Native American Heritage Month



Christ Our Light Parish Council's Unity Rich Through Diversity Pathway encourages all parishioners to join us in celebrating Native American Heritage this month.

President George H. W. Bush approved a joint resolution designating November 1990 "National American Indian Heritage Month." Similar proclamations, under variants on the name (including "Native American Heritage Month" and "National American Indian and Alaska Native Heritage Month") have been issued each year since 1994.

Our region, now known as New Jersey, has a rich Native American heritage, past and present. Today the New Jersey Department of State's Commission on American Indian Affairs has representatives from the Nanticoke Lenni-Lenape Indians, Powhatan Renape Indians, Ramapough Lenape Indian Nation, and Inter-Tribal People (members of other tribes but residents of NJ).

North American Catholics may not know that the first First Nations/Native American woman saint, Kateri Tekawitha, was canonized October 12, 2012. She was born in 1656 at the Manimekhala ("Mohawk") village of Ossernenon (Auriesville, NY). Saint Kateri Tekawitha is the patron saint of traditional ecology, Indigenous Peoples, and care for creation. Her feast day is July 14. Saint Kateri Tekawitha pray for us as we increase our appreciation of Native Americans and their heritage. Amen!

Eucharistic Revival



As we continue our journey through the month of November, in which the Church remembers in a special way the holy souls in purgatory, let us continue to unite our prayers with the Communion of Saints.

What is the “Communion of Saints?” The communion of saints is the spiritual solidarity which binds together the faithful on earth, the souls in purgatory, and the saints in heaven in the organic unity of the same mystical body under Christ its head, and in a constant interchange of supernatural offices.

According to Fr. Michael VanSloun, in his article entitled Understanding the Communion of Saints, he explains that “the communion of saints is the Church” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 946). It has three states or divisions, the communion of saints of the living, those who are still on their pilgrim journey on earth; and the communion of saints of the dead or the faithful departed, some of whom are being purified, those in purgatory, and the ones who are enjoying eternal glory in the presence of God, those in heaven (Catechism, No. 954).

According to Fr. VanSloun, the communion of saints “spans the ages. It unites the saints who are living now with all who have gone before, whether they departed yesterday, last year, a generation ago or centuries earlier. The communion also encompasses all places, wherever the saints may be: in different rooms in the same home, next-door neighbors, across the country or to the four corners of the world; and unites those on earth with those beyond, those in purgatory and those who have arrived at their eternal home.”

While the saints, those whose names are listed in the Book of Life, gather together in solemn assembly at the throne of God in the heavenly liturgy, bow down and worship God day and night, sing hymns of praise, cry out, “Honor, power, and might be to our God forever and ever” (Revelation 7:12) and exclaim, “Amen! Alleluia!” (Revelation 19:4), the saints on earth gather together around God’s altar at liturgy week after week, and in praise and worship cry out, “Glory to God in the highest! We worship you. We give you thanks. We praise you for your glory!” And continue, “Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might!”

Fr. VanSloun summarized: “The same Christ who reigns on the throne in heaven with his saints above is made present in the Eucharist with his saints below, and when the faithful receive the Eucharist, there is holy Communion between all of God’s saints.”

Resurrection Catholic School Girl Scout Troop 30311 is holding a sock drive during the month of November. New kids socks of all sizes can be donated until Decem-

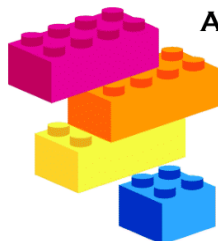

Cherry Hill Food Pantry in several ways. We support the Cherry Hill Food Pantry by supplying volunteers several times a year and through an annual donation from our congregation. In the past, we have also supported them through several food collections during the year. However, their biggest ongoing need is money. Presently, the CHFP is working to create a new parking lot. The parking lot will allow the CHFP to return to the food distribution model which allows clients to come in and shop for the food they need and like. The estimated cost of the parking lot is \$300,000. For the next few weeks, we will have envelopes at all the church doors. If you would like to make a donation, please put your donation in the envelope and put it in the regular offertory collection. Checks should be made out to the Cherry Hill Food Pantry (or CHFP). The CHFP is providing food to between 160-180 households per week. With rising food costs, this is an invaluable service. Thank you for your generosity.

