Eucharistic Revival



This Sunday marks the first Sunday of Advent. When we take the time to actually slow down to appreciate the Advent season, it can be transformative. While the world around us seems to begin celebrating Christmas before Halloween has even passed, Catholics and many Christians recognize Advent as an important liturgical season.

As we begin this Advent season, our Lord is speaking to you in the deepest depths of your soul. He is gently saying, "Wake up." "Listen." "Watch." Our Lord will not shout, but will whisper so that you must give your full attention. Do you hear Him? Listen to Him? Understand Him? Do you know His voice? Or do the many voices all around you take you away from the deep, profound and transforming truths He wishes to communicate to you?

Advent is a time to renew your commitment to listen, to be attentive and to respond. Do not remain asleep. Wake up and diligently be attentive to the profound voice of our Lord. This is not a time of passive waiting! Consider attending daily Mass...prepare an Advent wreath with your family...pray with an Advent devotional...visit Jesus in the tabernacle in church...read the Gospel of Luke each day. How will you be transformed this Advent season?

Let this be our prayer during the first week of Advent, a week of HOPE as represented by the first candle on the Advent wreath:

Come, Lord Jesus, come! May this Advent be a time of deep renewal in my life, dear Lord. May it be a time in which I strive with all my heart to seek out Your gentle and profound voice. Give me the grace, dear Lord, to turn away from the many noises of the world that compete for my attention and to turn only to You and to all You wish to say. Help me to hear You! Come, Lord Jesus, come into my life more deeply during this Advent season. Jesus, I trust in You. Amen.

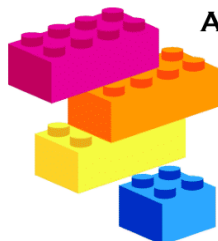

Trex Challenge Update for November



All who have contributed to C.O.L.'s TREX Challenge need to take a bow. **134 pounds** of plastic was collected this month. In two months we are over

50% of our 500 pound goal - 253 pounds.

During the holiday shopping season, remember that all plastic packaging, plastic mailers, and shrink wrap should be considered for recycling. Check the lists below if you are unsure about whether or not to save the plastic for the TREX program.

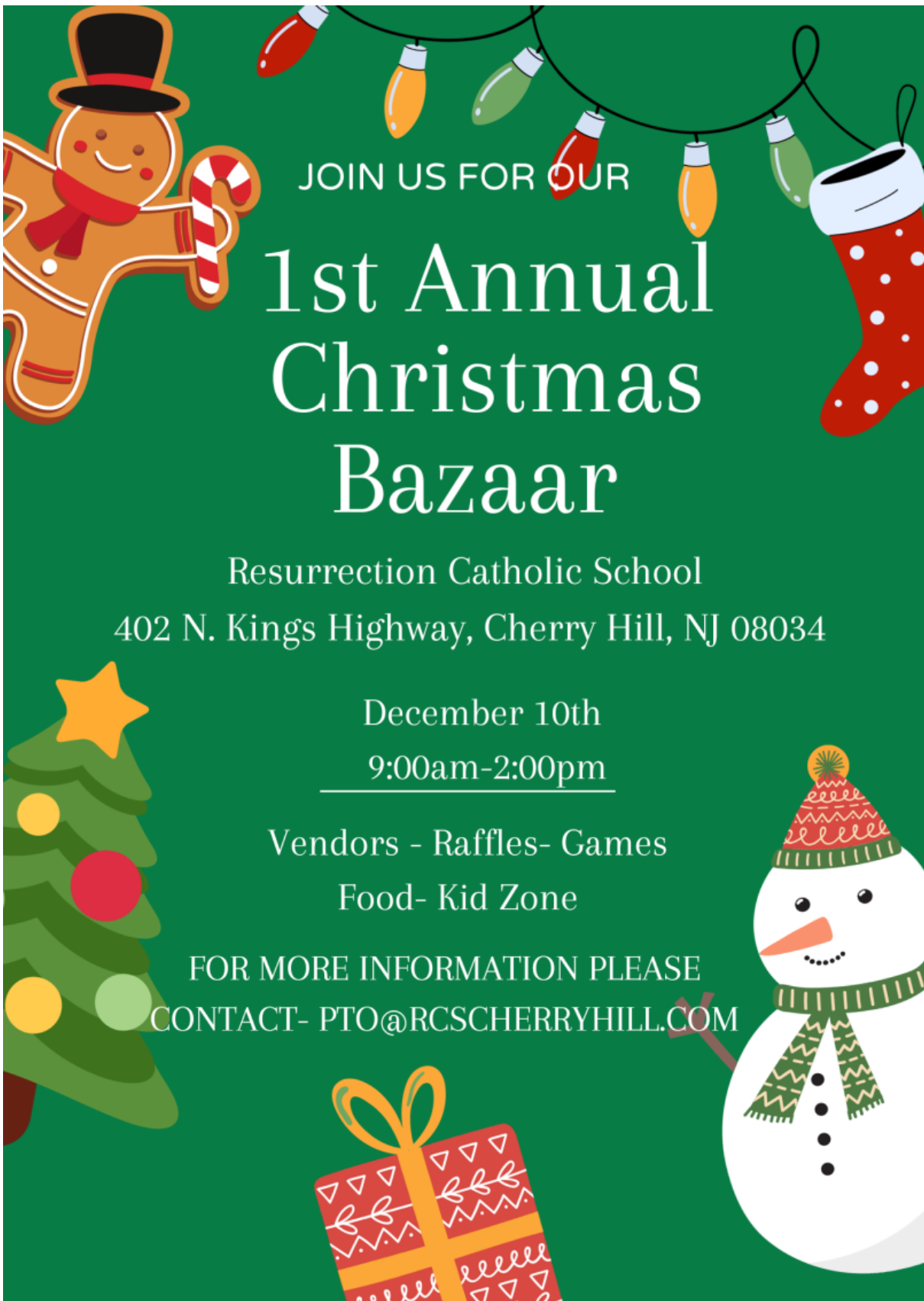
ITEMS ACCEPTED BY TREX COMPANY: Bubble wrap (pop bubbles), grocery bags, (all colors), case overwrap, bread bags, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, produce bags, cereal bags, paper towel /toilet paper overwrap, Ziploc or food storage bags, ice bags (DRY – without metal clips), wood pellet bags, stretch film and pallet wrap, furniture foam wrap.

DO NOT INCLUDE THESE ITEMS: frozen food bags, candy bar wrappers, chip and snack bags, net or mesh product bags, pet food bags, pre-washed salad mix bags, degradable/compostable bags or film packaging, six-pack rings, PPE – gloves, masks, or protective wear, bedding or linen packaging, shiny, crinkly films like floral wrap, vinyl shower curtains or tablecloths.

DON'T SEE YOUR ITEM ON THE LIST? See if the package will stretch when you pull it. If yes, it can be included. If it tears like paper, then please don't put it in the bin. **Is the package shiny or does it make a crinkly/crunchy sound in your hand?** If yes, **DO NOT RECYCLE IN THE NexTrex bin.**
