Come and See

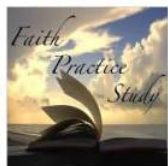


Jesus' question to his disciples in today's Gospel is relevant for Christians in any age: "But who do you say that I am?"

Who is Jesus *really*? Was he, as our Jewish and Muslim sisters and brothers believe, an important prophet? Is he an inspirational historical figure whose teachings and example we choose to follow only when convenient? Is he truly divine but also distant, a person whose humanity isn't relatable to our daily experiences? Or, do we really believe in the fullness of who Jesus Christ was and is: both human and divine whose death brought salvation to the whole world AND who strives to know us intimately today? Hearing Jesus ask his disciples to reflect on their understanding of him is an invitation for us to revisit the same question, and to take stock of how our beliefs are reflected in our relationship with God and the people we encounter.

As Jesus goes on to teach his disciples about his identity and mission, he becomes difficult for them to comprehend. He even "rebuked" Peter for thinking with a mindset that is limited by human knowledge and expectations, which are too small to contain God's grand plan for humanity. Unlike the disciples in the Gospel, we know that what Jesus predicts will come true: he will die and rise, and the path of discipleship for Christians is challenging, even costing some of them their lives. But the invitation to them and to us remains the same: to trust that God's plan for us is more than we can comprehend, and to say yes to the invitation to grow in knowledge and in relationship with the God who created us, who died for us, and whose Spirit accompanies us daily.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) will resume on September 22nd at the 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Masses.

The purpose of this special Liturgy is twofold:

- To provide a quality liturgical experience
- To facilitate the proclamation and breaking open of Scripture with the children

What is Children's Liturgy of the Word?

- CLOW is a part of the Mass
- The Church encourages a separate liturgy to allow the children to participate and understand
- Appropriate for children between the ages of 5 and 12
- All are welcome – No registration is necessary
- We meet in the church and the children remain with the assembly and their parents for the opening of Mass
- The children are dismissed by the celebrant after the Opening Prayer.
-

Gather the Children

- The children form two groups: second grade and younger; third grade and older
- They are led to rooms in the Ministry Center of the church
- A candle is lit to remind the children of the presence of the Lord; they are reminded that they are still at Mass.
- A Reading, Responsorial Psalm, and Gospel are read.
- An interactive sharing follows: the children discuss what they heard; what the readings mean to them; practical ways they can incorporate what they heard into their everyday lives.
- The children return to the assembly after the Offertory Procession



VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED

- Adults and teens are needed to proclaim and share the Word of God
- Requirements: enthusiasm and the willingness to share your faith with the children of Christ Our Light Parish
- Scheduling is approximately once a month
- All materials are provided and emailed and mailed home the week before you are scheduled
- Facilitators do not have to come up with ideas – just present them and, most of all, let the

children LEAD you.

- Feel free to come back with the children during a CLOW session to observe
- Facilitators have commented that they learn so much from the children
- As one child said, "CLOW helps me understand; I don't understand all those big words."

*"Recovery is for everyone:
Every Person. Every Family.

National Recovery Month is sponsored by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), the Association for Addiction Professionals (NAADAC), and the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM). The number one guiding principle is HOPE! Hope, the belief that addiction challenges and conditions can be overcome, is the foundation of recovery. A person's recovery is built on his or her strengths, talents, coping abilities, resources, and inherent values. It is holistic, addresses the whole person and their community, and is supported by peers, friends, family members, and most importantly, our Catholic Church Community.

The process of recovery is highly personal and occurs via many pathways. It may include clinical treatment, medications, faith-based approaches, peer support, family support, self-care, and other approaches. Recovery is characterized by continual growth and improvement in one's health and wellness and managing setbacks. Because setbacks are a natural part of life, resilience becomes a key component of recovery. Recovery programs all over the country raise awareness about addiction treatment and share the positive stories of transformed lives. As a result, the general public has a greater understanding of the importance of getting help for substance use disorders and addiction.

Season of Creation



Donation Collection

During the Season of Creation (September 1 through October 4, the Feast of St. Francis) the Care for Creation team will be collecting donations for

the Animal Welfare Association (AWA). AWA is South Jersey's oldest and largest no kill animal shelter. We will have a collection box in the Gathering Space during September and October. The shelter can use both used and new items for their animals.

Many items you have in your home can be repurposed for the animals such as clean towels, wash cloths, flat sheets, light weight blankets (NO COMFORTERS). Other items that can be recycled include shower curtain rings, paper bags, socks, golf, whiffle and ping-pong balls, pill bottles (clean and labels removed), craft pom-pom balls, unused straws, and containers with shaker tops. AWA will also accept any cat/dog food (even if previously opened) in its original bag.

New items are also welcome. (Please check out their wish lists online for Amazon and Chewy.) Food items: tuna fish, salmon, dry dog/cat food, cans of dog/cat food, peanut butter, spray cheese, bacon bits. Other: Non-clumping clay cat litter. Dog toys: Kong, rope, plush, nylabones. Cat toys: crinkle pom-poms, catnip, scratching boards. Medical Supplies: pill pockets for dogs and cats; E-collars – soft/fabric, inflatable (NO PLASTIC CONES). In addition, AWA would appreciate any time you could provide as a volunteer. You can check out their website for details. However, the best way to help would be to consider adopting a dog or cat!