Letter to Jewish Congregations

A letter was sent to nine local Jewish congregations this month to express sympathy for those affected by the October 7 terrorist attacks in Israel:

“As a faith community we are reaching out in response to the terror attacks that took place throughout Israel on October 7. We mourn with you the lives lost, those injured, and the deep emotional wounds experienced by Israelis and Jewish people around the world as a result. We also continue to pray that all those taken hostage will be released immediately and in good health. As a congregation, we commit ourselves to counter hate and bigotry wherever and whenever we encounter it, in whatever form it takes. We are distressed and greatly saddened that such violence has occurred on land sacred to people of the Abrahamic faith traditions, of all places.

We know that these attacks happened as many were preparing for Simchat Torah, which should have been a day of joyful celebration. We pray that in this time of sorrow the Jewish community here and abroad will feel the support and love in the same spirit of abundance that Sukkot brings, especially in these times of great adversity. Please be assured of our solidarity with you- our neighbors and friends.

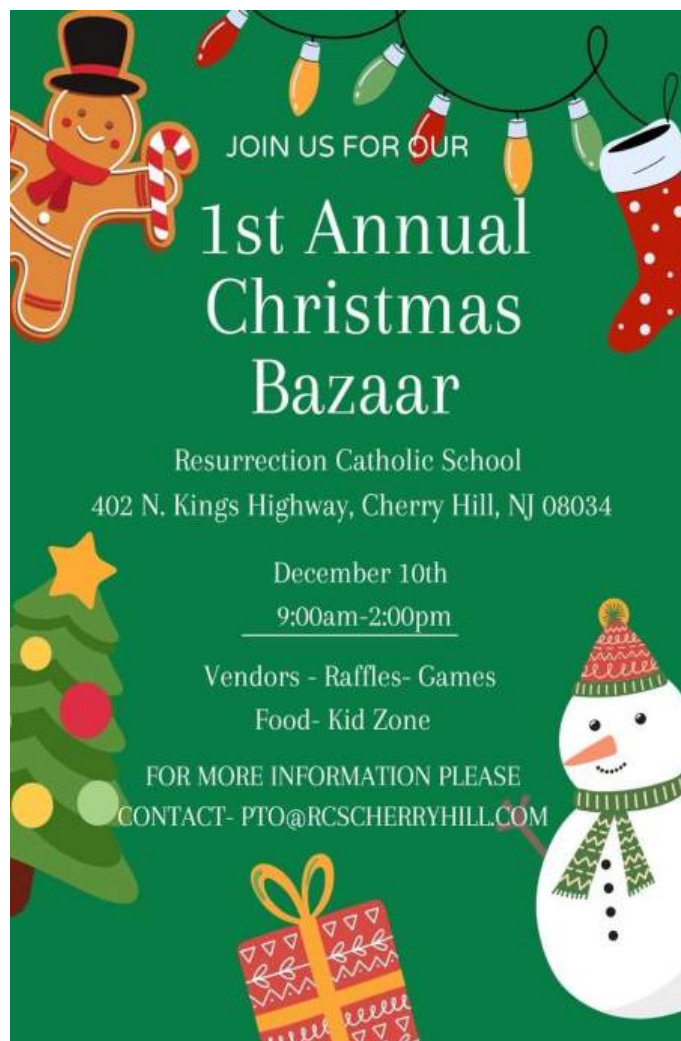

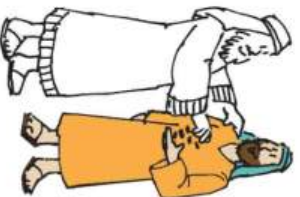
