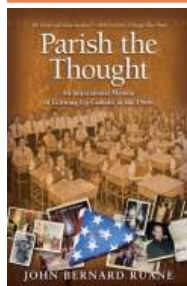

UV Safety Month

It is estimated that as many as 1 in 5 American will get skin cancer, it is the most common type of cancer in the United States. Ultraviolet (UV) exposure is the root cause of most skin cancers. Just five sunburns can double your risk of developing melanoma (the most serious form of skin cancer). Safe sun practices should be used all year long; however, sun exposure is most common in the summer. All skin tones are susceptible to damage from the UV rays of the sun.

Tips for Sun Safety:

- Seek shade when appropriate and possible - limit sun exposure especially during 10am and 2pm when the sun's rays are the strongest.
- Wear sun-protective clothing
- Apply a broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher as directed (including reapplying at least every two hours and more often if you are swimming or sweating).

Care for Creation Team



Our Care for Creation team has so many successful projects going on that it needs more volunteer help! Please contact Sandy and Dave Czerniakowski at 856-231-7879 if you can assist with these initiatives:

- Volunteers are needed weekly OR once a month to collect bagged plastic that parishioners donate for the Trex plastic recycling challenge. Donation pick-ups are usually done on Sunday afternoons and then again mid-week. There are multiple local drop-off locations that you can choose from, such as ACME, Whole Foods, Sprouts, and Occupational Training Center.
- For the month of September, we will be collecting items for the Voorhees Animal Welfare Association. We are looking for a volunteer to drive the donations from the church to the AMA once a week in September, but you can sign up for just one week. The AWA is open Mon-Fri from 12-5 pm.

Care for Creation: A Better Diet for People and the Planet

In 2019, the EAT-Lancet Commission was formed by 37 leading scientists from 16 countries to create a dietary guideline now known as the EAT-Lancet guidelines. These dietary guidelines aim to both maximize human health and reduce the environmental impact of feeding billions of people. A study that was published in June 2024 in *The American Journal of Clinical Nutrition* analyzed dietary data gathered from more than 200,000 women and men to see how it matches up against the EAT-Lancet dietary guidelines over a 34 year time period.

The researchers scored diets based on the intake of 15 food groups that are good for the planet because they take fewer overall resources to grow, such as whole grains, tubers, vegetables, whole fruits, legumes, soybean foods, and unsaturated plant oils, such as olive oil. Food that requires a large use of land, such as food from cattle, and to a lesser extent from sheep, goats, pigs and poultry were also measured. Raising livestock for human consumption uses an enormous amount of agricultural land and contributes to deforestation, biodiversity loss and water pollution. The animals themselves generate methane, a greenhouse gas 80 times more powerful than carbon dioxide.

In summary, participants who ate more from the 15 food groups above and ate less meat had a lower risk for every major cause of death than participants who had a diet higher in meat and processed foods.

"Changing how we eat can help slow climate change, and fortunately what's healthiest for the planet is also best for us," said Walter Willett, Professor of Epidemiology and Nutrition at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health.

Has your family considered having a regular "Meatless Monday" meal? Are there vegetarian recipes you've been meaning to try?

