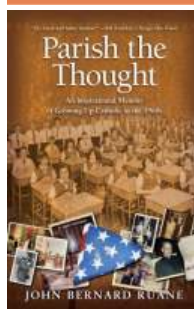

Christ Our Light is on a journey to know, love, and serve Christ in our parish community. Together we must embrace Christ's vision for missionary discipleship so our parish can thrive and be a place for others to grow together

in faith.

The very important step in this process involves **assessing our greatest strengths and opportunities**, and that is where the **Disciple Maker Index (DMI)** comes in! The DMI is an important survey tool that invites you to reflect on your discipleship journey here at Christ Our Light. The Disciple Maker Index is designed to:

- Invite parishioners to reflect on their journey of discipleship.
- Enable parish leadership to make data-driven decisions.
- Help parishioners grow in their faith.

The 10–15-minute survey can be accessed through an online link from July 30th through September 3rd and will ask you to reflect on your own spiritual growth and enable you to provide your perspective on our parish's efforts to help you grow in relationship with Christ. All responses will be confidential, and the parish will only receive information about the community as a whole. We will share the link with you a bit closer to the launch of the survey. Paper surveys will also be available for those who do not have the ability to complete the survey online.

Come and See



"A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." Mark 6:1-6a

When Jesus visited Nazareth, where he grew up, he faced rejection. He was prevented from doing any mighty deeds in his hometown because of the limited expectations of his own people. Those who knew him growing up could not accept who he has grown into. He was met with skeptical ungenerous amazement: Isn't this the carpenter's son? Who does he think he is to preach and perform miracles?

We do not know what exactly Jesus said to the crowds in the synagogue, but they took offense to his teachings. Perhaps Jesus jarred them out of their comfortable ways of thinking about family, work or religion. The message God calls Jesus to preach is a radical one. Their lack of faith made Jesus' job more difficult, but he persisted. Jesus continued to preach, teach, heal and bless. He did the hard thing time and time again. And we are saved because of it. We too are called to do the hard thing. Our baptism unite us to Christ, as priest, prophet and king. It feels odd to claim these titles for ourselves. But each of us is chosen, each of us is one of a kind, called by God to put our unique set of gifts and talents into service for others. We are called to sanctify the world and to share God's word. And when we feel overwhelmed, particularly when sharing the Good News with our families, who know us intimately, our weaknesses and foibles, we can humbly turn to God to accept what is. We have to remember that even Jesus found himself limited in the face of resistance as we see in today's gospel. No one is immune to vitriol of the doubters and detractors.

When we face these moments of struggle, they are not failures. They are reminders of our total dependence on God. We need his grace. Miracles of justice and mercy do not occur from our own hands but through the very power of God alive and working in us. Have you ever been surprised by the presence or action of God? Have you made assumptions about people that might have prevented you from encountering Christ in others or others encountering Christ in you? Let us continue to spread the Good News by living the Good News. Come and See!

Listening to the Stories of Appalachia



At the end of May, I was privileged to accompany 18 participants on our parish's annual service immersion experience in Eastern Kentucky. During the week, our team spent most of our time working on home repair projects in small teams throughout Floyd County as well as supporting our local partner organization, St. Vincent Mission, by coordinating their donation center and food pantry. Although I have both participated in and led service immersion experiences before, something special about our group was that we had an even number of veteran participants and new participants, as well as varying levels of construction experience. As our team met for formation meetings in the spring leading up to our departure, it was exciting for the new folks such as myself to hear from the veteran participants about how their perceptions and understanding of Appalachia had changed

from their repeated visits to Floyd County. Much of what they had learned was a direct result of building relationships with the families they served when entering their homes for a repair project. As we prepared for the trip, I grew excited to learn more about a part of the U.S. I've never visited, as well as the Appalachian people whose existence has remained invisible to many Americans.

One conversation that touched my heart during the week happened on the first day of our work projects. Our crew was assigned several projects at a house owned by a woman named Jettie Sue. Her house was built in the early 1900s and had been in her family for generations. Our team was tasked with fixing a severely sloping kitchen floor, adding a banister leading up to a loft, and investigating some roofing issues. As the skilled construction workers on our team assessed the house, I stepped into the family room where Jettie Sue was sitting. I noticed all of the family photos that lined the walls and tables and complimented them. She responded by "introducing" me to everyone in her family, referencing the photos one by one and sharing her family's oral history..



