My brothers and sisters,

Grace and peace to you from our Lord Jesus Christ. As we near the end of the summer season and move into early Fall it is time for new beginnings and renewal. We have another school year that has begun, and I am excited for our Administration, Faculty, and all the students and their families. I am also grateful to all our EFF and YFF staff and volunteers, the students and their families as they begin a new Faith Formation year.

As for renewals, I have been on a journey of renewal since late March of this year. You all know I had to take some time for my health and wellness. In that time, I have made new discoveries of myself, ones that will help me to run the race as St. Paul says, and to do it - healthy in mind, body and spirit.

I want to thank all the parishioners who prayed for me and supported me with their kind letters, cards, Mass intentions, etc. I also remembered you all at the Altar during Mass quite often.

I also want to thank my staff, who stepped up to the plate and did not miss a pitch, who put in 110% in my absence: Fr. Myers, Deacon Joe, Deacon Frank, Julie DeMareo, Nancy Douglass, Cort Hrivnak, Sherine Green, Ginny Grogan, Mary Lou Lymper, and Nancy Bradis. In addition, Amelia and Angela in the office (Angela took over as Bookkeeper when Kathy Zippilli retired on June 30th); and our maintenance staff including David Eves, Joe Prisco, and Bob Ehrmann, continued their good work and support to everyone in my absence. I also want to single out David Doan, who has served as our interim director for music and worship and has done yeoman's work since the departure of our former music director. Lastly, I am pleased to let you all know that following a long search process by a group of 5 or 6 parishioners during the time I was away, we now have a full time Property Manager at COL: Bill Lent joined in early August, and while our beloved John Murray left big shoes to fill, Bill has already made a difference.

I also need to thank Ed Watson, Jim Rivard, and Mary Hennessy. All three have given so much of their time to overseeing some large capital and repair projects in my absence. All three along with others from our finance council including particularly Bonnie Lipinski, worked on the upgrading and updating of all 7 bathrooms for the Sisters in the Convent, the Parish office powder room, and all 4 bathrooms in the Rectory. This was a large project funded with Catholic Strong money that took weeks to complete. They also were involved in the water pipe repair which affected all the Church bathrooms and the 1st floor Rectory Guest room and bathroom. This work included total cleaning and sanitizing done by a professional company that works in that field, new flooring installed in affected hallways and rooms, and new painting. We also had to dig outside to raise a pipe joint to enable clearing out blockages, and subsequent repaving of a 5 x 5 area with new concrete.

The team also oversaw the new concrete work done on the paver that leads into our property; replacement was needed due to large cracks and holes in the paver as you entered the property. I cannot thank the Finance Council enough for all their work, dedication, and love of our parish.

Finally, I want to give a big thank you to Father Terry, as he stepped in during my leave as Administrator of the Parish. The Diocese called Father Terry out of retirement for this 5 month + task. He did an wonderful job of shepherding the flock as well as an incredible job of administration. Fr. Terry, please know you will always be a member of our community. May God bless you for your dedicated work to us and our entire Diocese. We are fortunate and blessed to have you. I would be remiss if I also did not thank Fr. Myers, Deacon Joe and Deacon Frank for pitching in during my absence in taking care of the spiritual and pastoral needs of the Parish.

Please know that I now continue in my wellness program, as my journey did not end when I left the Wellness Center, rather I must continue to forge that new path for myself. Therefore, my wellness program takes high priority. I ask that you continue to pray for me, and I will also pray for you. It is only a journey when it is done by one person. However, when it is more than one person it is an adventure. Let us adventure together, towards the mountain of God, so that our steps may be lighter, our laughter brighter, and our faith mightier.

Volunteer Eucharistic Ministers



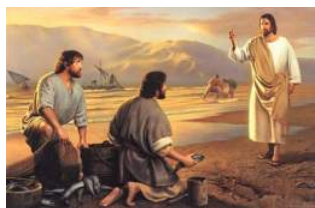

Come and See



In today's Gospel, we learn of Jesus healing a deaf man who also had a speech impediment. This man was brought to Jesus by people who begged Him to lay his hands on the man.

It is obvious that these people thought that Jesus could heal this man of his infirmities with a simple touch. How did they come to think this? How had their faith been built up to believe in this man? Had these people been following Jesus and witnessed His healing touch? Or is it possible that they had learned of Jesus and of his miracle working abilities by word of mouth, by rumor, by the crowd running ahead and announcing with much enthusiasm "Come and See"?

Jesus takes the man aside to work his miracle, and then orders the witnesses not to tell anyone. But the gospel goes on to report "the more He ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it". You see, the people were "exceedingly astonished" by this man who went about and proclaimed the Gospel of the kingdom and cured every disease among the people. It is no wonder that many were telling others "Come and See".

