John 14:1 – 15:47

Adults:

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Eucharistic Revival



As we enter into Holy Week during this year of Eucharistic Revival, let us take the time to slow down, quiet ourselves, and truly meditate on the Passion of Our Lord and His ultimate gift of the Eucharist.

From the "*Stations of the Cross*" by St. Peter

Julian Eymard: Jesus is condemned by His own people, by the very ones He showered with His favors. He is condemned as a fomenter of rebellion, He Who is goodness itself; as a blasphemer, He Who is holiness itself; as one seeking power, He Who made Himself the least of all. He is condemned to die on the Cross like the lowest of slaves.

Jesus lovingly accepts this sentence of death: He came down to this earth in order to suffer and die and to teach us to do the same.

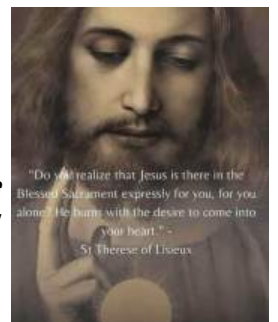
In the Holy Eucharist Jesus is again condemned to death: primarily in His graces, which are rejected; in His love, which is slighted; in His sacramental state, by the unbeliever who denies Him, by horrible sacrilege.

Jesus is more cruelly treated by bad Christians than by the Jews. In Jerusalem He was condemned only once, but in the Blessed Sacrament, He is condemned everyday and in thousands of places, and by an appalling number of unjust judges.

And yet Jesus allows Himself to be insulted, despised, condemned: He still continues His sacramental life in order to show us that His love for us is without condition or reserve, that it is greater than our ingratitude.

O Jesus, forgive, I beseech Thee, all sacrileges! Should I ever have committed any, I want to pass my life making reparation for them and loving and honoring Thee for them that despise Thee. Grant me the grace to die with Thee!

We adore you, O Christ, and we praise You. Because by Your holy cross, You have redeemed the world. Amen

Nutrition Month

The goal of the National Nutrition Month (sponsored by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics) is to help increase education on making

healthy food choices and developing healthy eating habits across the lifespan. This is the 50th anniversary of a national nutrition celebration!

There are six types of nutrients provided by foods: Carbohydrates, Proteins, Fats, Vitamins, Minerals, and Water. There are five food groups: Dairy, Grains, Protein Foods, Vegetables, and Fruits

Nutrient-dense foods provide high levels of vitamins and minerals while having little added sugar, saturated fat, and sodium. The MyPlate graphic helps depict a balanced diet.

There are simple tips to help improve your nutritional status at any age including:

- Don't skip breakfast – start the day with a balanced meal!
- Watch portion sizes
- Drink more water
- Read food labels – keep an eye on added sugars and salt
- Slow down at meal-time and/or enact a family meal time

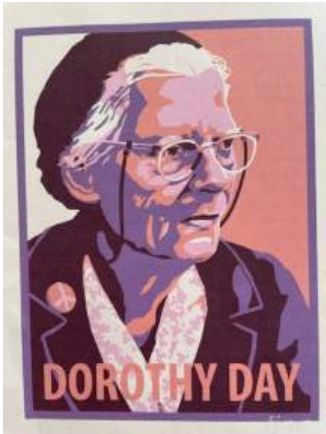

Women's History Month



Dorothy Day was an American writer and social activist who played a significant role in the Catholic Worker Movement. Born on November 8, 1897 in Brooklyn, New York, she grew up in a middle-class family and later embraced a radical lifestyle, devoting her life to social justice and advocating for the poor and marginalized. From an early age she loved literature and longed to be a journalist which ultimately became her chosen path. She wrote for various publications which advocated for social justice in our society. During the winter of 1927 Dorothy was received into the Catholic Church (she had been baptized in the Episcopal Church) after being instructed in the faith by Sister Aloysia who was instrumental in having Dorothy's daughter Tamar Teresa baptized previously. In December 1932, the Catholic magazine *The Commonweal* (which is still in publication today as *Commonweal*) commissioned Dorothy to write an article about a hunger march on Washington, D.C. After she had written her story, Dorothy went to the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington,

D.C. “ *There I offered up a special prayer, a prayer which came with tears and with anguish, that some way would open up for me to use what talents I possessed for my fellow workers, for the poor*” (this excerpt is from Dorothy's autobiography *Long Loneliness* p. 166).

Also in 1932 Dorothy met Peter Maurin, a French-born Catholic who had developed a program of social reconstruction based on communal farming and the establishment of houses of hospitality for the urban poor. The program, now is called the **Catholic Worker Movement**, aimed to unite workers and intellectuals in joint activities ranging from farming to educational discussions. In 1933 Dorothy Day and Peter Maurin founded the *Catholic Worker*, a monthly newspaper, to carry the idea to a wider audiences. Within three years the paper's circulation had grown to 150,000, and the original St. Joseph's House of Hospitality in New York City had served as the pattern for similar houses in a number of other cities.

