- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Vision 2024

Unity Rich in Diversity



Last week Deacon Frank offered us insight into the Life-Giving Relationships Pathway toward our Vision 2024. Nourished

through Eucharistic Liturgy with hospitality and engagement, we are lead to the Unity Rich in Diversity Pathway. Here we find an emphasis on intercultural competence as the foundation of activities toward inclusion and advocacy. Here we strive to stand in one another's shoes and walk their path.

This idea strikes us in a very poignant way these last two weeks, as we are transported through the news and social media to the experience of the people fleeing Ukraine. Never before have we had such an intense, close-up view of peoples' individual sufferings during war. Here, at a very safe distance, we struggle to imagine what it must be like to be a refugee. Our hearts are torn. We reach out with prayer, sacrifice, and donations. Interesting, as missionary disciples of Jesus, we naturally gravitate to our Lenten practices as ways to express feelings of helplessness and the desire to ease the sufferings of others. This is what we can do at the present moment for our brothers and sisters in a distant country. At the same time, still walking with these intentional shoes in our parish community and beyond, we can be more sensitive to our neighbors, those sisters and brothers nearby, whose lives we can touch and upon which we can have an effective and continuous influence through our social justice outreach programs.

Intercultural competence is opening our hearts, growing in understanding, and being sensitive to others who appear different from us. It is the capability to communicate effectively and appropriately with people of other cultures. Intercultural competence can begin with a simple, friendly greeting, as we stand side-by-side in worship, opening our hearts to our neighbor.

Jesus represents the inclusive, relational, and sacrificial agape love that we are to have for one another. He expressed diversity in his choice of the people he greeted and placed around him, those with different personalities, backgrounds, and experiences. Jesus welcomed all. Christian love always brings the stranger into fellowship and unity, a unity rich in diversity.

Rev. Msgr. Andrew Martin

Monsignor Andy Martin is from Camden, NJ. He was ordained for the Diocese of Camden in 1967 in Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome. He earned degrees in Philosophy, Theology, and Education from Saint Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore, the Gregorian University in Rome, and the University of Notre Dame in South Bend.

Msgr. served primarily in the ministry of Catholic Secondary Education as a teacher, department chair, vice-principal, principal and president in four of the high schools in his diocese. He also served on various diocesan committees, including Chairman of the Priest Personnel Board for a number of years. He served for three years simultaneously as president of a high school and pastor of a parish.

Upon his retirement in 2010 he was named President Emeritus of Camden Catholic High School where he continues to work in the Development Office of the school. He resides on the campus of the high school, a residence hall for 32 international students who attend the high school. This "retirement" work at the school is rewarding and keeps him in tune with young people today.

Msgr. Martin is grateful for the opportunity that Cross Catholic Outreach gives him to incorporate into his own priesthood this essential ministry to the poorest of

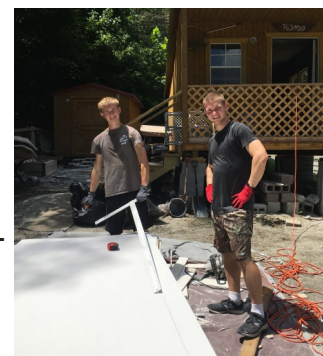

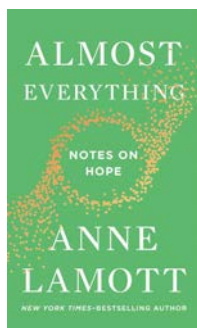

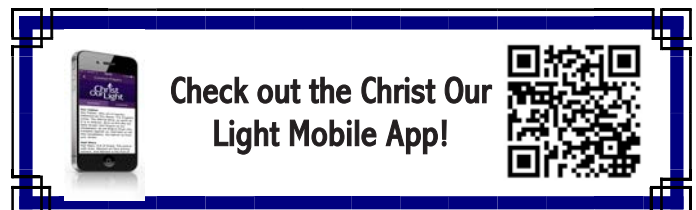

Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl



Guatemala

It's 5 a.m. in the village of Xequemeyá, Guatemala, but Raúl and Lilian Chanchavac are already starting their day. First, they thank God for all he has given them—their two sons, a field full of plants and a successful business. They certainly have a lot to be thankful for. It all started with a dream to flourish and to help others do the same.