Is our faith in Jesus such that we want to proclaim it to others? Can we not contain our joy? Is our COL community so welcoming and vibrant that we want to share it with others? Are we sufficiently open to the Spirit working in our lives that we are bold enough to say to those we meet "Come and See"?

If you would like to deepen your faith or refresh your understanding of the Good News, there is an upcoming program at COL for both the faith-filled and the faithless. It is called **Alpha** and starts September 12th. Why not Come and See?

Better yet, run ahead of the crowd and invite friends and neighbors, even outsiders, to Come and See, to participate in Alpha and to worship at Christ Our Light. Together, we might end up exceedingly astonished!

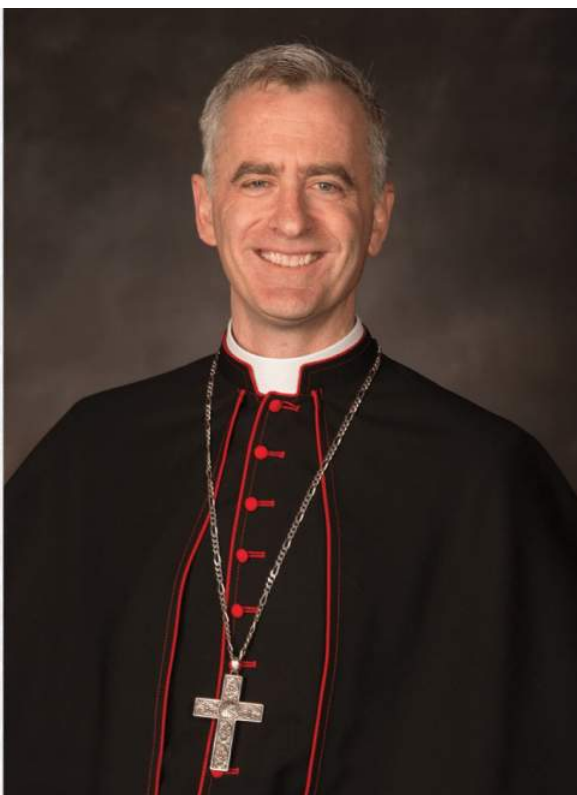

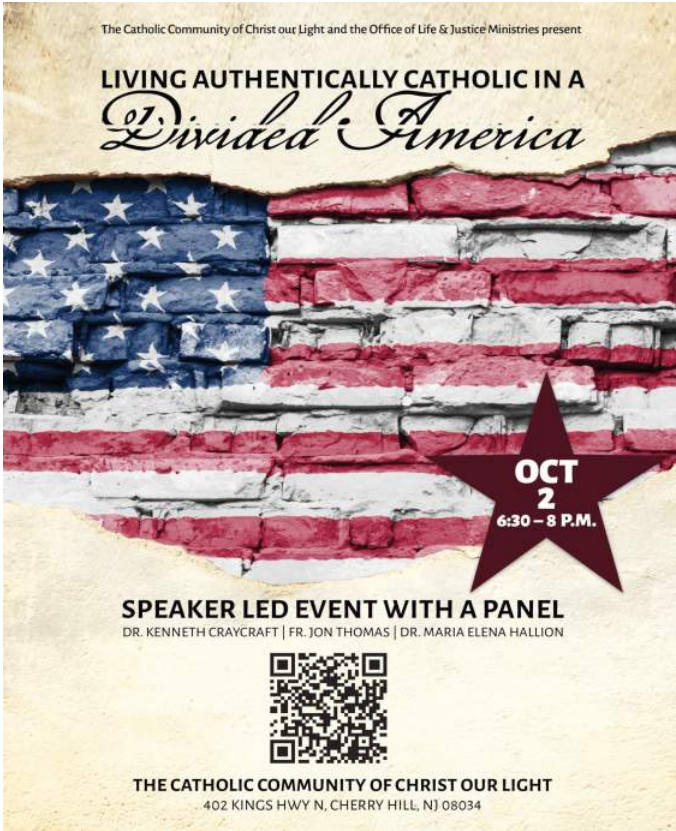

Season of Creation



Donation Collection

During the Season of Creation (September 1 through October 4, the Feast of St. Francis) the Care for Creation team will be collecting donations for the Animal Welfare Association (AWA). AWA is South Jersey's oldest and largest no kill animal shelter. We will have a collection box in the Gathering Space during September and October. The shelter can use both used and new items for their animals.

Many items you have in your home can be repurposed for the animals such as clean towels, wash cloths, flat sheets, light weight blankets (NO COMFORTERS). Other items that can be recycled include shower curtain rings, paper bags, socks, golf, whiffle and ping-pong balls, pill bottles (clean and labels removed), craft pom-pom balls, unused straws, and containers with shaker tops. AWA will also accept any cat/dog food (even if previously opened) in its original bag.

