“Come and See”

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. ***Repent, and believe in the gospel.*** The Greek word for repent is *metanoia*, which means, “to change your direction/to change your mind.” Or in another way, “turn around.”

As we begin Lent, Jesus asks us to, “turn around and come back towards Him.” One may ask, “turnaround from what?” We turn around or away from sin, for sin is our own choosing, when we sin, we decide that we will move in our own direction a different direction from our Lord. It is something we have chosen, and then we go our own way. The season of Lent asks us to look at ourselves honestly and openly. In that honesty we realize our short comings, our failures, our weaknesses, and our sins, asking for God’s mercy and the strength \ courage to turn around and walk towards our Savior who is waiting for us with open arms.

There is a second part to the final verse and that is, “***and believe in the Gospel.***” In the Greek it is called the Euangelion and in Latin Evangelium both meaning, “Good News.” A question we can ask ourselves, ***what exactly is the Good News?*** It is the written recordings of Jesus’ life and teachings, and those teachings can be summed up in one thesis statement, “Jesus came to save us from our sins and offer us eternal life with the Triune God.” For God so loved the world that he gave us His only begotten son so that we might not perish but may have eternal life — John 3:16.

In that message are many other sub messages, i.e. love your neighbor, feed the hungry, heal the sick, visit those in prisons, be honest, be humble, persevere in faith, be good, etc. That message was entrusted to Jesus’ Apostles and in particular the written account was given to us by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Jesus commanded all his disciples to go forth and baptize all nations in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Today we will bless the icons of the Four Evangelists along with the icon of Christ the Light Bringer. That Light is His message as written by the Evangelists.

This is an important day for our parish as we begin a new initiative brought forth by our parish leadership, which includes the staff, the pastoral council, and the finance council. That initiative is called, “Come and See.” These are Jesus words from the Gospel of Matthew, when Andrew asked the Lord, “where are you staying,” and Jesus replied, “Come and See.”

The initiative is centered on two simple aspects, share the Good News of Jesus Christ with all, with each other here in the pews, your neighbors, inviting them all to a personal encounter with our Lord to help foster their own relationships and in turn inviting more of our parishioners into active ministries here at our parish, of which there are many and many of them very active. Sitting in the pews at Sunday Mass is not enough. We need disciples who are on the move, not necessarily going out on the street corner waving your copy of the bible, but right here joining us in what we do and inviting our neighbors to this beautiful place which is filled with the Light of Christ.

This task of evangelization is not just for clergy or religious to do, but every single baptized person. The four evangelists were ordinary folk just like you and me. Matthew was a tax collector turning his back on his own people. Mark was young and zealous, and Paul sent him away, back home to humble him. Luke was a Gentile convert who was a doctor and an artist. And John was a son of thunder, as Jesus named John and his brother James, because they asked the Lord to reign down fire on those towns that did not accept their message, even with all their thunder Jesus called John, “the beloved disciple.”

My friends, this is us, we are called even in our weakness in our ordinary lives to do something extraordinary. We have the same gifts in our Baptism to evangelize, help folks to a deeper relationship in Jesus, who has called us his friends.

We will now bless and consecrate our beautiful icons, which represent the Light of Christ, His message to the world of Good News. Yet, it is not just about those four evangelists, their work has finished, it is now us how must continue the work of Jesus, not only here within these walls, but everywhere. “Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

A Story of Hope From Uganda

“I have seen my children are happy because they are well fed.” –Adolf Omara



Adolf and his wife, Florence, are farmers in Akwangagwel, Uganda. The couple is dedicated to fighting hunger so that their family and others in their community can build thriving lives. They do this by farming, which helps their family to eat three nutritious meals a day, and by assisting others in their community to grow successful crops.

Each member of their household has an important role, like gardening, cleaning, preparing meals and caring for the animals. In the evenings, they enjoy spending time together as a family. Adolf is thankful for the free time to sit and relax with his children.

In the area where they live, the climate is very dry. Lately, the rainy season has been coming later than it used to. And sometimes, it rains too much all at once and causes flooding.

“It rains so heavily and destroys things,” Adolf says. “So, the goodness of rain is taken away.” In addition, people come through their community and steal their food or tools. It makes it difficult to farm with these challenges—and that means food is harder to come by.

To overcome these obstacles, Adolf and Florence joined a Catholic Relief Services program where they learned new farming methods that help them grow crops even when it is hot and dry. They planted seeds that grow quickly, so that they can still have vegetables to harvest, even if there isn’t much rain. This provides enough food to eat and to sell at the market for extra income. “I have seen my children are happy because they are well fed,” Adolf says.

Because of the successful life that he and Florence have built, they are sharing the knowledge they learned with their neighbors. As a leader in his community, Adolf works with others to increase their harvests, improve the land and build a safe and thriving community.

