Want to Talk? Communication Tools for Divided Times

Beginning this fall Christ Our Light will be sponsoring an 8 session, small group program on how we can have tough conversations on subjects that matter.

This series has been developed by JustFaith Ministries, an organization based on Catholic social teaching, which will draw on the wisdom of experts in nonviolent communication and civil dialogue. It will help us to deepen our relationships while staying true to our values, providing practical tools for navigating the political polarization of our time as well as other difficult conversations with loved ones and friends.

Reading for April 24, 2022

John 20:19-31

Adults:

When has your faith in the living Christ helped you overcome fear?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Teens:

Thomas did not believe because he had not seen Jesus with his own eyes. How hard is it for you to believe in God without being able to see God?

Children:

What could you do this Easter season to help someone feel less afraid?

Immigration Justice Task Force

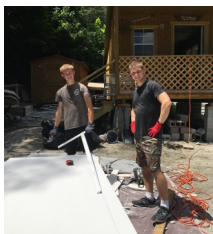

Climate Change Corner - More for Mother Earth

Plastic, it's incredible! It's all around us. Hard to imagine a world without plastic. It's such a boon and allows us to do all kinds of things that were hitherto difficult or impossible. But, inevitably, there is a dark side. As easy and inexpensive as it is to produce, so is it difficult and expensive to dispose of once it has ceased to be usable. We can't just dump it and forget about it; it won't go away. The message from the Pope is clear, every one of us must be a steward of the earth. Each one of us can and must do our part to protect the world that we live in. Don't wait until you have notice, be proactive! In the Easter bulletin there was an introduction to a new feature we're calling 'Climate Change', in which we plan to provide helpful hints and suggestions that you can incorporate into your daily routines to help us all to be effective stewards of our earth. If you missed last week's bulletin you can still read our initial thoughts on Climate Change, including a powerful prayer from Pope Francis, on Christ Our Light's website. This week we're scratching the surface of a big issue, the recycling of plastic waste.

Helpful Hint: Understand Plastic Recycling

You probably know this, but just in case, here's a quick overview of the labelling of plastic containers.

1. Look all around the plastic container for the number in the triangle. If you cannot find one do not recycle it. Also, remember that just because it has a number does not mean that it can be recycled.
2. **Recycle only #1 and #2 – in Burlington county add #5 to that list. All other plastics go into the regular trash.**
3. Empty and wash bottles, jars and containers properly. Remnants of “biological matter” is called contamination and will likely cause the batch to be rejected.
4. **Never put plastic bags or plastic bottle tops into recycling.**
5. **If you're in doubt about whether to recycle an item, put it in the regular trash.**

Burlington County:

Plastic bottles, jars, & containers for #1, #2 and #5 plastic

Camden County:

Plastic bottles and jars for ONLY #1 and #2 plastic

Special notice: Both counties are urging residents to empty and rinse containers fully before placing them in the curbside recycling containers. The presence of moisture from food and liquid waste in containers has become a problem for single stream recycling as it lowers the quality of cardboard and paper. In addition, both counties remind residents to NEVER put plastic bags in recycling bins. They damage the machinery. Check county websites for details.

WHY RECYCLE – TO REUSE - Your Recycled Plastics are used to make new products: carpeting, backpacks, polar fleece jackets, sleeping bag and ski jacket insulation, plastic lumber, playground equipment, t-shirts, sweaters, sneakers, new bottles, buckets and containers

You can save 2400 pounds of carbon dioxide per year by recycling just half of your household waste.

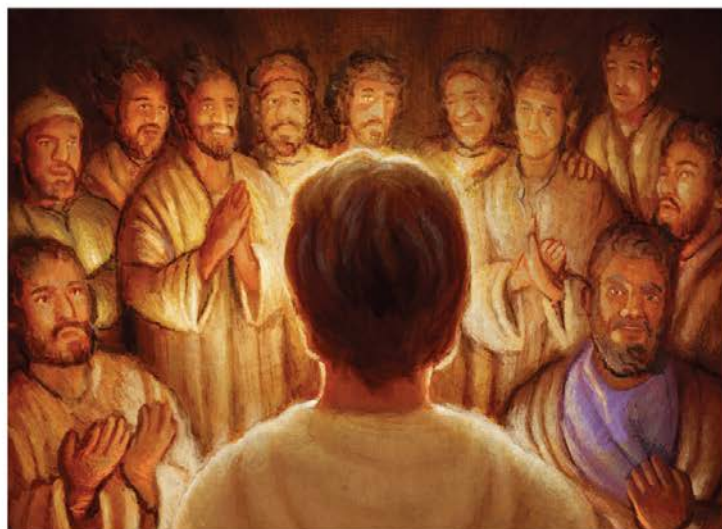

All Things Are Possible



Today's readings: Acts 5:12-16; Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24; Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19; John 20:19-31.
At times, it may seem farfetched to place belief in a person or a possibility. Having been sure at some time of an impossibility, we may identify with the apostle Thomas. He might have felt that Jesus could not have risen from the dead.

