On Monday, April 4, a Regional Penance Service will be held at 7:00 PM at Holy Eucharist Church, 344 Kresson Road, Cherry Hill.

Synod 2021-2023



In early October, 2021, the Pastor recruited four Parishioners to respond to Pope Francis' call for a world-wide

Synod on Synodality. The Synod was to include "Listening Sessions" to hear from the parishioners in all local communities.

The Diocese provided 42 questions, organized around 11 themes, to assist in the listening process, and conducted Coordination/Training Session on October 17th in Blackwood.

The team quickly developed a publicity plan, a schedule of in-person and video conferencing meetings and an on-line questionnaire to support the listening effort.

Four sessions were scheduled. The first was for Leadership (Pastoral Council, Finance Council and Ministries Leaders) after which the Listening instrument and session methodology was finalized. General sessions were scheduled for one and one half hours in a mid-week evening in the Parish Center and for a Saturday morning after Mass sessions. A parish-wide session was also conducted via Zoom on a mid-week evening. An in-person Youth session was also scheduled for a mid-week evening.

It is our hope that we listened well, discerned the most important themes and issues. **The results for the Communities' benefit and review can be found on the Parish website at www.christourlight.net**

LIVING IN THE LIGHT

The Word

Reading for April 3, 2022

John 8: 1-11

Adults:

What is the difference between being righteous and being self-righteous?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Teens:

Think about the choices you made this week. How did God help you make good choices? What got in the way when you didn't?

Children:

How does Jesus help you do what is good and avoid what is not good?

Vision 2024

Supreme Good



In the first reading, the Lord speaks thru the prophet Isaiah and tells us "See, I am doing something new".

And in the Gospel, we find a group of scribes and Pharisees who have a change of mind (and maybe, hearts) when confronted by Jesus' challenge of self-examination. Acknowledging that they too are sinners, they reject the law by going away and, hopefully, accept a new life in the Spirit. To the accused women, Jesus says, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

So what is new? It is living a life giving relationship with God and not living under the condemnation of the Law. Jesus is reminding us of the Life Giving Relationship that the Father desires with each of us, and the Spirit will give as a gift to all who desire it. We are told not to live in the past, *...all is forgiven*, but to look forward, joyfully, to a life in Christ.

In Philippians the relationship is known as, "the **supreme good** of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord". It is the highest possible good! But don't despair if or when the relationship falters, because it will. It is not that we have already attained "perfect maturity" but that we are pursuing maturity in hope that we might possess it.

Can you imagine what it might mean in our lives if we allowed ourselves to be "taken possession of by Christ Jesus". Let God do the work, we need only be open to the relationship and the abundant life it gives. It is a first step toward the Life Giving Relationships that is a significant Avenue of the parishes' Vision 2024 initiative.

Perhaps, in these last few weeks of Lent, we could focus on our life-giving relationship with God and the **supreme good** of knowing Christ Jesus as Lord. But don't stop there, move on to our life-giving relationship with ourselves including forgiving ourselves, and finally include our life-giving relationship with our many "neighbors". By Easter morn, we might be able to say, Look, I too am doing something new!

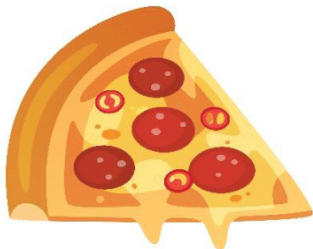

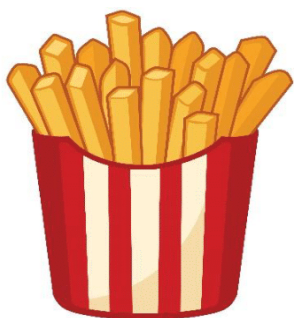

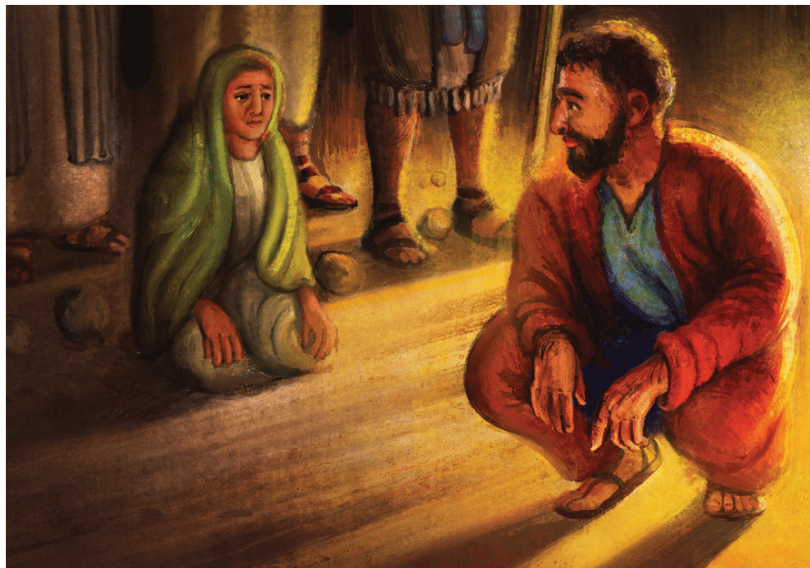

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT



An Inward Gaze

Loving and merciful God,
you are steadfast and unwavering

Sunday, April 3, 2022 No Judgment, Know Jesus

Today's readings: Isaiah 43:16–21; Psalm 126:1–2, 2–3, 4–5, 6; Philippians 3:8–14; John 8:1–11. Jesus' lesson to the crowd early in the morning changed when a woman was brought before him. Placing the woman in the middle of the crowd, the Pharisees tested Jesus by stating the charge of adultery and the punishment: "Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?"

