New Mass Intentions Guidelines

My dear brothers and sisters,

As you know along with the new Mass Schedule we also must put into place the guidelines for Mass Intentions as Church Law and USCCB guidelines stipulate. The guidelines are provided below for your information.

Weekday Masses

Monday through Friday 8am Mass – One intention only.

Saturday 9am Mass will be the *Pro Populo Mass* (This Mass will be offered for all of our parishioners, living and deceased. No other intentions can be added to it, it must stand alone. The lector or priest will announce this intention.

Sunday Masses

Saturday 4pm Vigil Mass – Multiple Intentions

Sunday 8:30am Mass – One Intention Only

10:30am Mass – Multiple Intentions,

6:30pm Mass – One Intention Only

Holy Days of Obligation, one Mass intention only besides the exceptions listed below.

Christmas, Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday, Holy Thursday, All Saints Day, and All Souls Day will be the *Pro Populo* Intention, no other personal intentions can be added.

“At these Masses we remember all our parishioners, living and deceased,” or similar words.

The opening of the Intentions book will occur once a year: the first opening will take place on Tuesday November 29th at 10am to noon and 1pm to 3pm. Amelia and Nancy will receive you in the Ministry Conference Room at the end of the hall past the restrooms in the Church. The intentions book will open for Masses between April 3, 2023 to December 31, 2023. All Masses prior to April 3, 2023 are already filled.

Questions and Answers:

How Many Intentions is a person allowed?

Each family or single person can get only 15 intentions from April 3, 2023 to December 31, 2023. After everyone gets a fair chance of getting intentions a person may come back after December 15th, 2023, to see if there are any openings left in the Mass Intentions Book. The reason for the cap is that the first person who gets intentions does not take up 50% of all the available Masses, leaving all else who follow extremely limited.

What constitutes a single intention?

A single intention can be made for one person or for a person's family, i.e. “At this Mass we remember Jane Doe,” or “At this Mass we remember the Doe Family.” Once a Mass has an intention no other intentions can be added to it, except for the Saturday 4pm Vigil Mass or the Sunday 10:30am Mass – which are considered multiple intention Masses.

What happens if I request, for example, a Mass Intention for August 5, 2023 and there is already an intention there?

Unless you are requesting the Saturday 4pm Mass or the Sunday 10:30am Mass we are not allowed to add a second intention, there are no exceptions.

What is the Pro Populo Mass and why can't we add additional intentions to them?

The *Pro Populo* Mass is a Latin Term, “for the people,” According to Church law, there must be one of these Mass Intentions each week, celebrated by the Pastor or whom he designates to celebrate it. It remembers all of our parishioners, living and deceased, hence all our loved ones are already included.

I know you may have additional questions, we will try to answer them as best as we can, please be patient with us as we implement the guidelines going forward.

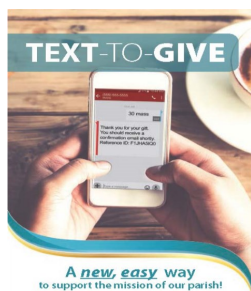

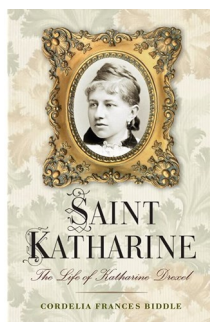

Adopt-a-Family



Christmas may seem a long way off, but we are beginning our remote preparations for our Adopt-a-Family program. For those new to the parish, at Christmas we have several initiatives to help others in need. We have a giving tree which supports families helped through Guadalupe Family Services. We also support women who have elected not to have an abortion through our pro-life ministry. In the past we have also collected gifts for the residents at Barclay Nursing Home, but will be unable to do that this year (at their request) due to covid. At the Christmas Masses, we collect baby items which are donated to Options for Women, First Way in Collingswood and Good Counsel Home. One of the other opportunities we have for giving at Christmas is through our adopt-a-family program. Last year we were able to help 50 families with gifts and gift cards.

There are several ways to be a part of the adopt-a-family program. One way is to volunteer to adopt an entire family. You get to choose the family size that you can support. Some of these families prefer that the donor families shop for them and others prefer getting gift cards so they can shop for their children. Other families help out by not adopting an entire family, but instead, donating gift cards or checks which go into a pool which we use for these families.
