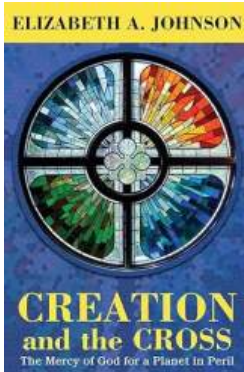

Black History Month

Black History Month is celebrated in February in the United States. It is an annual declared month highlighting Black History contributions to events in history and contemporary society. The Pastoral Council's Unity Rich in Diversity Pathway is highlighting Six Holy Candidates for Sainthood.

Christianity has been present in Africa since its inception, likely brought back to Libya by St. Simon of Cyrene. Through the centuries, dozens of black saints have been from Africa, Europe, and South America. As yet, not a single African American Catholic has been canonized, but that should change in the next few decades, as six different Americans of African descent have open causes for sainthood.

Six Holy Black Catholics for Sainthood

The process to sainthood has four phases: Servant of God, Venerable, Blessed, and Saint.



Venerable Pierre Toussaint (1766-1853) was born a slave in Haiti, where he was baptized Catholic. He was brought to New York City and learned to work as a hairdresser. When offered his freedom, Toussaint refused and continued work. On his owner's death, he was freed and four years later married Juliette Noel. They adopted his niece, took in orphans, and had many foster sons. The Toussaints were philanthropists and leaders in the black community, helping to found the first Catholic school for black children in New York, establishing a credit bureau and employment agency, and nursing cholera patients. A daily communicant, Toussaint was the first layperson to be buried beneath the main altar at St. Patrick's Cathedral.

Care for Creation



Online returns. There is a price you don't see.

16% of online purchases were returned. It is easy and free on the consumer's end to return merchandise.

There is a terrible hidden cost. What we don't realize is that many returned goods don't get resold at all. Online returns create 16 million tons of carbon emissions or the equivalent of 3.5 million cars on the road for an entire year. It's often cheaper for the seller to simply throw the item away than to inspect for damage, repackage and resell. Dumping returns is often less costly than reusing them. A number of startups have created middleman services to streamline the process or increase "circularity" by diverting returns to online resellers or charities, but the problem persists. In the United States, 2.6 million tons of returned clothes wound up in landfills in 2020. And that is just clothing. Customers return approximately 24 percent of clothing purchased online.

Perhaps this year is the time to evaluate how we use the internet to shop and return items. Perhaps we need to determine if we really need the item we are purchasing online. If it is clothing, do we know what size we are in this brand. It is no longer good for the environment to order two pieces of clothing in two sizes and send the one that doesn't fit back. There is a price for that return. It is not free.

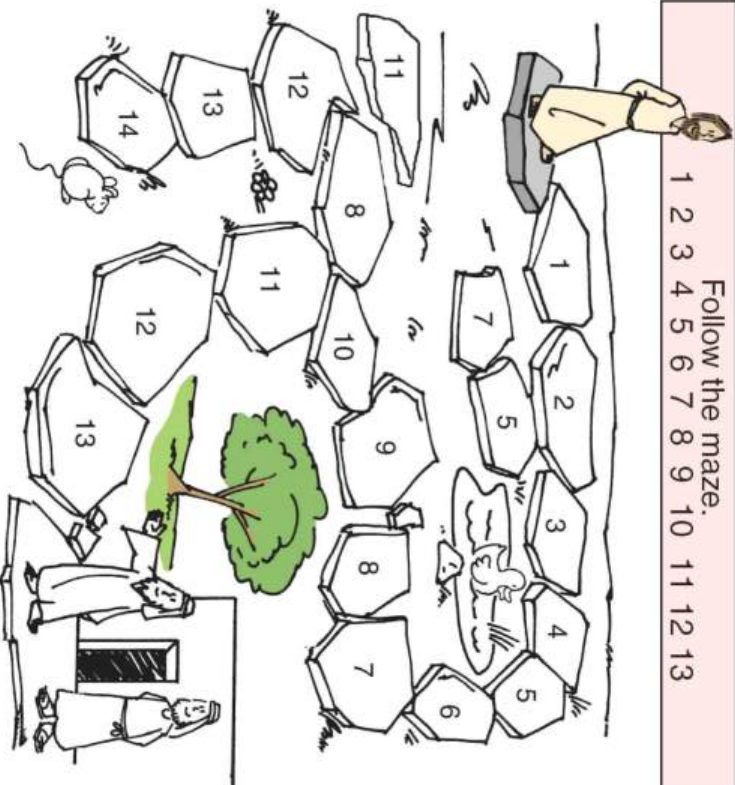

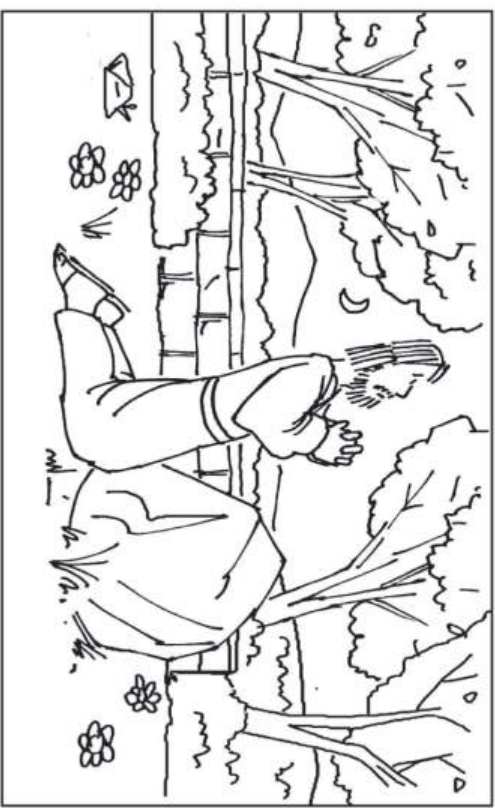