"All things are achieved when one sets out to do so," Raúl says.

In their village, malnutrition is high, which is especially dangerous for children. The community also struggles with water scarcity, poor education, poverty and a changing climate. But Raúl and Lilian believe all this can be overcome.

They started working toward change by growing tomatoes. They dedicated long hours in their field, but plant diseases and other problems destroyed their crops. They felt defeated and humiliated, Raúl says. But they pushed onward.

Then Lilian heard about Catholic Relief Services' SEGAMIL program and how they could receive agriculture training and nutrition education for their children. Raúl and Lilian learned to manage and care for their crops. From there, they began growing for their business—adding onions, chili peppers and oranges to their crops. Produce was plentiful, but they continued to struggle—this time with selling it at markets.

Still determined, they entered CRS' Nuestra Cosecha program that helped them register with the government to begin selling their produce to 16 local schools. Soon, they hired family and community members to harvest and pack the food. Today, they are proud to be able to help others in their community—especially children.

"It helps them be stronger and to learn better ... and to avoid malnutrition in our village," Lilian says.

Today, Lilian and Raul are looking forward to the future.

Together with Lilian, Raul says, "Now that I am living a dream, other dreams come. Now, my dream is to expand the business ... so other people can benefit too."



Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl

We are called forth from the desert to encounter resurrection.

Lent gives us the opportunity to encounter Christ in the desert. With him, we face the temptation to despair in the face of the world's deepest needs, to throw up our hands in defeat. In Jesus' struggle, we find ourselves struggling: we are afraid of not having enough, afraid of not doing enough, afraid of not being enough. But, just as Jesus emerged from the desert fortified to begin his ministry, so too do we emerge from the desert of Lent ready to encounter the needs of the world with the hope of the Resurrection.

Yet, sometimes our fears can be paralyzing. We find ourselves focusing all of our energy inward. We find ourselves doubting if we have enough, if we've done enough, if we are enough—and we are afraid to act. Scripture reminds us time and again: "Be not afraid." In the person of Jesus—and in the countless holy women and men who have followed him—we see the power of giving fearlessly, of sacrificing what we have and what we are for the good of others.

Bolstered by faith, Jesus showed courage when confronted by fear. He did not waver in reaching out to those most in need. And we're called to do the same, trusting that our lives can be ones of fearless encounter pointing to the hope of the Resurrection.

This is where we turn to CRS Rice Bowl. Each day during Lent, we have the opportunity to be inspired by the stories of communities from around the world, to set aside a little of ourselves to make room for a stranger. This Lent, CRS Rice Bowl reminds us that the journey through the desert ultimately leads to resurrection—and that it is our Gospel call to stand with courage, bringing the hope of the Resurrection to a world often beset by hopelessness.

While the temptations of the desert tell us to be afraid, to cling to what we have and look out only for ourselves, the invitation of Lent beckons us forth to encounter the needs of the world through:

- A renewed life of **PRAYER** in God that unites our needs with the needs of the world, through the stories of members of our global human family
- A commitment to **FAST** that reminds us that God is ever faithful and frees us from the fear of not having or being enough
- A readiness to **GIVE ALMS** so as to share what we have with our brothers and sisters around the world.

This Lent, we journey with Christ through fear to fortitude, recognizing God's invitation to reach out beyond ourselves to encounter the needs of all.

God of all people, we offer you our Lenten journey. May we learn to walk as one human family, remembering in a special way those who are poorest and most in need.

Bless our prayers, our fasting and our Lenten gifts. Through these actions, we show our love for your Son, Jesus, and answer your call to love one another. Amen.

Deep and Real Prayer



Today's readings: Genesis 15:5–12, 17–18; Psalm 27:1, 7–8, 8–9, 13–14; Philippians 3:17–4:1; Luke 9:28b–36. In Luke's account of the Transfiguration, we hear these words: "Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray." The sole focus of the climb of the mountain was prayer.

