Eucharistic Revival



At the end of August we celebrated the feast days of St. Monica and her son St. Augustine. Born in the 4th century, St. Monica is recognized as the patron saint of mothers. Her faith and dedication to motherhood played a pivotal role in the spiritual formation of one of the most brilliant philosophers and well-known saints of all time – Saint Augustine, her son. Her greatest desire was for her chil-

dren to follow Christ. Although later in life he was known as a fervent man of God, St. Augustine did not easily come to see God's truth. As a child, he proved to be quite difficult, causing Monica much grief, and as a young adult he remained uninterested in Christianity. But St. Monica never stopped praying for his eternal soul. On one particular occasion, when she was discussing the matter with a priest, he urged her to remain steadfast in her prayers, stating that it was "not possible that the son of so many tears should perish." After many years of prayer, Saint Monica finally saw her son give his life to the service of God. St. Augustine declared that his mother's resilience and dedication to prayer is what led him to become the man of God he was meant to be. He stated that St. Monica was not only his mother, but "the source of his Christianity." St. Monica passed away in A.D. 387, shortly after St. Augustine was baptized. Her legacy serves as a reminder for all Christians to never stop praying for those who do not yet know Christ.

St. Augustine, one of the great Doctors of the Church, had a deep love of the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. In one of his sermons, St. Augustine taught that the visible bread and wine on the altar, "sanctified by the word of God," is His Body and Blood. Through devoutly receiving that Body and that Blood that was shed for us, we become that Body, which means that we are joined in the close union of the Mystical Body. It has this effect of binding together the Mystical Body of Christ precisely because the members of the Church receive the real Body and Blood of Christ. In other words, the charity that binds the Church together is the proper effect of receiving the Body and Blood of Christ. Let us pray that St. Augustine and his mother St. Monica will intercede for us during this time of Eucharistic Revival so that we may all grow closer to God, stronger in our faith, and remain united with Jesus in the Eucharist.

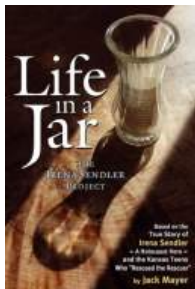

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) will resume on September 24th at the 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Masses.

The purpose of this special Liturgy is twofold:

- To provide a quality liturgical experience
- To facilitate the proclamation and breaking open of Scripture with the children

What is Children's Liturgy of the Word?

- CLOW is a part of the Mass
- The Church encourages a separate liturgy to allow the children to participate and understand
- Appropriate for children between the ages of 5 and 12
- All are welcome - No registration is necessary
- We meet in the church and the children remain with the assembly and their parents for the opening of Mass
- The children are dismissed by the celebrant after the Opening Prayer.

Gather the Children

- The children form two groups: second grade and younger; third grade and older
- They are led to rooms in the Ministry Center of the church
- A candle is lit to remind the children of the presence of the Lord; they are reminded that they are still at Mass.
- A Reading, Responsorial Psalm, and Gospel are read.
- An interactive sharing follows: the children discuss what they heard; what the readings mean to them; practical ways they can incorporate what they heard into their everyday lives.
- The children return to the assembly after the Offertory Procession



VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED

- Adults and teens are needed to proclaim and share the Word of God
- Requirements: enthusiasm and the willingness to share your faith with the children of Christ Our Light Parish
- Scheduling is approximately once a month
- All materials are provided and emailed and mailed home the week before you are scheduled
- Facilitators do not have to come up with ideas - just present them and, most of all, let the children LEAD you.
- Feel free to come back with the children during a CLOW session to observe
- Facilitators have commented that they learn so much from the children
- As one child said, "CLOW helps me understand; I don't understand all those big words."

SEASON OF CREATION HINT HELP ANIMAL SHELTER DOGS AND CATS

St. Francis loved animals. One way we can help animals during this year's Season of Creation (September 1 to October 4) is to assist the cats and dogs in the two shelters in Voorhees: Animal Welfare Association (AWA) and Voorhees Animal Orphanage. You can donate items you have in your home that can be reused – clean towels, wash cloths, flat sheets, light weight blankets, tennis balls, soccer balls, golf balls, whiffle balls, ping pong balls. Many other items are also requested: non-clumping clay cat litter, puppy pads, paper towels, craft pom poms, canned tuna and salmon, rawhide treats, bully sticks, peanut butter, dog toys (kongs, rope, plush, nylon) and cat toys (crinkle pom poms, catnip, scratching boards). Each shelter requests food for dogs and cats (check websites for particulars). In addition, both shelters would appreciate any time you could provide as a volunteer. The best way to help the shelter would be to consider adopting a dog or cat. In addition, both shelters have a foster program that provides the food, toys, and necessary vet visits while you foster a cat or dog.

You can bring your donation items for the shelters to church any weekend including October 1 and put them in the box labeled Animal Shelter.
