New Sacristan Ministry



My dear friends as I am getting settled and learning about our Church I have noticed an important Liturgical need, a Sacristan Ministry. There are a couple of persons who do this now to some extent. However, it is a ministry we need for all of our weekday Masses, weekend Masses, and Funeral Masses.

The duties of a Sacristan are to set up prior to Mass and to put everything away after Mass. This includes the hosts, the water and wine, the purificator's, corporal, lectionary, chalice, ciborium's, candles around altar and tabernacle, missal, tabernacle key, turning on all lights – if needed. The Sacristan for each Mass would then put all items away and pre-prepare for the next Sacristan.

I will hold a training session on Wednesday September 9th, at 7pm in the Church and Sacristy for any who may be interested. Please contact me at jpclinic@christourlight.net.

When coming to the training session please make sure to wear your face mask at all times and we will keep a 6ft social distance. If you want to join this ministry, but you have Covid concerns, I will hold another session once the pandemic has passed. I am looking forward to hearing from you.

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time - August 23, 2020



And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. (Mt.16:18-19)

One of my all-time favorite theological works in Ecclesiology (the theological study of the Church) is Cardinal Avery Dulles' work, "The Models of the Church." I felt the book was a simple read, but profound and very practical. His six models are mystical communion, sacrament, servant, herald, institution, and community of disciples. Each model important, like a leg that supports a chair or stool, if one is missing or too light or too heavy it causes an imbalance.

Yet, when we read the book we clearly will lean towards one or two depending on our own view of the Church. That is ok so long as we do not eliminate or ignore the other models. And sometimes today people will move away from the institutional model, for many reasons, one being scandal, some others may include not agreeing with the Church on certain moral and theological teachings. Nevertheless, the model of the institution was not created after Jesus' ministry but during it.

In today's Gospel Jesus' conversation with Peter could not be clearer. Jesus established Peter as the Rock, placing authority upon him to serve, govern and lead in his stead. This was nothing new, we heard in our first reading, "I will place the key of the House of David on Eliakim's shoulder; when he opens, no one shall shut when he shuts, no one shall open. I will fix him like a peg in a sure spot, to be a place of honor for his family." (Is. 22:23)

When King David was not present in the capital or in the palace his authority was placed in the hands of his steward, Eliakim. The opening and shutting refers to authority and the people were to listen and accept Eliakim's decision as if it were King David's himself.

Jesus places Peter into the place of Steward, head of His household, so that Peter will bind and loose in His name. This stewardship has continued to this day to our very own Pope Francis.

This office is not given to anyone else, no one else has the responsibility or authority to bind and loose, besides the apostles who were also given this authority in Matthew 18:18, but were not given the keys, they decide in union and solidarity with the Chief Steward if you will on what is to be bound and loosed.

Some may not like this, some may disagree, some totally ignore it, yet there it is in the very heart of Sacred Scripture. It is also found in numerous writings of the early Church Fathers; they all understood it and believed it. An eternal truth established by Christ Himself. A truth that the great St. Thomas More was martyred for, not simply in the matter of King Henry's divorce to Catherine, but in not accepting Henry as the head of the Church.

Cardinal Dulles understood that each model is vital and that people will favor certain models depending on their perspective, culture, upbringing, etc., yet each model is there for a reason. Today's model the institutional model helps keep the Church grounded, gives it a visible leader and leadership, a sense of unity and purpose. Greater still, however, is that Jesus would entrust ordinary men (sinners even) to take this role. They too, even though Popes need God's grace, like us all. I loved that St. John Paul II would often refer to himself as a servant of servants. True leadership lies not in power, but in surrender and service, St. Peter did both, it is why Jesus called him, "The Rock."

Elementary Faith Formation

EFF & YFF Registration



Faith Formation Registration

The Elementary and Youth Faith Formation offices are developing classes for the coming catechetical year. At this time we cannot give you a definite picture of faith formation for 2020-2021 however we have purchased a new curriculum for grades 1-6 from Sadlier Publishing that includes student text-

books as well as online instruction, activities, and a digital parent guide. The "Christ In Us" curriculum is "spiral", meaning that every grade level will experience the same faith lesson, with more in depth content as the years increase. For example: a family with a 3rd grade student and a 5th grade student will both study the same religion lesson geared to their grade and age. This allows parents to assist their children without having to move from subject matter to subject matter.

At this time we are considering home instruction until the first of the year 2021. Each week during this time the children will have a brief Zoom meeting with a catechist to review the previous week's lesson, answer questions, and introduce the new lesson. Parents are then responsible for assisting the children with the content and to oversee assigned homework. More information about this catechetical model will be forthcoming.

Sherine Green and the 7th and 8th grade catechists are structuring a hybrid model of catechesis too. Stay tuned for more information re YFF classes.

PLEASE register your children for classes ASAP. EFF and YFF will happen this year!

Families can register online from the COL website or download, print and complete forms and send to the EFF office with the appropriate fee.

These are challenging times. Maintaining a connection with our Catholic faith and continuing our children's faith formation has never been more important than it is now.