Black History Month

Black History Month is celebrated in February in the United States. It is an annual declared month highlighting Black History contributions to events in history and contemporary society. The Pastoral Council's Unity Rich in Diversity Pathway is highlighting Six Holy Candidates for Sainthood.

Christianity has been present in Africa since its inception, likely brought back to Libya by St. Simon of Cyrene. Through the centuries, dozens of black saints have been from Africa, Europe, and South America. As yet, not a single African American Catholic has been canonized, but that should change in the next few decades, as six different Americans of African descent have open causes for sainthood.

Six Holy Black Catholics for Sainthood

The process to sainthood has four phases: Servant of God, Venerable, Blessed, and Saint.



Servant of God Julia Greeley (d. 1918) was born into slavery in Missouri between 1835 and 1848. When she was a child, a slave master caught her eye with a whip and destroyed it. After she was freed in 1865, Greeley eventually made her way to

Denver, where she converted to Catholicism and became a daily communicant. She lived very simply, giving away all she could and begging on the street to be able to provide more for the poor. She worked after dark to honor their dignity (and preserve her anonymity), dragging a little red wagon filled with provisions all around the city. Greeley loved the Sacred Heart and firefighters; she visited every fire station in the city each month to give them pamphlets about the Sacred Heart. Greeley walked for many miles each day despite severe arthritis. Though she had lived a humble and hidden life, more than 1,000 people came to mourn her death.



Venerable Augustus Tolton (1854-1897) was the first African-American Catholic priest to acknowledge his African heritage publicly. Born into slavery, Tolton and his family escaped to Illinois, where he discerned a call to the priesthood despite the racism he endured from

white Catholics. But while his pastor supported his vocation, Tolton was rejected by every American seminary because of his race. Finally, he was accepted at a seminary in Rome and prepared to serve in the African missions as the American bishops were sure that the American Church wasn't ready for black priests. But Rome saw differently, and Fr. Tolton was sent first to Quincy, Illinois, and then to Chicago, where he served his people tirelessly despite constant struggles with prejudiced clergy and laity. He died of exhaustion at only 43.

Servant of God Thea Bowman (1937-1990) was born into a Methodist family, but her experience at Catholic school led her to convert to Catholicism at age nine. At only 15, Bowman entered the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration, the only black Sister in the community. Sister Thea went on to teach all ages, eventually getting her doctorate and becoming an English professor. She was a powerful voice against racism and eventually began to work full-time in black Catholic ministry, explaining the beauty of African-American Catholic spirituality to individuals and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. She died of breast cancer at only 51.

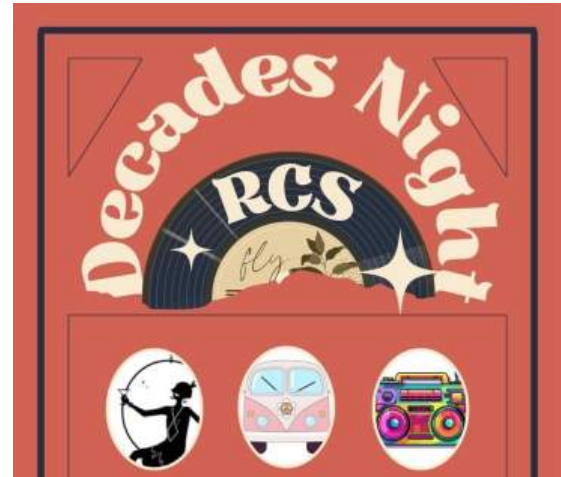

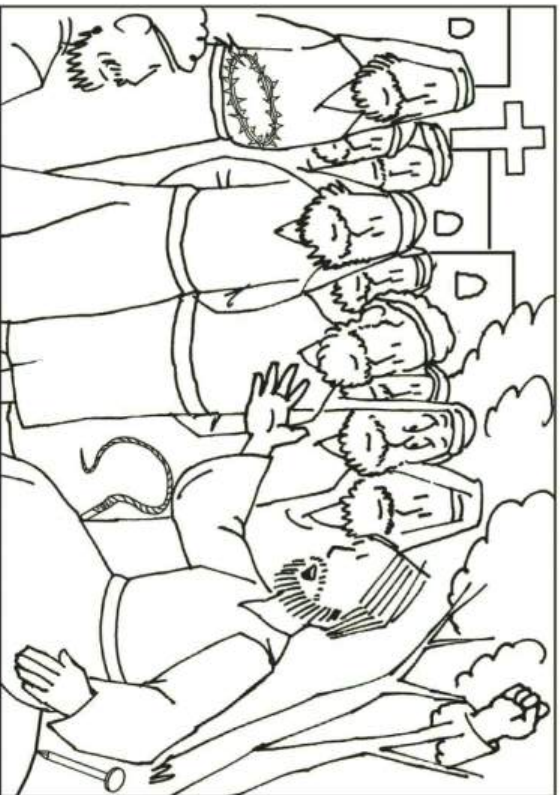
