Adults:

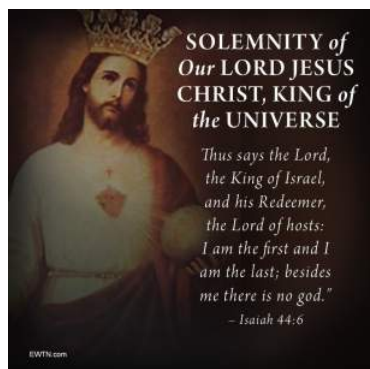

Eucharistic Revival



This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. **The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**, formerly referred to as "Christ the King," was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of

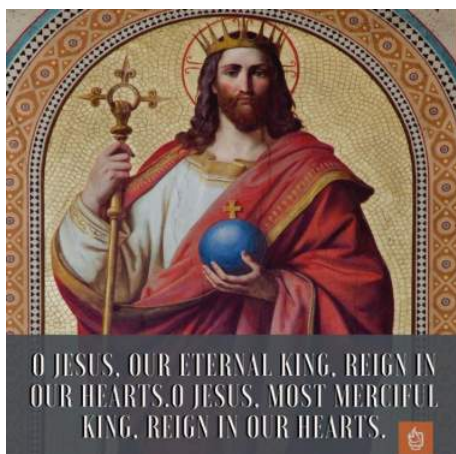
life which leaves God out of humankind's thinking and living and organizes one's life as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

Today's Mass establishes the titles for Christ's royalty over humankind: 1) Christ is God, the Creator of the universe and hence wields a supreme power over all things; "All things were created by Him"

2) Christ is our Redeemer, He purchased us by His precious Blood, and made us His property and possession; 3) Christ is Head of the Church, "holding in all things the primacy"

4) God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as His special possession and dominion.

Today's Mass also describes the qualities of Christ's kingdom. This kingdom is (1) **supreme**, extending not only to all people but also to their princes and kings; (2) **universal**, extending to all nations and to all places; (3) **eternal**, for "The Lord shall sit a King forever" and (4) **spiritual**, as Christ's "kingdom is not of this world."

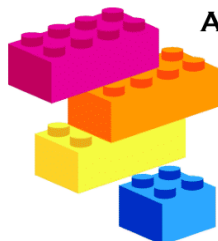
SSJ Annual Chance Drive

Christmas Program for Families in Need

We are already preparing several programs to assist families in need this Christmas. For those new to the parish, we have a Giving Tree up during Advent which provides gifts to:



1. families served by Guadalupe Family Services in Camden,
2. women who have elected not to have an abortion through our pro-life ministry, and
3. local organizations such as Options for Women, First Way in Collingswood and Good Counsel Home in Riverside of baby items which are donated at our Christmas Masses.

One of the other opportunities we have for giving at Christmas is through our Adopt-a-Family program. Last year we were able to help 50 families with gifts and gift cards. Other families prefer to receive gift cards so they can shop for their children, and so you can help by donating gift cards or checks which go into a fund for parish staff to disburse among our recipient families. Cherry Hill Food Pantry

This is the final appeal for our fall donation to the Cherry Hill Food Pantry! Christ Our Light is one of several local churches which supports the Cherry Hill Food Pantry in several ways. We support the Cherry Hill Food Pantry by supplying volunteers several times a year and through an annual donation from our congregation. In the past, we have also supported them through several food collections during the year. However, their biggest ongoing need is money. Presently, the CHFP is working to create a new parking lot. The parking lot will allow the CHFP to return to the food distribution model which allows clients to come in and shop for the food they need and like. The estimated cost of the parking lot is \$300,000. For the next few weeks, we will have envelopes at all the church doors. If you would like to make a donation, please put your donation in the envelope and put it in the regular offertory collection. Checks should be made out to the Cherry Hill Food Pantry (or CHFP). The CHFP is providing food to between 160-180 households per week. With rising food costs, this is an invaluable service. Thank you for your generosity.

A Prayer for Peace

The Holy Father has called for prayers for the sake of peace. A rosary, prayed to Our Lady Queen of Peace, might seek her intercession. The following prayer, released from the Vatican, might be also be used in private prayer or in a variety of circumstances and communal settings.

A PRAYER FOR PEACE BY POPE FRANCIS

Lord God of peace, hear our prayer! We have tried so many times and over so many years to resolve our conflicts by our own powers and by the force of our arms. How many moments of hostility and darkness have we experienced; how much blood has been shed; how many lives have been shattered; how many hopes have been buried... But our efforts have been in vain.

Now, Lord, come to our aid! Grant us peace, teach us peace; guide our steps in the way of peace. Open our eyes and our hearts, and give us the courage to say: "Never again war!"; "With war everything is lost". Instill in our hearts the courage to take concrete steps to achieve peace.

Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness.

Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam!

