- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

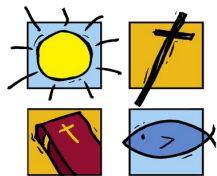

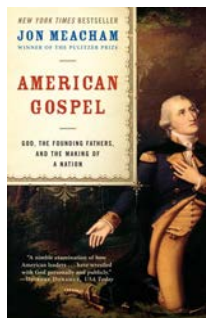
Guide Book & Directory Advertising Opportunity

The theme for this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is ["We are one people, one faith, one hope, one love."](#) Read about the history of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity and how it can help us build bridges between different faiths.
- 19** The [Two Feet of Love](#) is a new initiative that encourages Catholics to take two steps towards poverty awareness each day. One step is to learn more about poverty, and the other is to take action to help those in need. Read about the initiative and how you can get involved.
- 20** Our faith teaches us that we have a responsibility to work together to safeguard each person's rights, including working together for greater economic justice, addressing income gaps, and increasing economic issues. Learn more about [the call for economic justice](#) and how you can support this important work through CCHD.
- 21** [Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton](#) was the first African American priest in the U.S. and dedicated himself to his parishioners, many of whom were poor. Read about his life and work, and how his example inspires us to address racism in our communities.
- 22** We must work together and dignity of all persons, at every stage of life, promoting rights for all. Use [this prayer](#) to reflect on our role in promoting the life and dignity of the human person, including those not yet born and those experiencing poverty and injustice.
- 23** Throughout our lives, God accompanies us. In a very special way, God is close to those who suffer, and are marginalized. Watch [this video](#) and reflect: What priority do those who experience poverty have in my heart?
- 24** Poverty disproportionately impacts the elderly. Read about how CCHD funded organizations such as the [Massachusetts Senior Action Council](#) have organized around issues such as a voter and transportation, often challenging for elderly to access, trapping them in a cycle of poverty. Take our [Poverty Quiz](#) and see what you have learned about poverty and the systems and structures that impact our communities.
- 25** "But racism still profoundly affects our culture, and it has no place in the Christian heart. This evil causes great harm to its victims, and it corrupts the souls of those who harbor racist or prejudicial thoughts." (Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love - A Pastoral Letter Against Racism). Read about how one CCHD-funded group is working to address racial divisions in West Baltimore.
- 26** Poverty does not strike all demographics equally. Nearly all of the roots of systemic poverty such as lack of access to food, affordable housing, and quality education disproportionately affect communities of color. Read about how CCHD is addressing not only homelessness and food accessibility, but the myriad of other issues that arise when a large percentage of a community is affected by poverty.
- 27** Read about [Living Hope: A Voice for the Vulnerable](#). CCHD provides funds to help Living Hope empower members of the disability community. They work to not only provide wheelchairs, but also ensure that people with disabilities and disability, but they also work to give them a voice and place in society.
- 28** In [Fratelli Tutti](#), Pope Francis invites all people of good will to live out a discipleship built on love that fosters universal fraternity and social friendship. Read more about how CCHD promotes the culture of encounter. Pope Francis calls for in [Fratelli Tutti](#).
- 29** Pope Francis reminds us, "In service of the poor, there is no room for competition. Rather, we should humbly recognize that the Spirit is the source of our actions that lead to a common good." Read about how one parish in Arizona demonstrates this connection in their Sunday worship.



- 30** Our faith requires us to go to the peripheries, cross borders, and reach out to those who are poor and need—especially those in need of healing and forgiveness to transform their lives. Learn about how Catholics and other people of faith and good will are putting this call to restorative justice into practice through the support of CCHD. How can you show God's love and mercy to those in need of healing and hope?
- 31** Keep the conversation about poverty going with your family, in your parish, and in your community. 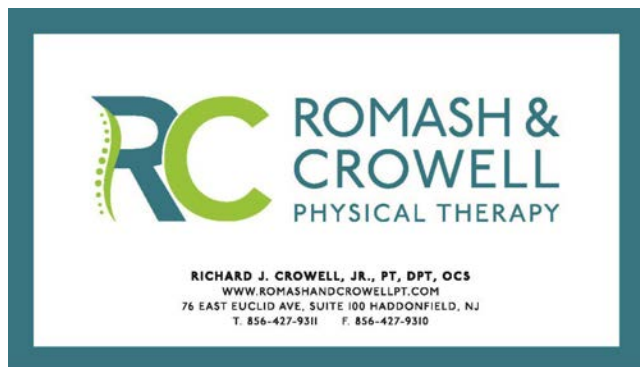

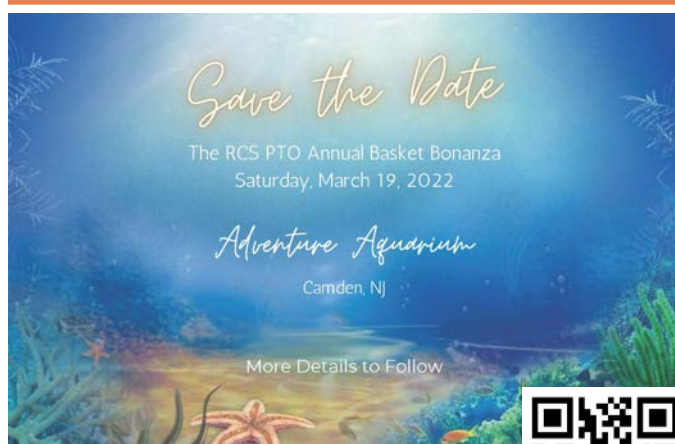