Some of the characteristics of **Dorothy Day's spirituality** that sustained her throughout her life were: **Love of Scripture**- she received comfort and inspiration from the Bible especially the Psalms, Pauline writings and the Gospels; **Solidarity with the Poor**- Her writings, her direct practice of the works of mercy, and her own voluntary poverty bound her to poor, homeless, sick and desperate people; **Prophetic Witness** – By her public words and work, Dorothy sought to imitate Christ's witness against injustice even though like Christ she was often ridiculed and met with opposition for her witness; **A Sacramental Sense**- Dorothy looked to the sacraments, especially the Eucharist for daily spiritual sustenance; **Peace-making**- a steadfast pacifist , Dorothy opposed all wars and the use of force to solve human problems; **Gratitude** – In good times and bad , Dorothy had a sense of gratitude and learned to trust in the providence of God. She often expressed this gratitude to those around her and to the readers of *The Catholic Worker* .

At the 2012 meeting of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops the bishops unanimously recommended the canonization of Dorothy Day, founder of the **Catholic Worker Movement**. The Vatican had already given her the title of “Servant of God” “the first step in the canonization process. Pope Francis speaking before the U.S. Congress in 2015 singled out Dorothy Day as one of the four Americans he especially admired:” In these times when social concerns are so important, I cannot fail to mention the Servant of God Dorothy Day, who founded the Catholic Worker Movement. Her social activism, her passion for justice and the cause of the oppressed, were inspired by the Gospel, her faith, and the example of the saints.” Dorothy Day died on November 29, 1980.

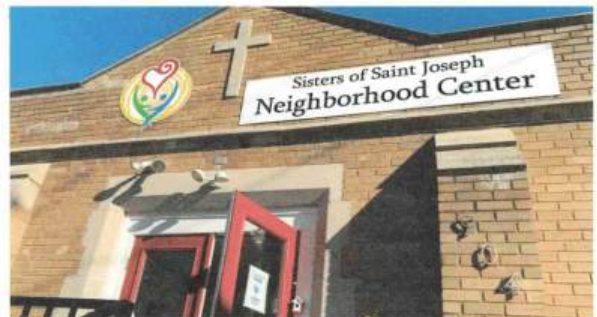

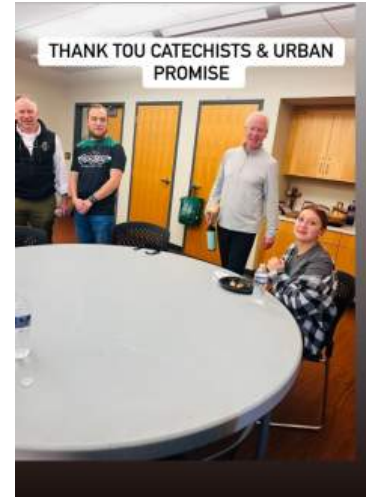
Youth Ministry Continues to be an Exciting Place!

What can we do as Catholics to improve our community?

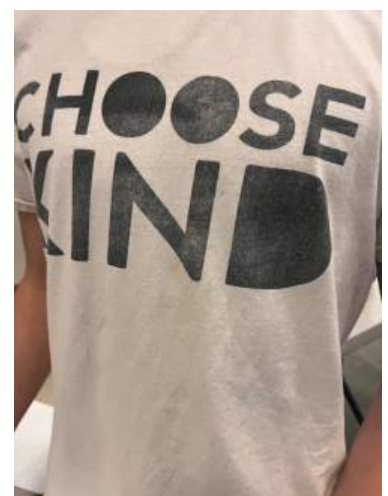
What signs does God send us each day?

How Can We Welcome People More Intentionally in our circles?