New items are also welcome. (Please check out their wish lists online for Amazon and Chewy.) Food items: tuna fish, salmon, dry dog/cat food, cans of dog/cat food, peanut butter, spray cheese, bacon bits. Other: Non-clumping clay cat litter. Dog toys: Kong, rope, plush, nylabones. Cat toys: crinkle pom-poms, catnip, scratching boards. Medical Supplies: pill pockets for dogs and cats; E-collars – soft/fabric, inflatable (NO PLASTIC CONES). In addition, AWA would appreciate any time you could provide as a volunteer. You can check out their website for details. However, the best way to help would be to consider adopting a dog or cat!

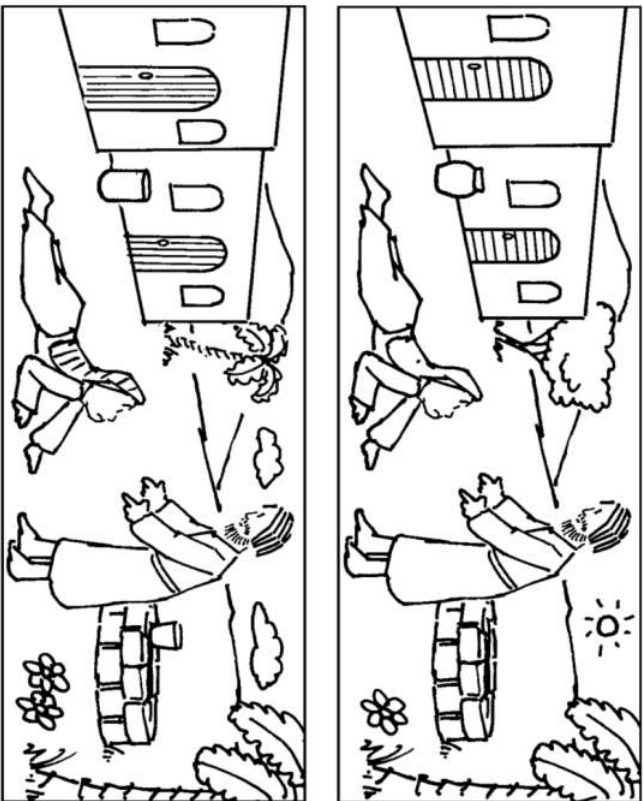

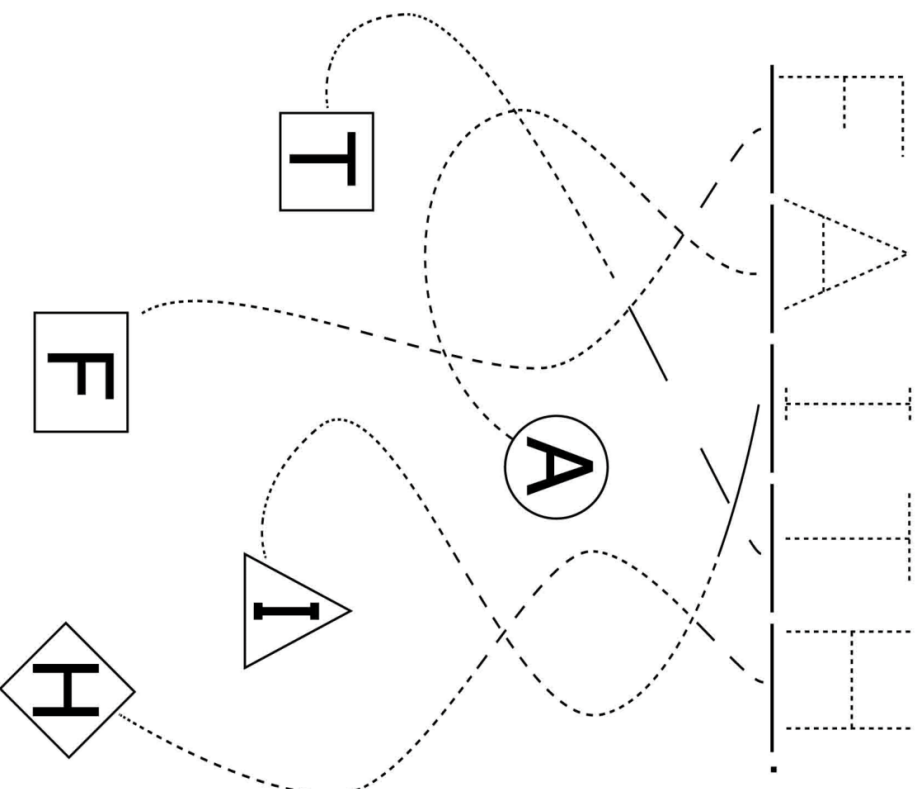

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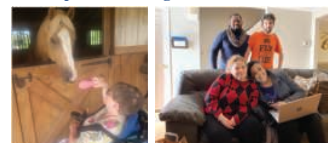
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