So sure was Thomas in his absence of belief that he told his friends, "Unless I see the marks of nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks . . . I will not believe." Once Jesus entered the locked room, Thomas' heart changes and he declared, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus accepted this change with mercy.

When tempted to lock ourselves away for fear of hurt or disappointment, it is good to be mindful that Jesus Christ can still be present to us. "Peace be with you," he said to the disciples and he says to us in our tribulations. The gift of faith that he offers can provide the courage to step out of the locked room where we hide our emotions, our gifts, and our hopes. For our generation and so many others, Jesus said, "Blessed are those who have seen and have believed." Where in your life are you unsure and need to change your heart? Spend time asking Christ to enter that place and bring you peace.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, April 25

Gospel Boldness

What does it mean today to speak the Word of God with boldness? To embrace a life that is based on Gospel values? Living out Gospel values can bring a beacon of hope to others. In the face of anger and hatred, such a way of living means to choose to love; in the face of weariness and sickness, it means to be a healing presence. Whenever we choose to hope, to love, and to heal, our faith is lived out loud. Such a faith alerts others to the presence of God. *Today's readings: 1 Peter 5:5b–14; Psalm 89:2–3, 6–7, 16–17; Mark 16:15–20.*

Tuesday, April 26

Creating a Community of Love

“The community of believers was of one heart and mind,” we hear in the reading from Acts. Imagine the Church acting with “one heart and mind.” The possibilities are limitless. The poor among us would be cared for, those in need of comfort and healing would find a place to rest, there would be no one marginalized because everyone would be welcomed. Pay attention to those who enter your life and how you welcome them. Your welcome reveals God’s love. *Today's readings: Acts 4:32–37; Psalm 93:1ab, 1cd–2, 5; John 3:7b–15.*

Wednesday, April 27

God So Loved the World

“For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son” has been heralded on posters, billboards, and T-shirts. As today’s Gospel states, it is up to believers to live out the truth of God’s love. Keep in mind that you reflect God’s light and love in how you greet others, show compassion, and offer encouragement. *Today's readings: Acts 5:17–26; Psalm 34:2–3, 4–5, 6–7, 8–9; John 3:16–21.*

Thursday, April 28

Open to the Spirit

In the first reading, the apostles tell the Sanhedrin of the witness of the Holy Spirit; in the Gospel, Jesus says that the gift of the Spirit is not rationed. This Holy Spirit surrounds us in every moment, energizing us to offer to our world mercy and compassion. Pray to the Spirit for courage to live the Gospel in word and action. *Today's readings: Acts 5:27–33; Psalm 34:2 and 9, 17–18, 19–20; John 3:31–36.*

Friday, April 29

Grace in Abundance

Many people worry about scarcity. They are concerned that they do not have enough and even that they do not love enough. God’s grace, though, is available in abundance. In today’s Gospel, we hear of the apostles’ concern that there was not enough food for the crowd. Jesus, however, provides more than enough for all to have their fill. He takes precious little food and transforms it into a feast that yielded twelve baskets of food when all had eaten. Imagine what God can do with our lives when we are open to transformation. *Today's readings: Acts 5:34–42; Psalm 27:1, 4, 13–14; John 6:1–15.*

Saturday, April 30

A Simple Prayer

Any parent or guardian stays constantly alert to the well-being of their children. Why is it so hard to imagine that God does the same with us? As God’s children, we are not unlike the disciples in the boat: sometimes we get tossed about by life and feel anxious. As the disciples discovered, Jesus was not far away. Just as Jesus calls out and reassures the disciples, he does so with us. When you are facing a moment of fear, pray, “Jesus, I trust in you!” *Today's readings: Acts 6:1–7; Psalm 33:1–2, 4–5, 18–19; John 6:16–21.*

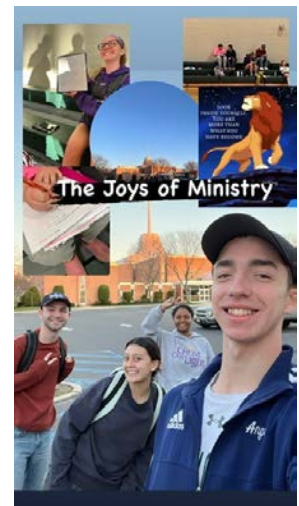