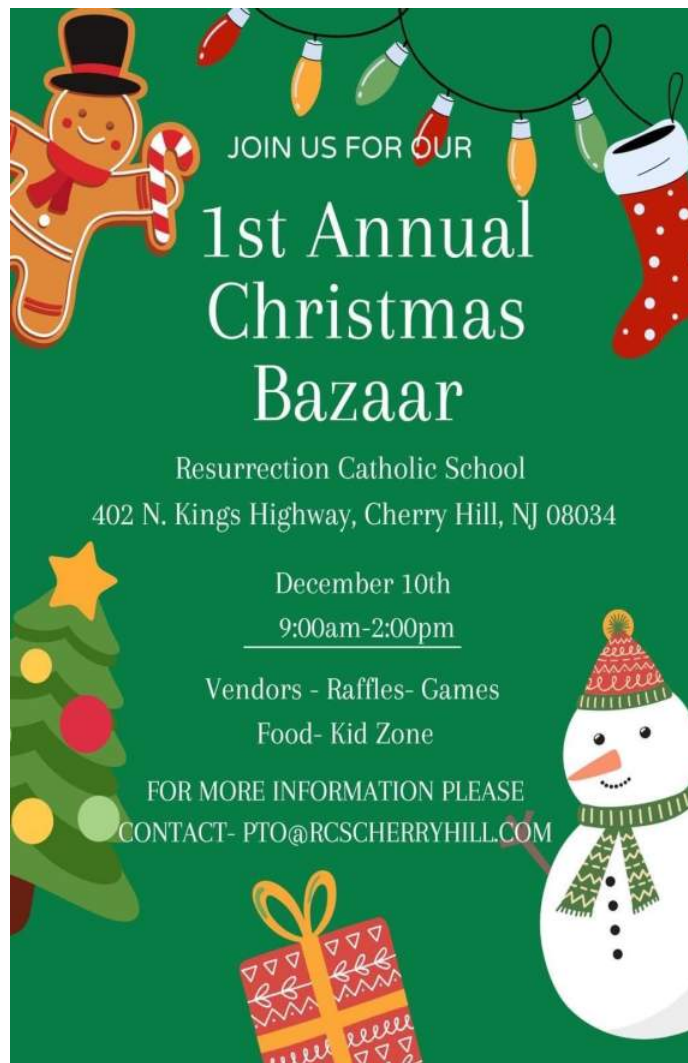

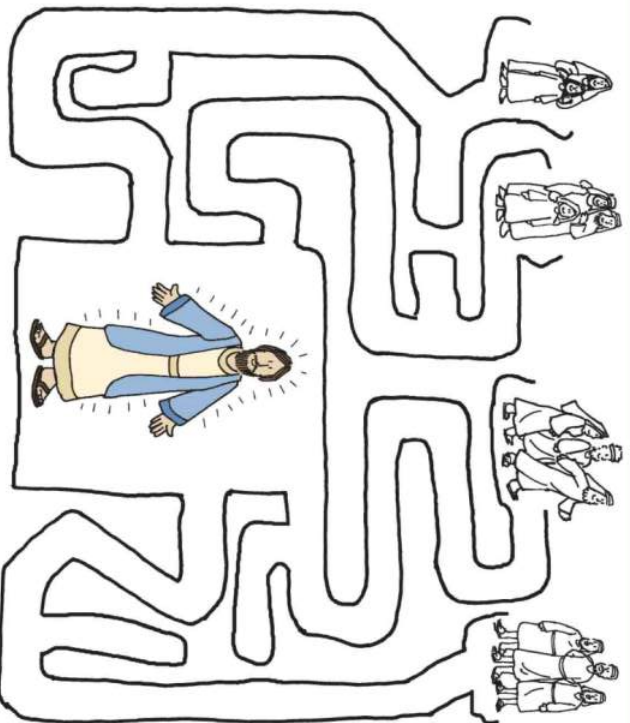

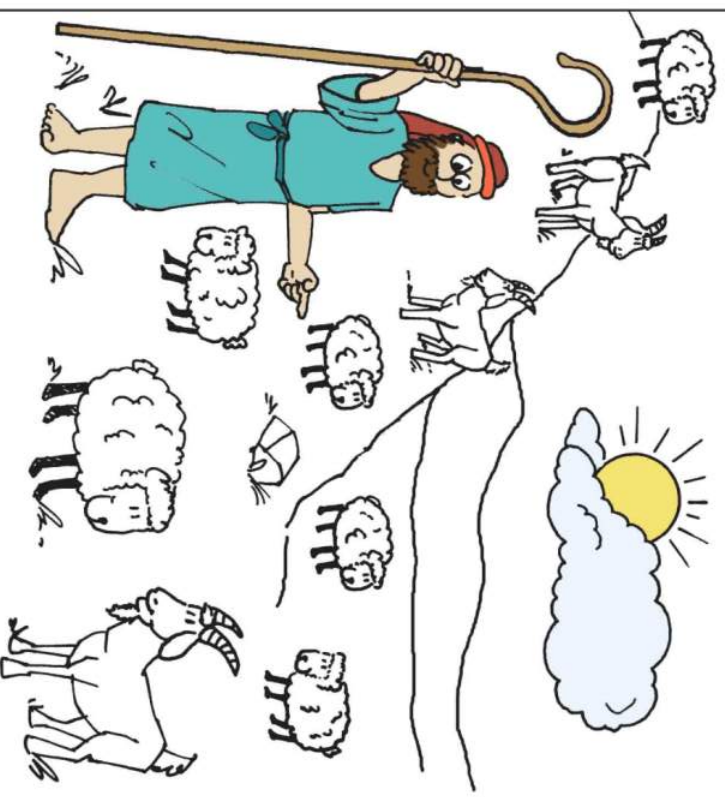
