We will be holding one of our periodic collections for the Cherry Hill Food Pantry the weekend of February 13-14. The items that they are requesting are shampoo, deodorant, napkins and detergent.

Last year the food pantry distributed nearly one million pounds of food (946,293 pounds). In the course of 2020, they served 1980 families with 1190 adults, 1258 children and 298 seniors. Outstanding work in a time of outstanding need.

One of the most pressing needs of the Cherry Hill Food Pantry at this time is donations to help fund their renovations at the new facility at 910 Beechwood Ave. in Cherry Hill. The hope is that with these renovations and the end of the pandemic, they will be able to return to their former model of letting clients choose their own food off a shelves rather than receiving already packed bags.

Because of this unique time in the pantry history, we are inviting people to give cash donations instead of supplying the items requested at the beginning of this article. We will have envelopes for these donations at all the church doors beginning the weekend of January 30-31. These envelopes can be deposited in the regular collection basket. A Message from Fr. John Picinic

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We have been through so much together over the last year, most especially with the covid pandemic. The Church, our parish and many other communities have had to figure out new ways to reach their people. We recently marked the one year anniversary of the first identified case of covid 19 in the U.S.: January 20. To say our lives have changed dramatically is understatement. I'd like to share this reflection with you.



One of the brand new terms that has entered our daily conversation is "social distancing." It is shorthand, as we know very well, for the practical physical precautions that we all need to and must take in order to protect ourselves and others. I'd humbly suggest though, that we use the term itself sparingly, if at all. Language is a powerful shaper of thinking. And the very last thing we need right now, is a mindset of mutual distancing. We actually need to be thinking in the exact opposite way. Every hand that we don't shake must become a phone call that we place. Every embrace that we avoid must become a verbal expression of warmth and concern. Every inch and every foot that we physically place between ourselves and another, must become a thought as to how we might be of help to that other, should the need arise. It is obvious that "distancing," if misplaced or misunderstood, will take its toll not only upon our community's strength and resiliency, but upon the very integrity and meaning of our spiritual commitment. ... Let's stay safe. And let's draw one another closer in a way that we've never done before.

A Reflection on Social Distancing By Rabbi Yosef Kanefsky B'nai David-Judea Congregation, a Modern Orthodox Synagogue in Los Angeles

Black History Month: A Musician's Perspective

During the month of February the United States recognizes the profound contributions Black Americans have made to the patchwork of our national quilt. There is not a single art form or industry that has gone without change influenced by Black perspectives. From a global point of view, even institutions we see as immovable or unchanging have been altered by the African diaspora. In my personal vocation, it is difficult to go a single day without being witness to the magnitude of these contributions. It would be impossible to theoretically analyze the harmonic, rhythmic, or stylistic structure of a piece of church music written in the last 100 years, without understanding the impact that Black Americans have had on the American musical voice. At the root of this influence is a single musical genre unique to music development in America — the Spiritual.



During the “Great Awakening” of the 1730s, societal norms shifted in the American Colonies and Black Americans became exposed, more than ever before, to the religion of their captors. Biblical stories of the exile of the Jews and their captivity strongly resonated in the slave community as they began to see parallels with their own experience. The words from Israel’s Exodus and the trials of Moses form the textual backbone to Spiritual songs.

The Spiritual also employed a very distinct set of musical devices. First, Spirituals departed from the march-like feel of protestant anthems of the 17th and 18th centuries. Instead, Spirituals had a strong rhythmic energy underpinning the text and melody. Spirituals made a revolutionary use of syncopation—often referred to as ‘ragged time.’ This syncopated style was more complex than other religious music of the day. Singing in a ‘ragged time’ manner would have added a sense of tension and release through each melodic and textual phrase, binding the music and lyrics together more tightly than the European model.

Conversely, the melodies and harmonies in Spirituals were simpler and more accessible. Rather than employing the 7 noted scale with which the Protestants or Catholics would have been familiar, Spirituals took advantage of a pentatonic, or 5 noted scale. This made melodies easier to sing as a community and easier to remember. This would have been especially important to a community that did not have access to written music.

Taken together, all of these attributes formed the personality of the Spiritual. This distinct style would withstand the test of time and go on to influence not only the development of Gospel, Jazz, and the Blues, but also have a lasting impact on nearly every other American music genre that followed.

To kick off our observance of Black History Month here at Christ our Light, we have invited Tonya Dorsey to lead music at the 4:30pm Mass on Saturday February 6th. Tonya Dorsey is the Director of Music at St. Martin de Porres in Philadelphia and is also the conductor of the Archdiocesan Catholic Gospel Choir of Philadelphia. She will be joined by Karen Clifford, who will serve as Cantor. While Gospel Music and the Spiritual are both distinctly American genres of music, what better way to celebrate the beauty of this style than by experiencing it authentically through a pair of experts that have lived this style throughout their entire career?

We will continue the celebration of Black History through the rendition of Gospel and Spiritual songs at all weekend Masses throughout the month of February.
