Order of Penance

Dear brothers and sisters, greetings in Christ Jesus, over the last few years the Church has been revising the Order of Penance. You will notice some minor modifications and changes in some words, both in the Act of Contrition and the Prayer of Absolution. I am including a summary sheet for your convenience. The New Order of Penance will begin on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 16th 2023. We will also have a sheet in the Confessional for your use.

The Order of Penance for Reconciling Individual Penitents

Priest and Penitent: In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. *The Priest welcomes the penitent and may read or refer to a text of Sacred Scripture that speaks of God's mercy.*

Penitent: Bless me, father, for I have sinned (or words of the penitent's own choosing). It has been (state time) since my last Confession.

Penitent: *Confesses their sins, may ask questions of the priest, and listens to any advice the priest may offer.*

Priest: *The Priest will give the penitent their penance.*

Penitent: *Now offers (says) an Act of Contrition. The penitent may use their own words, may use a prayer that is memorized, or any of the following options.*

Option I - O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart for all the wrong I have done and for the good I have failed to do, because by sinning I have offended you, who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more and to avoid the occasions of sin. Through the merits of the Passion of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy.

Option II – Lord Jesus, who chose to be called the friend of sinners, through the mystery of your Death and Resurrection, free me from my sins. May your peace grow strong in me, that I may bear the fruits of charity, justice, and truth.

Option III – Lord Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Priest: *Offers the Absolution*

God, the Father of mercies, through the Death and Resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and poured out the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God grant you pardon and peace.
AND I ABSOLVE YOU FROM YOUR SINS, IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER,
AND OF THE SON, + AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT.

Priest: Give thanks to the Lord for he is good.

Penitent: For his mercy endures forever.

Priest: *The priest dismisses the penitent using these or similar words:* The Lord has forgiven your sins. Go in peace.

Penitent: Amen.

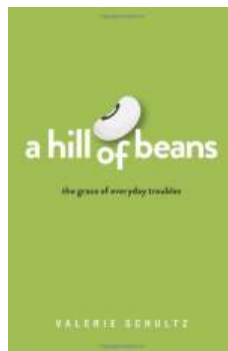

A Story of Hope from the Philippines

Raul and Rhodora Enecillo live on their farm in Northern Samar, Philippines, with their granddaughters Loraine and Kate.

Raul and Rhodora get up at 5 a.m. each day to tend to the fishpond, pigs and chickens before getting their granddaughters off to school. Education is important to Raul and Rhodora. Their dream is that Loraine and Kate will graduate from college and get good jobs—Loraine wants to be a doctor when she grows up.

For years, Raul and Rhodora worked hard as coconut farmers. After harvesting, they prepared the coconuts for making oil—but it took a lot of work before they made money. On top of that, periods of heavy rain caused flooding, making farming difficult.

Then Raul and Rhodora participated in a Catholic Relief Services program where they received training and assistance to build their own fishpond. They bought little fish to stock the pond, fish food and a net. The fish grew bigger, and soon they were able to sell them at the market. The fishpond also provided food for their family so they could enjoy nutritious meals together.

"Life is so much easier now that we have the fish for our daily living," Rhodora says.

In the program, Raul and Rhodora also learned how to better prepare for the increasing natural disasters in their area—like typhoons, flooding, earthquakes and landslides. They made improvements to their house, using stronger, sturdier materials to protect their home and family.

Since joining the program, Raul and Rhodora added two more fishponds along with pigs and chickens. With the extra income from their farm, their granddaughters can enjoy their childhood and live a more comfortable life, giving them the opportunity to study hard and finish school.

"I have many dreams for my family and my grandchildren," Raul says. "I hope I can give them something good."

Palmyra Cove Cleanup



Can you believe that in 2021 the #1 debris collected was PLASTIC? In fact there were 69,454 plastic caps/lids collected in two ocean sweeps, leading the “Dirty Dozen” followed by 58,589 food/candy wrappers/bags far exceeding past totals. In New Jersey, a non-profit group, NJ Clean Ocean Action has been working since 1985 to make our NJ Shore and waterways clean. In spring and fall each year, they conduct a Beach Sweep to pick up debris and tally the items found at over 70 NJ sites. The data is then compiled into annual reports that have been used over two decades. This data was instrumental in getting the NJ Single Use Plastic Waste Reduction Act passed which bans all plastic bags from stores. Parishioners from Christ Our Light-preschoolers to seniors- have an opportunity to be “citizen scientists” for a few hours on April 1st from 7 am- 10 am at the Palmyra Cove Nature Center. All you need is a willingness to be a “citizen scientist” for a morning and give up extra sleep one Saturday during Lent.

You can wear old sneakers (no sandals), rain boots or hiking boots, comfortable warm clothes (river front is often cooler and windier) and work gloves. Garbage bags, grabbers, and tally sheets will be provided. The Clean Ocean Action Beach Sweep requires everyone to register and sign a waiver. Volunteers under 18 will need a parent to complete the waiver for them. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult and both must be registered. For group/ organization, type Christ Our Light Catholic Church

To register, visit <https://cleanoceanaction.org>. Click on Beach sweeps tab. At bottom of that page look at third bullet point (Beach Sweep Volunteer) and then click on the link to register at the top of the page. Sign the waiver and then click next. Complete your name and for group/organization type Christ Our Light Catholic Church. Complete your address and phone number. At the bottom of the page will be an arrow with a county showing. Click on arrow and scroll to Burlington County. Click on Burlington County. Click on next. Palmyra Cove is the only Burlington County site.

Also contact Sandy Czerniakowski (856-231-7879) or by email at dczerniakowski@comcast.net who is heading up the Christ Our Light team. It is suggested that you bring a large bucket with a handle which is more environmentally friendly than a plastic bag.
