Matthew 13:24-30

Adults:

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.

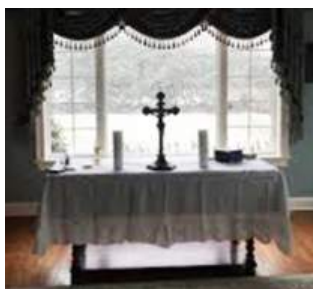

ELEMENTARY & YOUTH FAITH FORMATION CLASS REGISTRATION 2023-2024

The Faith Formation office is accepting registrations for Elementary Faith Formation (Gr. 1-6) and Youth Faith Formation (Gr. 7 & 8) classes beginning September 2023. For information, to download and print forms, and to register students electronically go to our website at www.christourlight.net.

NOTE: In accordance with sacramental guidelines of the Diocese of Camden, children are eligible to prepare for and celebrate the sacraments of 1st Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist after having completed a full year of religious instruction. Children should continue faith formation classes through 8th grade in order to be eligible to prepare for and celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of 9th grade.

Eucharistic Revival



The Holy Spirit's call to renewal can be broken down into four invitations based on the pillars of the **Eucharistic Revival**: (1) reinvigorate worship, (2) create moments of personal encounter, (3) engage in robust formation, and (4) send Catholics forth as missionaries.

This week, let's think about ways we can create moments of personal encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist. How do you encounter Jesus in the Eucharist? Do you attend Mass on Sundays? Do you attend Mass during the week? Do you go to Adoration or stop in the church during the week to spend quiet time with Our Lord in the tabernacle? Do you pray the Litany of the Most Blessed Sacrament or the Litany of the Most Precious Blood of Jesus? Do you pray an Act of Spiritual Communion? Do you start and/or end your day in prayer to Jesus? Do you talk to Jesus and invite Jesus to be with you throughout your day? Do you tell Jesus your thoughts, your worries, your joys, your intentions? Let's consider starting something today that will bring us closer to our Eucharistic Lord.

Summer creates great opportunities for getting outside and having fun! Barbeques, beach trips and picnics are all social events we can enjoy outdoors that also provide opportunities for exercise and social interaction. These are all great ways to help our mental and physical health! While spending time outdoors during the summer months can provide many benefits, it's important to be aware of added stress it can place on our bodies. This month we are sharing some summer safety tips to protect you from the heat.

Protect Yourself from the Heat and Sun

- Do outdoor activities during the coolest part of the day, in the early morning or evening.
- Exercise in an air-conditioned space if possible; or do water workouts.
- Try to stay in the shade when outdoors during peak sunlight.
- Drink plenty of liquids, especially water. Avoid drinks that contain alcohol or caffeine.
- Wear protective clothing, such as hats, long-sleeve shirts, and long pants to block out the sun's harmful rays. Choose light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.
- Use sunscreen that blocks both UVA and UVB radiation. Choose a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15, preferably 30. Reapply frequently, especially when swimming.
- Use sunglasses that block both UVA and UVB.
- If you do not have air conditioning, keep your house as cool as possible. Limit using the oven, keep shades, blinds or curtains closed during the hottest part of the day. Open windows at night.
- If your house is hot, spend time during mid-day some place that has air conditioning such as a library, shopping mall, senior center, etc.
- Listen to weather reports and plan accordingly; if temperatures or humidity are rising or an air pollution alert is in effect, there is an increased risk for heat-related illness.