The few words Jesus used, along with his actions, taught the crowd about withholding judgment and showing compassion. Challenging the Pharisees to look within themselves, Jesus responded: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." To the woman, he showed compassion and support, telling her, "Neither do I

condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore." Those who tried to entrap the Lord left one by one. The woman was able to walk away with her dignity restored.

God may work in unexpected ways but always acts with justice and compassion. Even in the desert, in a difficult relationship, in the middle of struggle and distress, God can make a way for us that leads to joy and fulfillment. Jesus invites us to look within and make needed changes so that we grow in holiness and steadfast faith. As followers of Christ, we are to mirror his actions by withholding judgment and acting compassionately.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, April 4 I Know, Do You?

In today's Gospel, Jesus says: "I know where I came from and where I am going." In the first reading, from Daniel, Susanna clearly knows who she is, and stands firm though she knows she will face serious consequences for her righteous decision. As you make your way through the week, notice how you claim your identity as a Christian in your words and actions. *Today's readings: Daniel 13:1-9, 15-17, 19-30, 33-62 or 13:41c-62; Psalm 23:1-3a; 3b-4, 5, 6; John 8:12-20.*

Tuesday, April 5 He Spoke

Many came to believe because of the way Jesus spoke. He taught with a new authority and he spoke with words rooted in the Father. His direct and assured manner of relating to others attracted followers looking for the truth and repelled those who wanted to remain in power. Does the way you speak attract people to Christianity? *Today's readings: Numbers 21:4-9; Psalm 102:2-3, 16-18, 19-21; John 8:21-30.*

Wednesday, April 6 Be Set Free

All of us sin, and at some points in our lives, may become slaves to sin. Jesus shares his life with us, sets us free from sin, and invites us to live in the truth. The sacrament of reconciliation allows people to begin anew in freedom each time sins are confessed. Set a time for you and your family to receive this sacrament of healing. *Today's readings: Daniel 3:14-20, 91-92, 95; Daniel 3:52, 53, 54, 55, 56; John 8:31-42.*

Thursday, April 7 Life in the Covenant

Over and over again, Jesus is challenged by the authorities, and, repeatedly, he shares that he is who he says he is. He is the new covenant, and in him we receive eternal life. The Lord keeps his covenant forever. Journal today about how you keep your side of the covenant with the Lord. Do you attend Mass, pray regularly, offer service, work for justice? *Today's readings: Genesis 17:3-9; Psalm 105:4-5, 6-7, 8-9; John 8:51-59.*

Friday, April 8 The Lord Is with Us

Long before Jesus gets to Jerusalem and endures his passion, leaders try to trap him and find reasons to arrest him. Jeremiah deals with similar persecution. Even in the darkness of terror and wickedness, God is present with us. Pray the stations of the cross with your parish family, or in your home today. *Today's readings: Jeremiah 20:10-13; Psalm 18:2-3a, 3bc-4, 5-6, 7; John 10:31-42.*

Saturday, April 9 Where Am I?

Holy Week begins tomorrow. The time has come for Jesus to move toward Jerusalem. Take stock of your Lent so far. Have you made any changes in your life? How is your prayer life as compared to the beginning of this season? Write down several spiritual goals as we step into the most holy of weeks in our tradition. Make plans to set aside time to participate in the services of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. *Today's readings: Ezekiel 37:21-28; Jeremiah 31:10, 11-12abcd, 13; John 11:45-56.*

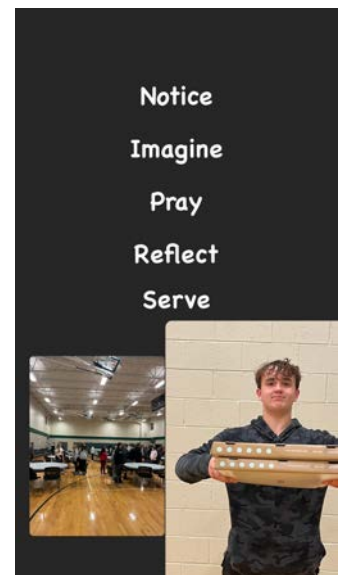
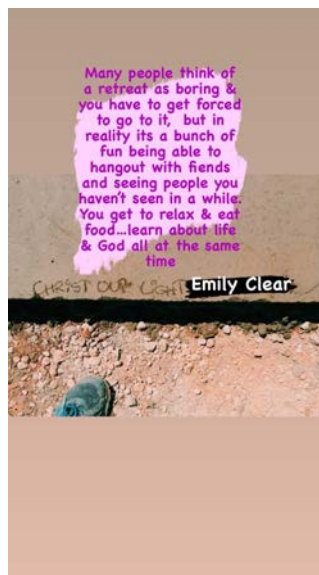