What a stunning and revelatory moment it was for Peter, John, and James to experience Jesus praying deeply, changing in appearance, and even his clothes turning dazzling white. Seeing Jesus in his fullness, the apostles witnessed their friend's divinity. They were speechless when they heard God say, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

As we begin the second week of Lent, consider how Jesus prioritized prayer and the place it holds in your life.

Do you set aside time for prayer? Do you allow space to be silent before God? Examine your schedule to determine a time for prayer.

St. Paul tells us in the second reading that "our citizenship is in heaven." There, Christ will change our bodies to "conform with his glorified body." But he tells them first that they need to imitate the holy life that he has set before them, changing their focus from earthly things. Help yourself focus this week on heavenly things by praying the psalm from today and contemplating the refrain, "The Lord is my light and my salvation."



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, March 14

Share Mercy

Today's Gospel calls us to "be merciful." Merciful actions beget mercy. "The measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you," Jesus tells the disciples. Act on one of the seven corporal works of mercy: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the imprisoned, bury the dead, give alms to the poor. *Today's readings: Daniel 9:4b–10; Psalm 79:8, 9, 11; Luke 6:36–38.*

Tuesday, March 15

Truly Humble

People often tout their accomplishments and their status. Jesus' message today is contrary to such behavior. He tells us that the greatest among us must be a servant, and that those who are humble will be exalted. Seek to be conscious of whether you are boastful. When we act as the person God created us to be, there is no need to boast, for each one of us is made in God's image and likeness. *Today's readings: Isaiah 1:10, 16–20; Psalm 50:8–9, 16bc–17, 21, and 23; Matthew 23:1–12.*

Wednesday, March 16

Service

Jeremiah was a young prophet. When first called by God, he didn't want the job. He knew it would be tough to challenge people who were not following God's ways. Christians today can be wary of taking on their call as disciples. Jesus asks us to serve without seeking favor. For many of us such service is difficult. How will you follow Jesus today by serving others? *Today's readings: Jeremiah 18:18–20; Psalm 31:5–6, 14, 15–16; Matthew 20:17–28.*

Thursday, March 17

Priorities

Lying at the rich man's door, Lazarus would have liked to receive any bit of food. The rich man did not heed the poor any more than he was attentive to Moses and the prophets. Many things vie for our attention. Where do you put your focus: on Christian teachings and Scripture or on more earthly things? Make a list today of your top ten priorities. Where does God fall on the list? *Today's readings: Jeremiah 17:5–10; Psalm 1:1–2, 3, 4, and 6; Luke 16:19–31.*

Friday, March 18

Faith during Adversity

Jealousy, hatred, vengeful feelings are strong human emotions that can be at the root of poor choices. Cyril of Jerusalem, whose feast day is today, was treated unjustly by his contemporaries but remained faithful. He was the bishop of Jerusalem and later named a doctor of the church. He is known for his homilies that prepared catechumens for initiation into the Church. *Today's readings: Genesis 37:3–4, 12–13a, 17b–28a; Psalm 105:16–17, 18–19, 20–21; Matthew 21:33–43, 45–46.*

Saturday, March 19

St. Joseph, Spouse of Mary

As we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we hear in the Gospel that Joseph is "a righteous man" unwilling to expose Mary to shame. When an angel visited Joseph in a dream, he showed great trust and confidence in God's plan for him and Mary. Joseph is the patron of the universal Church. Pray through the intercession of St. Joseph today, mindful of his example of faith. *Today's readings: 2 Samuel 7:4–5a, 12–14a, 16; Psalm 89:2–3, 4–5, 27, and 29; Romans 4:13, 16–18, 22; Matthew 1:16, 18–21, 24a.*

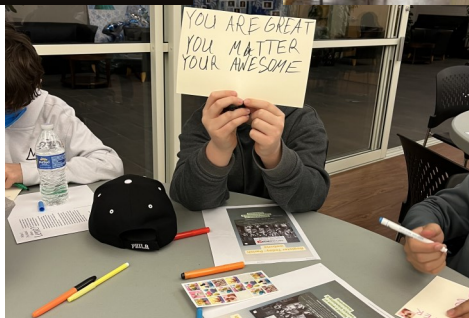


Each week we will share a reflection from different team leaders on the sacrament and how we continue to live this daily.
