New Mass Schedule Announcement

My dear brothers and sisters,

After consultation with Parish Leadership, Clergy, Pastoral Council, and Staff, along with input from parishioners, a decision has been made to implement the following Mass schedule beginning July 1st, 2023:

The weekday Masses remain the same:

Monday through Friday, 8 am, Saturday's 9 am.

Holy Days of Obligation remain the same:

7 pm Vigil Mass, 8 am Mass, noon Mass, and 7 pm Mass.

Weekend Masses will change and will be:

Saturday Vigil Mass at 4 pm

Sunday Masses at 8:30 am, 10:30 am, and 6:30 pm

Confessions on Saturday will be from 9:30 am to 10 am and 3 pm to 3:30 pm.

Initially, the Saturday Vigil Mass was scheduled to move to 5 pm. However, many parishioners voiced a concern about elderly parishioners driving home in darkness. For safety's sake, moving the 4:30 pm Mass to 4 pm made much more sense.

It was also intended to move the Sunday evening Mass to 6 pm. Since the other Mass times were adjusted by 30 minutes, the same 30-minute sacrifice should apply to the 7 pm Mass. Hence, the Sunday evening Mass will be at 6:30 pm.

This new Mass schedule speaks to our parish's concern for social justice. It would have been extremely unfair and unjust to eliminate one Mass group and ask the others to do nothing. The sacrifice of every Mass time moving a little should not just be tolerated but welcomed.

We are a family – a team – and we should all aim to chip in. As a coach, running a successful team is not just measured in wins, but in having each teammate believe they are part of something bigger than themselves. St. Paul reminds us we are all part of the Body of Christ. When one part suffers, the entire body suffers. When one part rejoices, the entire body rejoices. We should worship God as one family and see each other as part of the Body of Christ. To eliminate just one Mass and keep the rest of the schedule intact is contrary to basic fairness, but more importantly who we are called to be – one Body of Christ.

Thank you for your patience and support. This has been challenging to navigate since no new schedule would satisfy everyone. However, the change is necessary for the continued vibrancy of our parish community. As Bishop Sullivan noted in his explanation of the decree regarding Mass schedules – this is an issue of seeking quality versus quantity. With the continued decline of active priests and Mass attendance, each parish must be a steward of the necessary resources (both human and financial) for quality liturgy. Our new Mass schedule begins to address these concerns.

We will send continued reminders of the new schedule over the next few months leading up to July 1, 2023. We will also open our Mass Intentions Book soon with new guidelines. We will inform you well in advance.

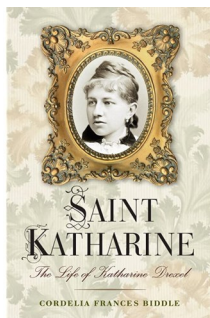

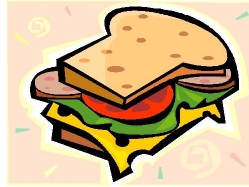
Adopt-a-Family



Christmas may seem a long way off, but we are beginning our remote preparations for our Adopt-a-Family program. For those new to the parish, at Christmas we have several initiatives to help others in need. We have a giving tree which supports families helped through Guadalupe Family Services. We also support women who have elected not to have an abortion through our pro-life ministry. In the past we have also collected gifts for the residents at Barclay Nursing Home, but will be unable to do that this year (at their request) due to covid. At the Christmas Masses, we collect baby items which are donated to Options for Women, First Way in Collingswood and Good Counsel Home. One of the other opportunities we have for giving at Christmas is through our adopt-a-family program. Last year we were able to help 50 families with gifts and gift cards.

There are several ways to be a part of the adopt-a-family program. One way is to volunteer to adopt an entire family. You get to choose the family size that you can support. Some of these families prefer that the donor families shop for them and others prefer getting gift cards so they can shop for their children. Other families help out by not adopting an entire family, but instead, donating gift cards or checks which go into a pool which we use for these families. 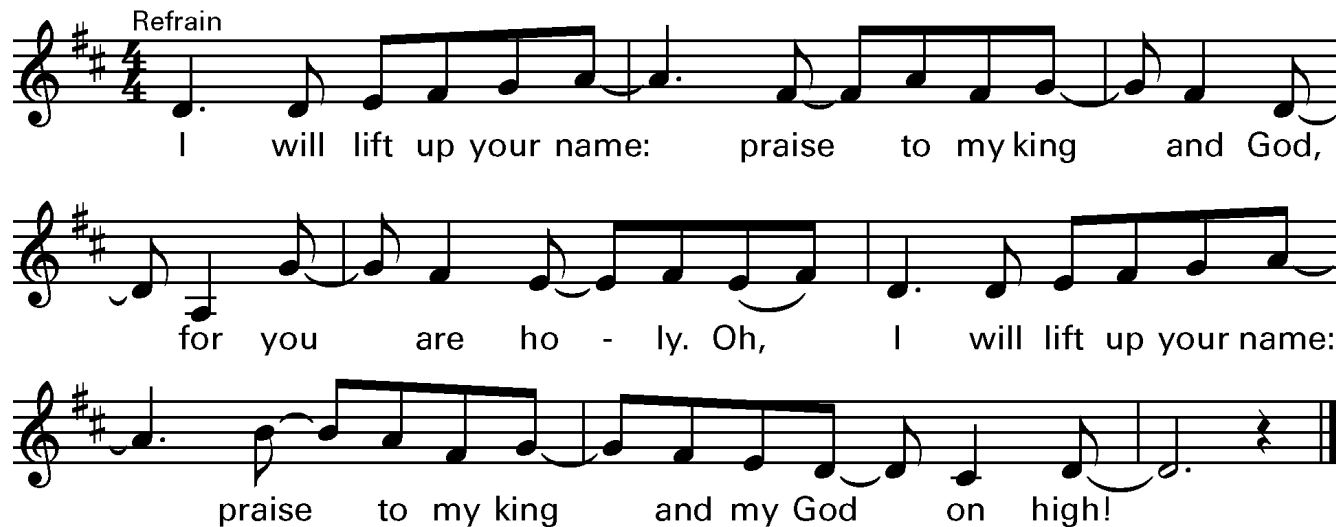
