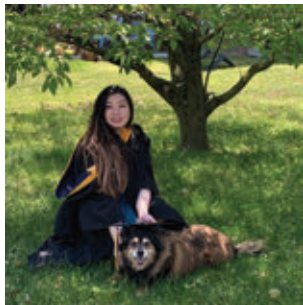

LeAnh Hoang

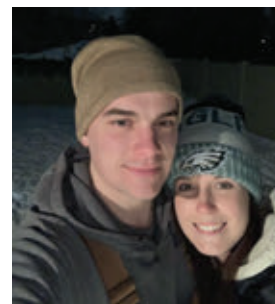

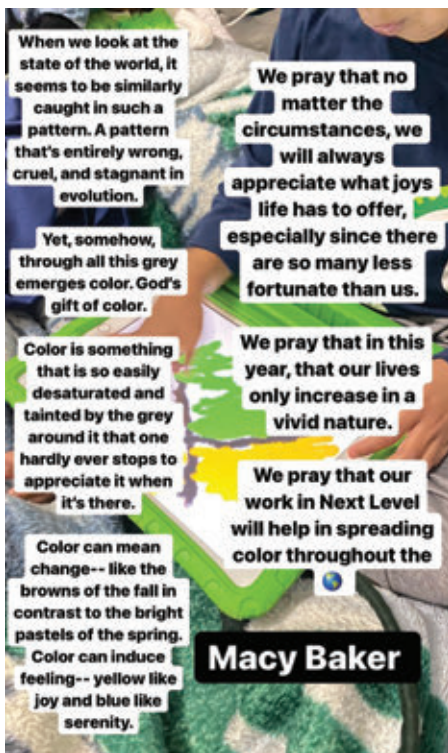
Youth Reflection

To make music in the heart.”

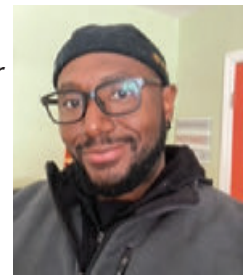


Young Adult Ministry

Black History Month

Venerable Henriette Delille

This week the Unity Rich in Diversity Focus Group is featuring Venerable Henriette Delille, SSF. Venerable Henriette is in the second phase of the canonization process. A banner of Sister Henriette is placed in the Sanctuary. Part of her story follows.

Henriette Delille was born a free woman of color in the French Quarter of New Orleans in 1812. At that time there was a three-tier society in New Orleans: at the top were the white colonists; then the free people of color, who were about 25% of the population of New Orleans; then the enslaved, who were also about 25% of the population. The free people of color were of a mixed race. They either bought their freedom or were freed by their masters or their masters no longer wanted to hold them enslaved.



After experiencing the lifestyle of a free person of color and having her two children die before she was the age of 18, Henriette had a religious conversion. She received her Confirmation in 1834 and in 1836 she rejected the lifestyle into which she was born. She then starts a prayer group for women called the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. She wants to do good works and she is influenced by the local Ursuline Sisters. She then taught at a local school just outside of the French Quarter to those of multi-ethnic, racial, and cultural heritage.

With the strong support of the Pastor, in 1842 Henriette started the order of the Sisters of the Holy Family at St. Augustine Church with her two best friends. The women bought a house with three goals in mind: to work with the uneducated; to minister to the poor; and to take care of the elderly, particularly those who had been enslaved.

The Sisters of the Holy Family welcomed senior women into their home, caring for them through serious sickness and death, especially during the yellow fever epidemic of 1853, when 8,000 people died. Henriette also opened schools for enslaved children of color at a time when educating them was forbidden by law.

The only photograph of Mother Henriette Delille was taken at about 1860. She is not wearing a habit because people at that time did not want the Sisters of the Holy Family to wear a traditional habit, so they wore a widow's Ordinary Mourning dress. Henriette died in 1862 from consumption (tuberculosis). Her cause for canonization was opened in 1988. In 2010, Pope Benedict XVI recognized her holiness and moved her one step closer to official sainthood, thereby confirming what was said in her obituary: "For the love of Jesus Christ she had become a humble and devout servant of the slaves."

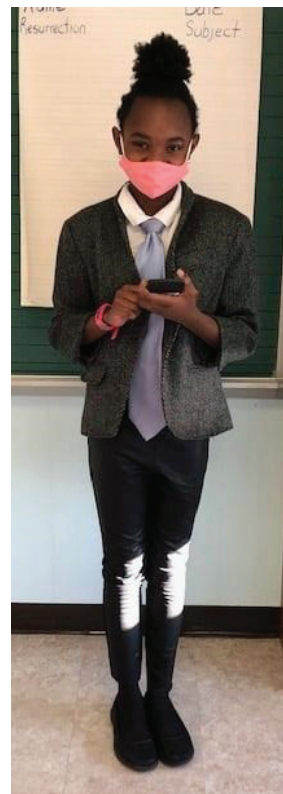

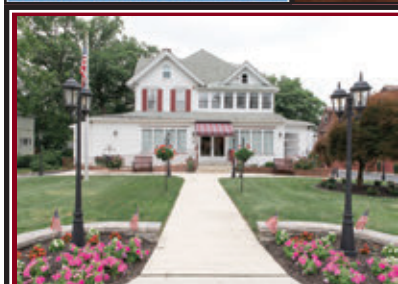
