work as best we can from remote locations.

and other donations for Joseph's House should be dropped off in the Servers Room in the Ministry Center. The doors will be unlocked. Casseroles can be put in the freezer and other items on the cart. If you can, please use pans and lids provided for the casseroles in the lower left cabinet on the church wall behind the Welcome Desk. Mark with date prepared and main ingredients.

In addition to casseroles, the following items are most needed at this time:

- Hand soap
- Hand Sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol (travel size or larger)
- Clorox Wipes
- Disinfectant Spray
- Bottled Water
- Sandwiches (cheese and turkey or beef bologna- please use gloves and disinfect surfaces to make these)
- Individually packaged snacks with cheese and crackers, granola bars, trail mix, etc.
- Coffee
- Coffee Creamer - powdered
- Sugar

Also, please consider making a donation, no matter how big or small, to help address immediate needs. In these unprecedented times where demand for services expands and availability of supplies shrinks, your donation will support JH in the long term. Reflection by Chris Becker

In the Desert

So here we are, once again in the Lenten season, called by the Spirit out into the desert for a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and this time this time it feels different.

Coronavirus. Social Distancing. Worry a sense of separation. What does it look like as we try to live out faith in this particular sort of desert, when the routines and the rhythms of life are disrupted, when church activities and even public masses are canceled? We know that God can speak to us through the difficult and the isolating, so in these days what do we find He is saying to us? What are the ways that He is calling us to live out the Lenten practices, and what lessons do we take with us beyond this time? The three thoughts below are intended to prompt conversation, and hopefully in the weeks to come we can add to these with other ideas.

Empathy and Solidarity

As we experience separation from each other, we've been given a precious opportunity to remember those in our community for whom this is the norm of life. The elderly and the home-bound often live each day cut off from others, with hearts aching to be seen and loved. God sent them into the world with words to speak and gifts to share Do we see and hear them? Listen to what they have to say, because they've lived in this reality far longer than we have Can they be our teachers in this moment? And as many of us face economic challenges of reduced or lost work, can we likewise find greater solidarity with the poor? Can we allow the desert to deepen our sense of communal responsibility for one another, and to strengthen our compassion?

Routine, Rhythm, and Prayer

We live a sacramental faith, one rooted in place and time, where the spiritual and physical encounter one another in shared meals and songs and gatherings, and changes to the rhythm of those practices can leave us feeling adrift. Perhaps in these weeks we can grow closer to God through the other rhythms of our days, those of rising, eating, praying, working, resting, caring, conversing, and sleeping Can we find and set aside some time each day to pray? Can we offer to God our smallest and most ordinary actions as gifts of love? For those of us whose lives are usually more hectic, maybe this can be a time of recollection and of meeting Jesus in solitude and the quiet (or the noise if you have small children at home!) While public masses have broadly been canceled, many parishes have started streaming the mass online, and in this time when we can't physically receive Christ in the Eucharist, we can remember to make prayers of spiritual communion.

Connection and Sharing

Social distancing has removed many of the usual ways that we connect with each other. Our faith is one of community, of giving and receiving, and this time may be offering us a chance to create new bonds with each other through unexpected channels. Can we share time together through virtual means such as Skype, Zoom, or Facetime? For those who live alone, perhaps we can share a meal with someone over an open video call, or watch a movie and talk about it afterwards. Are there ways we haven't thought of to volunteer our time or resources to help, even at a distance?

Hopefully we can have further and fuller conversations in the days and weeks to come about how to live as the Body of Christ in this present circumstance, and how to nurture a deeper sense of Hope. What might we learn from each other here in the desert during this Lent, on the long road to Holy Week and the Cross? What is God calling us to this year, and where will He take us next?
