Eucharistic Revival



This past Monday we celebrated the feast day of St. Pope Pius X. This humble man from a poor family went on to become a priest, bishop, cardinal, and then Pope in 1903. During his pontificate, he condemned the modernist heresy and promoted the catechesis of children and adults. He promoted priestly formation and encouraged frequent reception of the Eucharist. He is the Pope responsible for allowing First Communion to be given to children as young as seven. Many miraculous cures were attributed to this "Pope of the Eucharist" during his lifetime. He died in 1914 and was canonized in 1954.

One of St. Pope Pius X's most famous quotes that highlights his love and dedication to Jesus in the Eucharist is as follows: *"Holy Communion is the shortest and safest way to Heaven. There are others: innocence, but that is for little children; penance, but we are afraid of it; generous endurance of trials of life, but when they come we weep and ask to be. The surest, easiest, shortest way is the Eucharist."*

He is also credited as saying, *"If the Angels could envy, they would envy us for Holy Communion."*

The Word

Reading for August 27, 2023
Matthew 16:21-27

Adults:

How have you “taken up” the crosses that have been placed in your life (accepted, ignored, with resistance, etc.)? What have you learned from these experiences?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God’s word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God’s word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God’s presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God’s presence and be still, surrounded by God’s love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God’s nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Children:

What sacrifices do you make for your faith, family, and friends?

August 31st : International Overdose Awareness Day

Overdose awareness day was created to help overcome the stigma of overdose and increase awareness of how to react in the case of an overdose situation. More than 100, 000 individuals die in the United States from overdose each year. These include both intentional overdoses and unintentional overdoses which occur from medication errors or accidents resulting from improperly stored medications.

Symptoms of an overdose include: heavy breathing, snoring respirations, or gurgling, awake but not responding, limpness, seizures, and slow or erratic pulse.

If you think someone is experiencing an overdose: Call 911, give Naloxone if available, provide Rescue Breathing or CPR if someone is not breathing effectively or has lost their pulse. Stay with the person until help arrives.

Be truthful with responders regarding the circumstances of the overdose if you know them – the more information you can provide, the more help the responders can give the person.

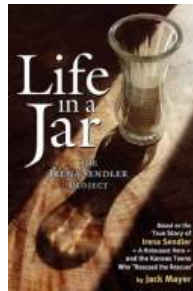

Overview: During World War II, Irena Sendler, a Polish Catholic social worker, organized a rescue network of fellow social workers to save 2,500 Jewish children from certain death in the Warsaw ghetto. Incredibly, after the war her heroism, like that of many others, was suppressed by communist Poland and remained virtually unknown for 60 years. Unknown, that is, until three high school girls from an economically depressed, rural school district in southeast Kansas stumbled upon a tantalizing reference to Sendler's rescues, which they fashioned into a history project, a play they called *Life in a Jar*. Their innocent drama was first seen in Kansas, then the Midwest, then New York, Los Angeles, Montreal, and finally Poland, where they elevated Irena Sendler to a national hero, championing her legacy of tolerance and respect for all people. *Life in a Jar: The Irena Sendler Project* is a Holocaust history and more. It is the inspirational story of Protestant students from Kansas, each carrying her own painful burden, each called in her own complex way to the history of a Catholic woman who knocked on Jewish doors in the Warsaw ghetto and, in Sendler's own words, "tried to talk the mothers out of their children." Inspired by Irena Sendler, they are living examples of the power of one person to change the world and models for young people everywhere.
