The Collection and Offertory



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I pray that this Lenten season has begun with many blessings for you, your families and friends. Part of our duties and responsibilities is to support our parish, diocese, and universal Church so that each can operate at an efficient and effective manner bringing the ministries of the Church to life, so that they are vibrant and active.

I am not asking for more to be placed in the baskets, as you know I actually shy away from such, “asks.” This letter is to inform you that we will be returning to the previous custom and tradition of the collection, which is to pass the baskets around the pews and then for the ushers to place all the collected baskets into one large basket to be brought up in the offertory ahead of the Bread and Wine.

I am aware that there is something “nice” about coming forward and placing your offering in the baskets at the sanctuary. However, after many from parish leadership (finance, pastoral councils and members of the staff) came to me asking that we return to the previous manner of collection I reflected on their concerns.

The matters are mostly practical, for instance often bottle necks occur, the folks bringing up the gifts get caught in the traffic of others coming to place their offering into the baskets. The priests and deacons have to rush down from the sanctuary to try and prevent this and it does not always work, we do this to try to keep people in their pews while the offertory processes towards the sanctuary, sometimes the offertory folks are not ready in time and the traffic has already begun making Liturgy rushed and sloppy.

The other is that we are slowly moving out of Covid as the hospitalizations and deaths have declined, a most welcomed sign! Since this decline we have brought back the holy water fonts, which are washed and disinfected every week. Prior to that all the ropes and social distancing has been removed. For the future we will need good discussion with the parish leadership about returning to receive the Precious Blood, a discussion that will take some time. With all that being said, this return to passing the baskets is another sign of returning back to normal.

Another concern about the baskets is that over the last two Christmas’ many folks who visit do not know the method of bringing forward their offering or some may feel uncomfortable walking up or they get land locked because of the large crowd. Passing the baskets addresses this concern not just at Christmas or Easter, but on any Sunday.

This is not so much a “Liturgical” question, rather a simple and practical one. We will be retuning to “passing the baskets” on the weekend of Saturday March 11th and Sunday March 12th. Mr. John Vovak (our Pastoral Associate for Music and Worship) will provide instruction to the ministers of hospitality and to the parish in announcements in the coming weeks.

I thank you in advance for your understanding, it will take us a couple of weeks to get used to, but in the end I think its like riding a bike, you never forget.

May our Lord Jesus continue to bless you for your great love and support of our parish, may His Light shine on you and your families now and always.

Justice & Community Outreach

Olga's Story

Our support team of friends, has been working for months to bring a family from Ukraine here to safety until they are able to return home. We were matched with Olga and her 3 daughters, who now have permission to travel to NJ. Although this is not a parish-sponsored effort, because of the generosity of our parishioners we thought you may want to support this project.

Here is their story-

Olga is a 34 year old divorced mother of 3 girls, Emily and Nicole, 4 year old twins, and Stefania, age 9. Olga, a successful screenwriter, producer, and editor for 15 years, has seen her life and the lives of her daughters toppled.

In her own words, "But the war destroyed everything in one day. My business. Income. My stability. My dreams. My future. And the worst thing is the happy life of my children. I am divorced and raise three daughters alone, twins Emily and Nicole and Stefania. If I could tell you what it's like to live under the constant threat of missile strikes. When your child at school hears an air raid warning and heads to the bomb shelter. And the twin in the kindergarten runs away to shelter. And when, in the middle of the night, 12-meter rockets are shot down over your house, and you already thought that the rocket was flying into your apartment, at your children... And in the morning, you collect the remnants of the rocket in the area. Shaking walls, a deafening whistle... it's terrible, constant fear..."

Olga hopes to continue her profession here in NJ; she has stated she can work anywhere, provided there is stable internet and light, things no longer available in Ukraine. Most important to her, she wants her daughters to be safe and happy again.

Olga and her girls are not alone; thousands of Ukrainian people are seeking refuge until they can return home. But we can help one family and that is what we plan to do.

A Story of Hope from Honduras

Rony lives with his wife Reina and their two sons, Emilson, age 14, and Maynor, age 9, about two hours from Tegucigalpa, the capital of Honduras. Like many children in Latin America, Emilson loves to play soccer. And when his parents asked him about his future, he didn't hesitate to say he wanted to become a professional soccer player.

"We have to make an effort," Reina told Rony. "I know that with God's help, everything can be done." So, despite the distance and the expenses involved, Rony took a leap of faith and enrolled Emilson in a soccer academy in Tegucigalpa.

