Eucharistic Revival



MARK YOUR CALENDARS! During this year of Eucharistic Revival at the parish level, be sure to make it a point this week to visit Our Lady of Hope Parish Chapel in Blackwood, NJ for the **Blessed Carlo Acutis Exhibit**, being held there between October 25th and November 5th, 2023.

Blessed Carlo Acutis is a patron of the Eucharistic Revival and is on the path to sainthood; Pope Francis beatified him on Oct. 10, 2020. Throughout his short life, and from an early age, Acutis was passionate about the Holy Eucharist.

"Throngs of people stand in interminable lines to buy tickets to rock concerts or soccer matches, but I don't see crowds of people lined up outside church waiting to see Jesus in the Eucharist. This should make us pause and reflect." - Blessed Carlo Acutis

The exhibition is based on a website Acutis created that catalogs the 100-plus Eucharistic miracles recognized by the Catholic Church. The exhibit highlights information about the Eucharistic miracles; each panel names a miracle, recounts the story of its occurrence, and the country where it took place. The panels are arranged in chronological order from the early Third Century to 2013. Be sure to notice the date on the timeline and some of the world events that will help you to place it within the historical era. Remember that the historical miracles we are learning about on the walls of the exhibit are all pointing to the miracle in front of us—Jesus, present in the Most Holy Eucharist! The exhibit has already been hosted at more than 3,000 parishes worldwide, so be sure not to miss it as it continues touring in our area!

Note that the exhibit will also be coming to other local parishes:

- Nov 6 - Nov 20, 2023 - Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Moorestown
- Jan 13 - Jan 20, 2024 - St. Andrew the Apostle in Gibbsboro
- Feb 11 - Feb 24, 2024 - Christ the King in Hadonfield

Statement from USCCB



Statement of U.S. Bishops' International Justice and Peace Chairman Amidst Violence in the Holy Land

In response to the continued tensions and violence that erupted into warfare between Gaza and Israel on October 7, Bishop David J. Malloy of Rockford, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on International Justice and Peace, calls for prayers for peace in the Holy Land:

"On October 7, the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary, the world watched the operation launched from Gaza and the rapid call to arms from Israel that ensued. Almost 50 years to the day of the launch of the 1973 Arab-Israeli War, once again war is spilling out in the Holy Land. With it brings the mounting casualties and hostilities unfolding on all sides, and increased threats to the Status Quo of the Holy Places among Jews, Muslims, and Christians further dimming any hope for peace.

"The world is once again shocked and horrified by the outbreak of ferocious violence in the Holy Land. Reports have surfaced indicating large numbers of wounded and dead, including many civilians.

"I join with Pope Francis in his call for peace and his condemnation of this widespread outbreak of violence. As he stated in his Sunday audience, 'May the attacks and weaponry cease. Please! And let it be understood that terrorism and war do not lead to any resolutions, but only to the death and suffering of so many innocent people.'

"May all who love the Holy Land seek to bring about among all the parties engaged in the fighting a cessation of violence, respect for civilian populations and the release of hostages.

"As we pray urgently for peace, we recall especially all the families and individuals suffering from these events. We call on the faithful, and all people of good will to not grow weary and to continue to pray for peace in the land Our Lord, the Prince of Peace, called home."

Semi-annual Collection

Christ Our Light is one of several local churches which supports the Cherry Hill Food Pantry in several ways. We support the Cherry Hill Food Pantry by supplying volunteers several times a year and through an annual donation from our congregation. In the past, we have also supported them through several food collections during the year. However, their biggest ongoing need is money. Presently, the CHFP is working to create a new parking lot. The parking lot will allow the CHFP to return to the food distribution model which allows clients to come in and shop for the food they need and like. The estimated cost of the parking lot is \$300,000. For the next few weeks, we will have envelopes at all the church doors. If you would like to make a donation, please put your donation in the envelope and put it in the regular offertory collection. Checks should be made out to the Cherry Hill Food Pantry (or CHFP). The CHFP is providing food to between 160-180 households per week. With rising food costs, this is an invaluable service. Thank you for your generosity.

Fair Trade Holiday Sale



Why and how of Fair Trade

October is Fair Trade month, a time to celebrate the global impact we make when we choose to purchase Fair Trade products on November 18th & 19th at Christ Our Light Parish. The artisans have been hard work for many years creating a world that is more playful, compassionate, kind, and connected. They apply these principles to their work and in doing so create beauty and pride.



Trex Challenge



The Trex Challenge runs from October 1 through March 31, 2024. Since October 1st, Christ Our Light parishioners have collected 80 lbs. — 16% of our goal in two weeks.

Please continue to save plastic from our local landfills and bring it to the Trex bins that are located in the church, Parish Center entrance, and Resurrection Catholic School.

Reminder: All plastic must be CLEAN, DRY, AND FREE OF FOOD OR CRUMBS. Do take a few minutes to review the items that TREX wants for recycling and what they cannot use. The poster on top of the TREX Box provides this information along with frequently asked questions. Remember the plastic they use is not what is recycled by our townships. **Hard plastics such as water bottles is absolutely not acceptable for making TREX products.**

ITEMS ACCEPTED BY TREX COMPANY: Bubble wrap (pop bubbles), grocery bags, (all colors), case overwrap, bread bags, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, produce bags, cereal bags, paper towel /toilet paper overwrap, Ziploc or food storage bags, ice bags (DRY — without metal clips), wood pellet bags, stretch film and pallet wrap, furniture foam wrap.

DO NOT INCLUDE THESE ITEMS: frozen food bags, candy bar wrappers, chip and snack bags, net or mesh product bags, pet food bags, pre-washed salad mix bags, degradable/compostable bags or film packaging, six-pack rings, PPE — gloves, masks, or protective wear, bedding or linen packaging, shiny, crinkly films like floral wrap, vinyl shower curtains or tablecloths.

DON'T SEE YOUR ITEM ON THE LIST? See if the package will stretch when you pull it. If yes, it can be included. If it tears like paper, then please don't put it in the bin. **Is the package shiny or does it make a crinkly/crunchy sound in your hand?** If yes, **DO NOT RECYCLE IN THE Nex-Trex bin.**
