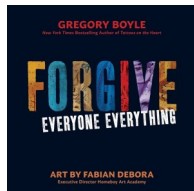

Eucharistic Revival



Today we celebrate the Feast Day of St. Teresa of Avila, one of the Doctors of the Church.

Teresa of Avila, also called Saint Teresa of Jesus, was a Carmelite nun and prominent Spanish mystic and religious reformer. Active during the Counter-Reformation, Teresa became the central figure of a movement of spiritual and monastic renewal, reforming the Carmelite Orders of both women and men. The movement was later joined by the younger Carmelite friar and mystic John of the Cross.

Her autobiography, The Life of Teresa of Jesus, and her books The Interior Castle, and The Way of Perfection, are prominent works on Christian mysticism and Christian meditation practice. In her autobiography, written as a defense of her ecstatic mystical experiences, she discerns four stages in the ascent of the soul to God: (1) mental prayer and meditation, (2) the prayer of quiet, (3) absorption-in-God, and (4) ecstatic consciousness. The Interior Castle, written as a spiritual guide for her Carmelite sisters, uses the illustration of seven mansions within the castle of our soul to describe the different states our soul can be in during our life.

Forty years after her death, in 1622, Teresa was canonized by Pope Gregory XV. On September 27, 1970 Pope Paul VI proclaimed Teresa the first female Doctor of the Church in recognition of her centuries-long spiritual legacy to Catholicism.

One of her famous quotes states: *"You pay God a compliment by asking great things of Him." During this year of the Eucharistic Revival, let us pay God great compliments by asking for great things!*

One of the most famous prayers of St. Teresa of Avila is as follows:

*"Let nothing disturb you,
Let nothing frighten you,
All things are passing away:
God never changes.
Patience obtains all things.
Whoever has God lacks nothing;
God alone suffices."*

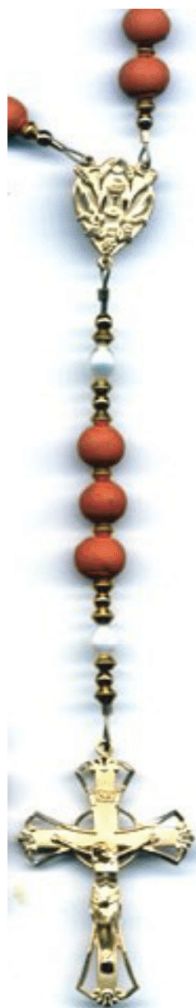

Trex Challenge



Amazing! Starting October 1, C.O.L. is challenged to collect 500 lbs. of stretchy plastic in 6 months to receive a beautiful bench made from recycled plastic. Many read about the

challenge this summer and must have started to save. From October 1 to October 5 parishioners brought in over 50 lbs. of plastic. That amount of plastic completely filled a SUV including the front seat. What is most important is that the plastic that was crammed into a SUV will never enter our landfills. All of it will be used to make quality outdoor furniture and decking.

Reminder: All plastic must be CLEAN, DRY, AND FREE OF FOOD OR CRUMBS. Do take a few minutes to review the items that TREX wants for recycling and what they cannot use. The poster on top of the TREX Box provides this information along with frequently asked questions. Remember the plastic they use is not what is recycled by our townships. Hard plastics such as water bottles is absolutely not acceptable for making TREX products.

ITEMS ACCEPTED BY TREX COMPANY: Bubble wrap (pop bubbles), grocery bags, (all colors), case overwrap, bread bags, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, produce bags, cereal bags, paper towel /toilet paper overwrap, Ziploc or food storage bags, ice bags (DRY – without metal clips), wood pellet bags, stretch film and pallet wrap, furniture foam wrap.

DO NOT INCLUDE THESE ITEMS: frozen food bags, candy bar wrappers, chip and snack bags, net or mesh product bags, pet food bags, pre-washed salad mix bags, degradable/compostable bags or film packaging, six-pack rings, PPE – gloves, masks, or protective wear, bedding or linen packaging, shiny, crinkly films like floral wrap, vinyl shower curtains or tablecloths.

DON'T SEE YOUR ITEM ON THE LIST? See if the package will stretch when you pull it. If yes, it can be included. If it tears like paper, then please don't put it in the bin. Is the package shiny or does it make a crinkly/crunchy sound in your hand? If yes, DO NOT RECYCLE IN THE NexTrex bin.