Rony is a farmer who grows corn, beans and bananas. But it's hard to get good harvests working in the Dry Corridor—an area impacted by high temperatures and lack of rain. Droughts have become more frequent and storms stronger. "Nowadays, we don't know when winter starts or when it ends," explains Rony.

Determined to support Emilson's dream, Rony participated in a Catholic Relief Services project, which helped him repair an old reservoir and install a low-cost irrigation system with pipes and hoses that uses very little water to grow his crops. He also learned to let the harvest residue rot—instead of burning the land—because the residue becomes the soil's fertilizer.

Thanks to the watering system and his new skills, Rony can harvest his crops even if it doesn't rain. His produce and income are now enough to feed his family, pay the soccer academy's fees and help people in his community. Today, Rony has even become an advocate for caring for the environment. And he feels it is his responsibility that others do too. "I have learned a lot about how to take care of, value and protect the natural resources that the Lord has given us, such as water," he says. "That's the best way to guarantee the lives of our families and the animals."

In this principle, Care for God's Creation, we remember that God created every plant, every mountaintop, every animal—everything. And God said that these things are good. 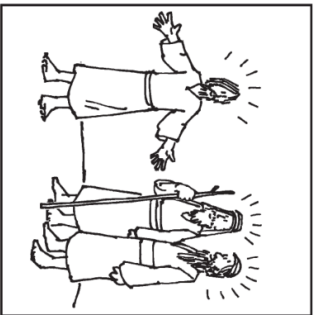
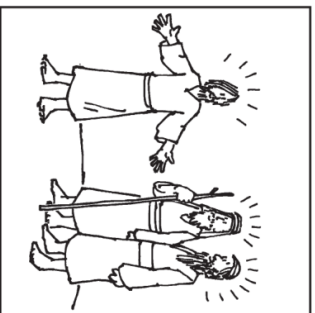

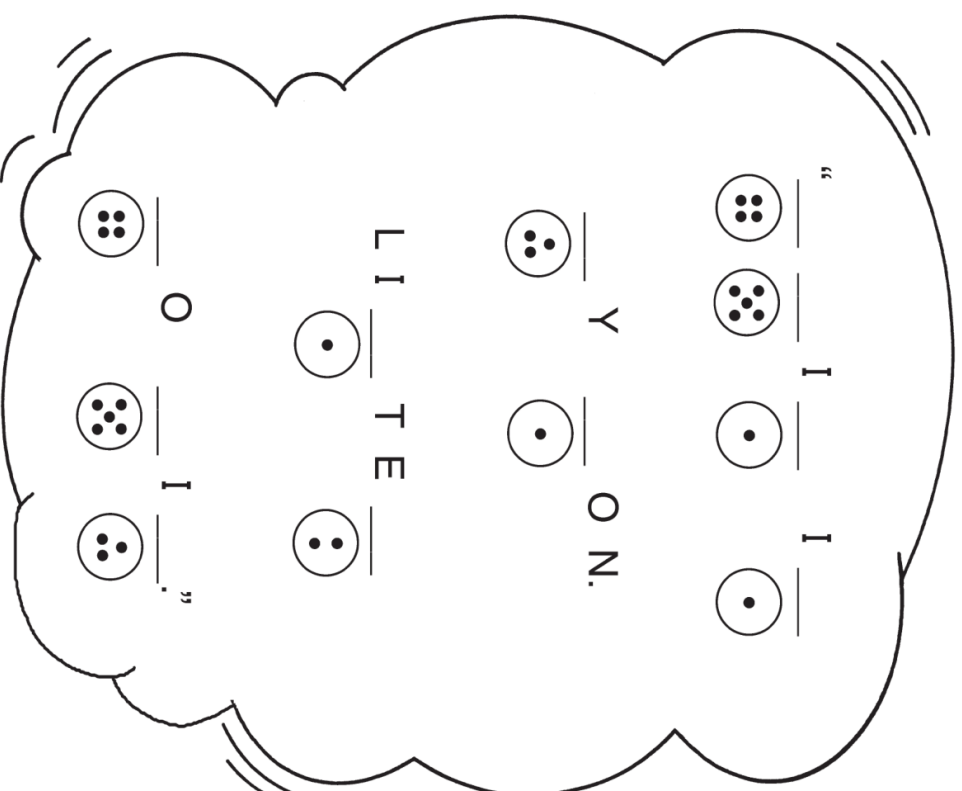
