Support for Ukraine - CRS

Vision 2024

Pathway to Healing



About three years ago a group that became the Pastoral Council identified four pathways to an intentional vision for the community of

Christ Our Light. Our vibrant church already drew members from outside the usual parish borders to experience joyful liturgies, compassionate opportunities for service and transformative encounters with God. As we shared our dreams for the future parish community several themes began to take shape. One of these themes is Healing.

An internet search for healing provides a wonderful definition from the National Center for Biotechnology Information: "Healing occurs through the integrating forces that restore, transform, sustain and nurture the whole person (body, mind and spirit) at each phase and in every dimension of life, and within relationships of the person to creation, to other people, and to God." While our Council did not have this working definition during our formation there was an instinctual response to the concepts. Scripture provides the framework for that instinctual response. So much of the public life of Jesus is about healing. Sometimes it was physical pain and often it was mental or spiritual affliction that evoked compassion and healing.

We have struggled through the challenges of the pandemic in need of the connection with our community. Many of our healing practices were placed on hold such as visiting the homebound, those in assisted living and people in nursing homes, other volunteer activities and in person meetings. We have adapted to virtual contacts and carried on as well as we could. While the experiences were not as satisfying as personal interactions, we can feel grateful that technology helped to bridge isolation. As we employ our hymnals and praise God we are joyful in things we took for granted just a short time ago.

The Christ Our Light community has always been about welcome for all who need restoring, sustaining, nurturing and transforming. Today's parable of the Prodigal Son illustrates God's amazing mercy in celebrating the return of a son who turned his back on his father. We are called to model reconciliation and bridge building, to notice those who are in need and to support those who are in physical or spiritual pain. There are many ministries, support groups and activities that promote belonging and wellness. If you find that we could add a source for help, please contact the office and reference the Pastoral Council for your suggestion.

1st Eucharist Preparation Continues

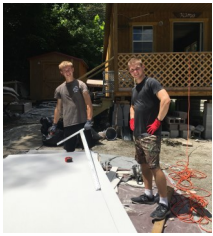

Temporary Housing Needed



We have two people in the Cherry Hill community who are in need of temporary housing. Both of their parents are now deceased and there was some damage to the family home which put them in a home in Cherry Hill which was leased to their late father through the homeowner's insurance coverage. They have been advised that the homeowners insurance coverage will not cover additional time. They need temporary housing until they are able to locate an apartment in an affordable housing complex. They can cover some rent for whoever can take them in. This is a temporary situation where two bedrooms are needed and they can pay rent. Lenten story: HOME AND FAMILY



My family is the most important thing to me.-Trinh

For Trinh, home is where her family gathers—to play, to eat, to rest. “My family is the most important thing to me,” she says.

One way she shows her family love is by doing chores around the house. She helps her family by bathing her little sister, Trang, showing her how to wash her hands and helping her with schoolwork. Trinh likes washing the teapot and cups and collecting eggs from the ducks. Often, Trinh will ride her bike to get medicine for her parents when they are sick.

Trinh likes to catch dragonflies and crickets with her sister. Since her house is surrounded by rice fields, and coconut and bamboo trees, there’s plenty of places for the sisters to play. But the house is also near a river, and when storms pass through, Trinh’s home often fills

with water. “I wish I would have a house that is not wet or leaky and would not flood anymore,” says Trinh.

In Vietnam, CRS is working with students like Trinh, helping them to learn ways to protect their home, food and family from destructive storms. Trinh is happy that she can apply what she learned in school to help her family.

Maria Ana from Honduras is no different. Her family’s home was destroyed in a recent accident, and her family is living in a temporary space—a small wooden hut—until they can get it fixed. It’s been hard living without a permanent place to call home. Everyone sleeps on the floor, and during the rainy season the roof often leaks. Maria Ana is hopeful her family will have a new house soon.

“I want to keep studying so I can help my family succeed,” she says.

To help make the dream a reality, Maria Ana works hard in school—and CRS provides school lunches to ensure she can focus on her studies and not on her hunger. Maria Ana also works in her community to earn money to support her family. At home, she helps with chores, like washing the school uniforms, helping to prepare the family meal, and fetching and boiling water to make it drinkable.

In Kenya, chores are one way Yvone helps her family too. Each morning she washes dishes, sweeps the house, prepares lunch for the younger children and washes their school uniforms.

Yvone's family has a hut where the family eats and sleeps, a stable for the animals and a separate kitchen hut. During the rainy season, the family collects water from a system on the roof. When it's dry, they borrow from neighbors or walk to a community water point to fetch water.

Yvone's family life has changed for the better thanks to a CRS program that teaches families about healthy food. In our next story, you'll learn how.

Catholic Social Teaching Connection Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

Lavish and Bountiful Mercy



Today's readings: Joshua 5:9a, 10–12; Psalm 34:2–3, 4–5, 6–7; 2 Corinthians 5:17–21; Luke 15:1–3, 11–32. A loving father with property and some wealth. A son who is steadfast but jealous. A son who is unsettled and wanders. In today's language, the family in the Gospel parable might be called "dysfunctional."

