Asian/Pacific Islander American Heritage Month



The Christ Our Light Prayer group is a melting pot of members from different ethnic groups, ages, and cultures. Some of our members are immigrants and first-generation Americans, who migrated from the Philippines, India, Sri Lanka, and Africa.

We come together every week as a community for prayer and fellowship. We honor the rich cultures and traditions of each other which help us live out our Christian calling to unity and love. We hold special events during Advent like "Parol Star Making" and actively participate in the Misa de Gallo celebration.

As per Filipino culture, Parol Stars are hung outside their windows during Advent, which symbolizes the victory of light over darkness as well as a shared expression of faith, hope, and goodwill. The Parol star also represents the star of Bethlehem that the Three Kings used as their guide on their way to find the Child Jesus. The exchange of Christmas sweets is an Indian tradition that is practiced at our yearly Christmas Party. Food is an important part of our culture and we always have a variety of cuisines at our celebration events. Although the prayer meetings are fully in English we do sing an occasional song in Tagalog or Hindi.

Trees & the Environment



**ENVIRONMENTAL
JUSTICE**

Did you know that urban trees in the United States store a total of 708 million tons of carbon or 12% of annual U.S. carbon emissions, and this has an environmental benefit worth \$1.5 billion a year to our economy. Trees

are excellent tools to help control climate change. So consider planting a tree in your yard this spring.

Plant trees for shade. Thoughtful tree placement can reduce cooling costs by 30% in summer, and heating bills by 20-50% in the winter. The east and west sides of your home receive the most solar radiation in the summer. In the winter, southern walls receive the most solar gain.

Plant trees to control wind. Tree and shrub windbreaks can reduce your energy demands for heating and cooling by up to 30% by reducing infiltration of cold winds in the winter and hot winds in the summer. Evergreen trees and shrubs are good choices for windbreaks because they block the wind year-round.

Plant trees to control snow. By planting evergreen trees and shrubs upwind from observed snow drifts, you can prevent snow drifts in your driveway.

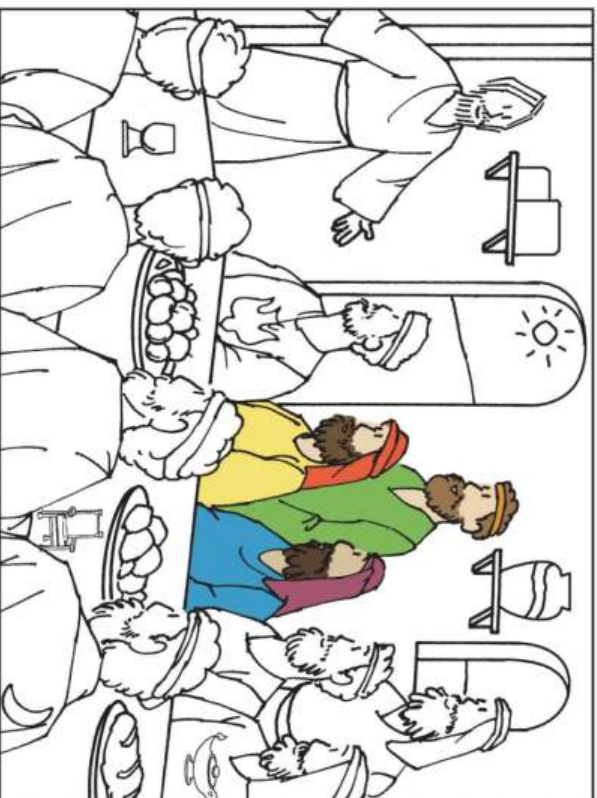

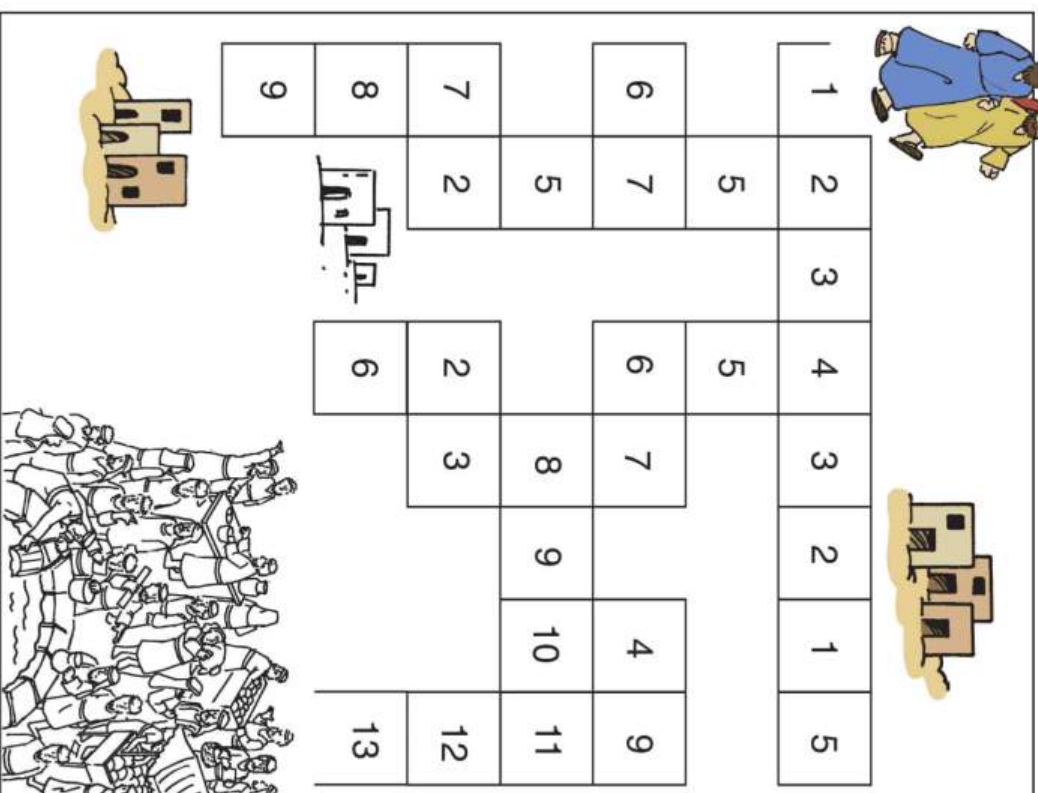