At one point she pointed to the photos of her children and explained that they "were up the hill, and so now my focus is on my grandchildren who live next door." At first I thought she meant that both of her children lived nearby in the "holler," the narrow valley where her house was located. But then it dawned on me that she meant her adult children had both died young and were buried in their family's cemetery plot on their land, a common practice in the area. Jettie Sue told me that despite these painful family losses and her serious chronic health challenges, she was intent on continuing her family's legacy by caring for her grandchildren and their long-cherished homeplace. Her story stayed with me because it exemplified the daily challenges of the people of Appalachia, such as the effects of climate change, opioid addiction, and lack of economic opportunity. But Jettie Sue's words also captured the Appalachian spirit of resilience.

Our group continued to see the "two sides" of Appalachia throughout the week: the struggle of a grandmother trying to raise her three year old grandson alone contrasted with the infectious joy of a local community bluegrass music night. The lasting damage of a devastating flood contrasted with the physical beauty of the lush green trees covering the rolling Appalachian mountains. The lack of stable work and access to higher education in the region contrasted with the hope embodied by the students and faculty at the David School, a local alternative high school that ensures no student slips through the cracks. Our parish group did not solve any of the structural injustices that we witnessed throughout our week in Eastern Kentucky, but I am grateful that we were present to learn more about this sacred place much different than our home by listening firsthand to the stories of the Appalachian people and their land.

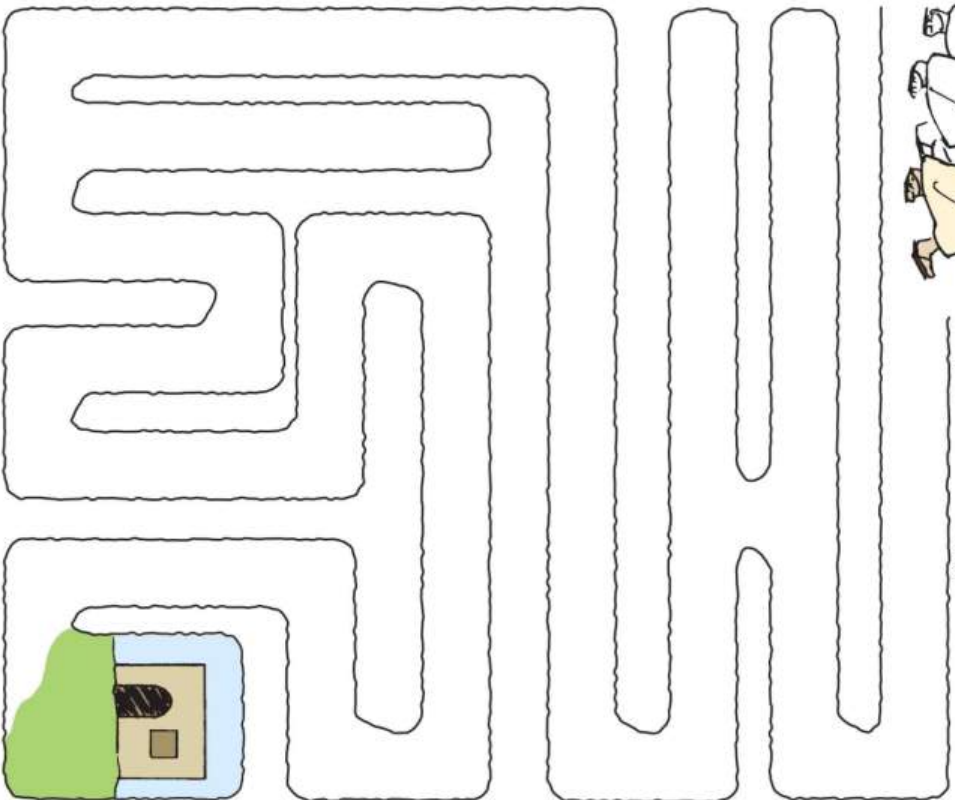