This family is not very different from today's families whose members exhibit a mix of jealousy, misbehavior, and mercy. After the younger son squanders his inheritance, he returns to his home with humility. The father greets the son, pouring out his love and mercy, and the son's return is celebrated with much feasting. However, the older son, because of

his jealousy, is blinded to his father's goodness, and selfishly questions the father's decisions. This son who has worked hard for his father does not realize what has been right in front of him for his entire life. The father in the story wants to share his wealth and life and love with both of his children, but pride gets in the way for the older son. With humility, the younger son accepts his father's forgiveness.

At times in our lives any of us might act as the younger son, at other times as the older son, and sometimes like the father. God is consistent, always offering unending love and mercy. He always seeks to find the lost and offer life to those once dead to sin.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, March 28 Seek the Miracle

With faith, the royal official asked Jesus to heal his son. Upon the son's healing, the whole household came to believe. Do you have a request for God? Realize that God is awaiting your petition. Look for Jesus today, for God is creating new heavens and a new earth at every moment. Find a miracle that unfolds for you today, however small, and share that with someone. *Today's readings: Isaiah 65:17–21; Psalm 30:2 and 4, 5–6, 11–12a and 13b; John 4:43–54. Optional for any day this week: Micah 7:7–9; Psalm 27:1, 7–8a, 8b–9abc, 13–14; John 9:1–41.*

Tuesday, March 29 You Are Near

“The Lord of hosts is with us; our stronghold is the God of Jacob,” we pray with the psalmist today. The psalm tells of the “astounding things” God has wrought on the earth. In the Gospel, the Lord certainly was with the sick man who had been unable to enter the pool. There we see the God of mercy who restores the man to wholeness. Trusting in God's presence, pray the refrain of today's psalm throughout the day. *Today's readings: Ezekiel 47:1–9, 12; Psalm 46:2–3, 5–6; 8–9; John 5:1–16.*

Wednesday, March 30 So Also the Son

In today's Gospel, Jesus states that “a son cannot do anything on his own, but only what he sees his father doing.” Jesus, the Son, does not do anything except through the power of God. What Jesus knows and sees the Father doing, Jesus will do. Who has taught you how to live as a Christian? Write a letter or call the person to acknowledge and thank them for their example. *Today's readings: Isaiah 49:8–15; Psalm 145:8–9, 13cd–14, 17–18; John 5:17–30.*

Thursday, March 31 Whom Do You Believe?

Many words and images come at us daily. Social media, news outlets, conversations with colleagues and friends flood us with messages. Jesus describes the many witnesses to his identity and power, but his listeners still don't trust all that he has to offer. What helps you believe that Jesus is the Savior? What keeps you focused on his message of truth? Make a point to name and claim that this week. *Today's readings: Exodus 32:7–14; Psalm 106:19–20, 21–22, 23; John 5:31–47.*

Friday, April 1 Ever Close

Have you ever felt brokenhearted? Do you know someone who is? Today's psalm reminds us that God is always close to those in need, to those struggling, and to anyone in distress. Be especially attentive to show kindness to people you meet. Many people are struggling silently. Your compassionate presence will be a sharing of your faith in our loving and merciful God. *Today's readings: Wisdom 2:1a, 12–22; Psalm 34:17–18, 19–20, 21 and 23; John 7:1–2, 10, 25–30.*

Saturday, April 2 Unite in Christ

In today's Gospel, we hear of a division occurring as people argued over whether Jesus is the Christ. Today, many people hostilely debate matters of Christianity. A visible sign of the reign of God is unity, which can be sometimes hard to achieve even in a parish. Talk about unity with your family or a friend and make a commitment to help unite people as the people of God rather than create any further divisions. *Today's readings: Jeremiah 11:18–20; Psalm 7:2–3, 9bc–10, 11–12; John 7:40–53.*

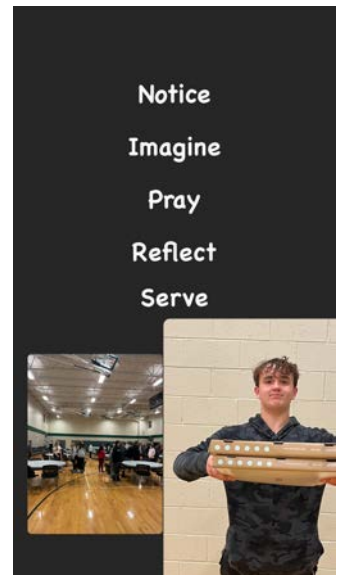
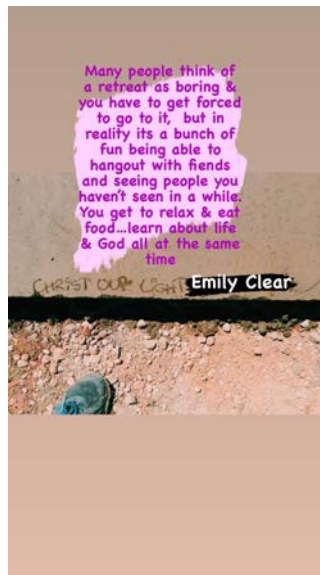