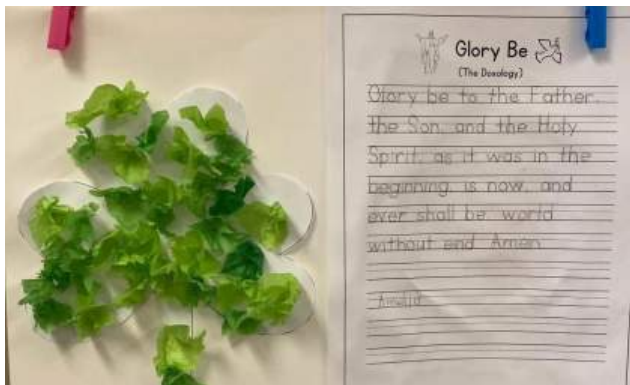

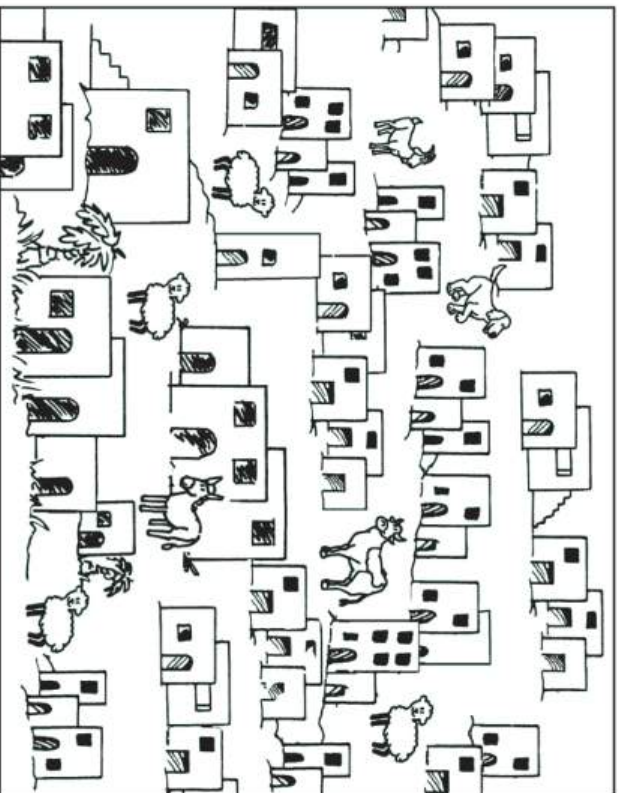

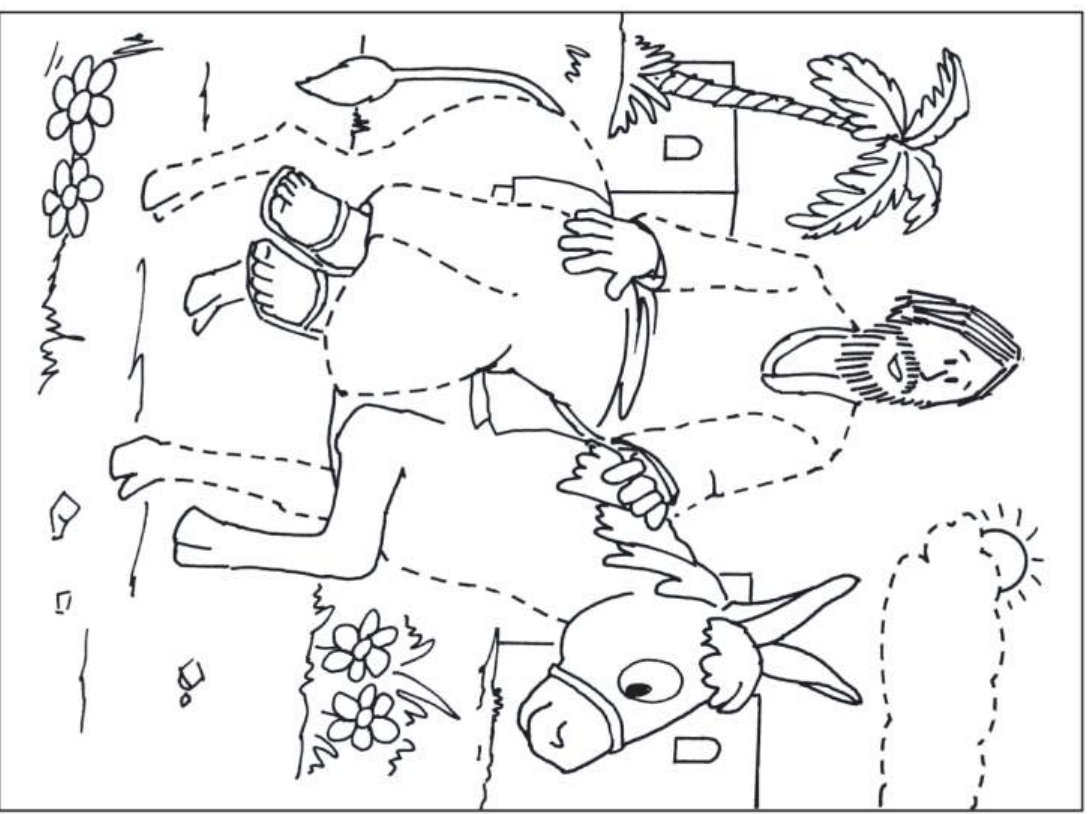
