- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Come and See



*Take and eat. Take and drink.
Do this in remembrance of me.*

These words of Jesus, spoken the night before he died, established a new covenant through a sacred and sacrificial

meal. It is a meal like no other due to its transformative power - which is why we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi.

For during that Passover meal, Jesus offers Himself as the Passover Lamb. It will be His sacrificial love that brings wholeness to a broken world. Yet the death of the Lamb does not complete the Passover meal. The meal is completed when the Paschal Lamb is consumed. So it is with Eucharist. With each Mass, Jesus shares His Body and Blood with us. In receiving the Eucharist, we allow Jesus to personally nourish and transform us to be more like Him as we are sent out into our world to share His sacrificial love with others.

Through the Eucharist, Jesus is the lifeblood of our community. St. Paul wrote in his First Letter to the Corinthians, "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes." The Eucharist impacts how we live as disciples of Jesus. *Come and See... Take and Eat...* our lives have never been the same.

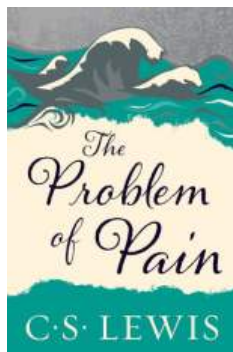

Did you know that since 2020, firearm-related injuries have become the leading cause of

death for youth aged 1-19? June is National Gun Violence Awareness Month and "Wear Orange" events began in 2013 to encourage community members to come together to show their collective power in addressing gun violence.

Concert to End Gun Violence

The **Camden County Concert to End Gun Violence** will take place on June 10 at 6:30 pm at Wiggins Waterfront Park (2 Riverside Dr. in Camden). The event will feature a free concert by Grammy nominated artists Black Violin, an American hip hop duo from Fort Lauderdale, FL founded by two classically trained string instrumentalists. Prior to the concert, there will be a Resource Fair featuring the Souls Shot Portrait Program, resources from the CamCare, NAM, Camden County Health Department, and as well as a fashion show with students modeling their "Wear Orange" t-shirt designs. The event will also feature motivational speakers, including youth from March for Our Lives, Poets, and elected dignitaries. The Ben Franklin Bridge and prominent buildings in Camden will be lit up in orange lights!

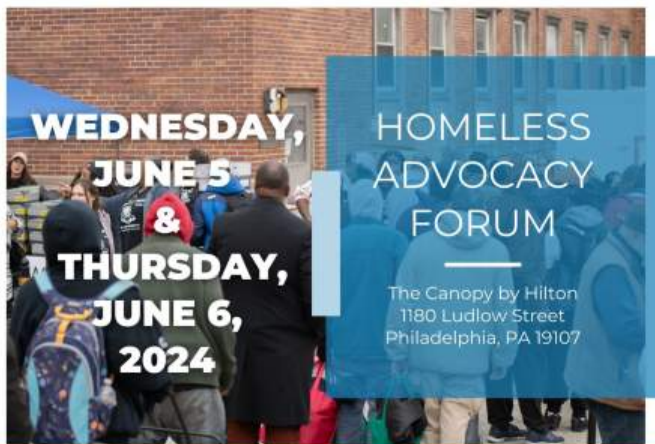

If you are looking for a place to donate unwanted household items, please call the Parish Office for suggestions. Please do not drop off unsolicited donations of books, clothing, medical supplies, cookware, appliances, etc. in the Church or Parish Center unless the donation is labeled for a specific recipient or is intended for a parish-coordinated donation drive. We thank you for your support and generosity!

Donations Accepted Year-Round



- The COL Food Pantry always needs staples like toilet paper, laundry detergent, soup, tuna, canned dinners (like Chef Boyardee), peanut butter, jelly, canned vegetables, rice, beans, cereal, etc. We can only accept nonperishable goods since we do not have a pantry refrigerator.
- Sr. Mary Berryman of the SSJ Neighborhood Center collects red, white, or black beans (in bags or cans) and toilet paper in the Gathering Space monthly (see bulletin for dates) as well as baby diapers, wipes, and toys in the Parish Office.
- Sr. Helen Cole of Guadalupe Family Services collects baby diapers and wipes in the Parish Office.
- Joseph's House volunteers collect frozen homemade casseroles monthly in the Servers' Room freezer. They also collect coffee, tea, sugar, creamer, snacks and baked goods, bottled water and other drinks, men's and women's clothing, new socks and underwear, toiletries, backpacks, luggage, blankets, and towels on the table in the Servers' Room.
- Helping God's Precious Infants (a local pro-life ministry) collects worn sneakers in a bin outside of the Ministry Center Conference Room.
- Clothing that is too worn to be donated can go in the blue bin for textile recycling in the parking lot close to the main entrance.