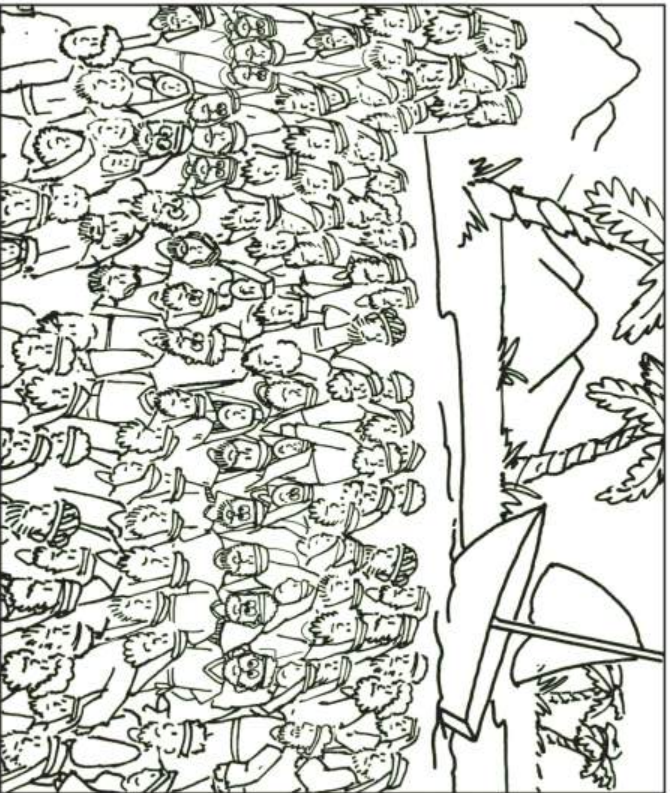

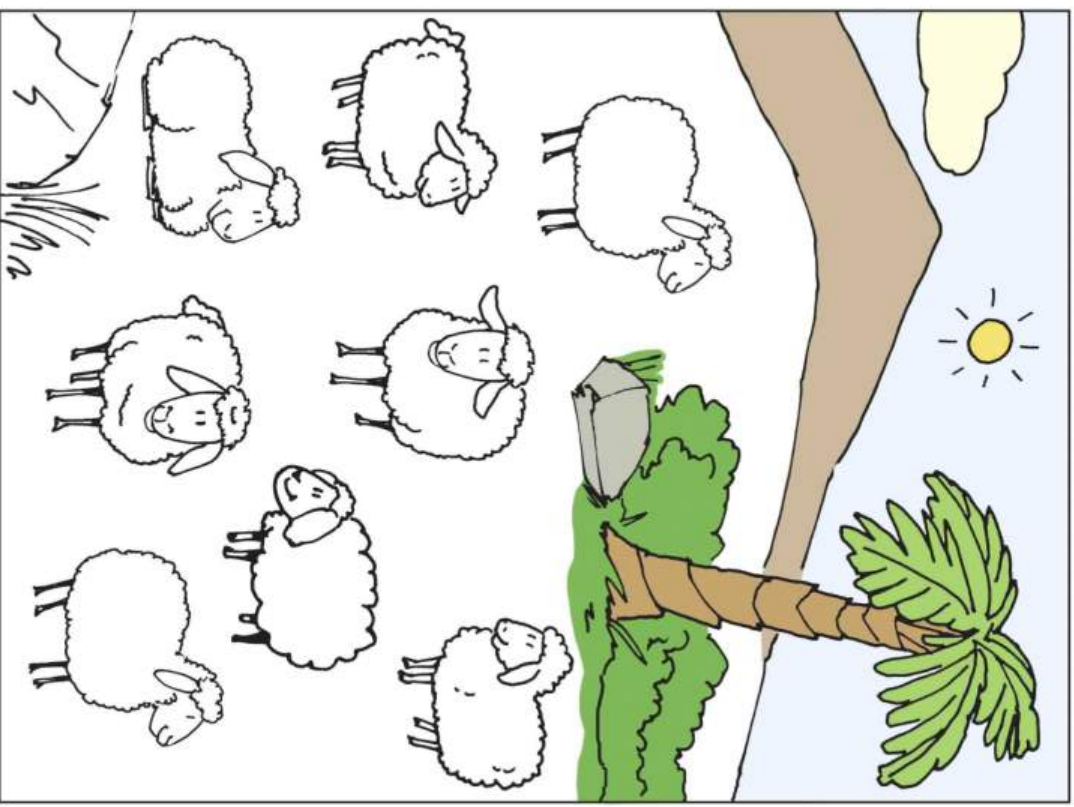
