Reading for September 29, 2024

Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

Adults:

How can you keep jealousy, selfishness, and greed from taking root in your life?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

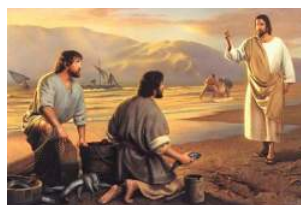

"Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets."
Numbers 11:29

A prophet boldly speaks the truth even when that truth is unpleasant or difficult to hear. The prophetic voices of Sacred Scripture are grounded in and swell from the love of God for his people. So too are we called in our daily living to boldly speak the truth with love, drawing others gently and lovingly closer to God.

In this Sunday's First Reading, Moses defends Eldad and Medad's prophetic work when Joshua tries to stop them from prophesying in the camp. Unexpectedly, the spirit of the Lord had come to rest on Eldad and Medad as well as the seventy elders present. Did Joshua think Eldad and Medad were incapable or unworthy? Moses' reply to Joshua—"Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets"—speaks a vision of hope and a striking confidence in all God's people. In today's Gospel, when John seeks to prevent someone from driving out demons in Jesus' name, the response of Jesus evokes a similar sense of openness and trust: "Whoever is not against us is for us" (Mark 9:40).

Oftentimes we find the truth—and the spirit of the Lord—where we least expect it. How is God calling you to speak the truth today? By challenging assumptions or stereotypes? By guiding someone back onto the right path by your words or example? Who in your life might be speaking an unexpected truth to you? Are you bold enough to listen, and to respond with love?

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) will resume on September 22nd at the 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Masses.

The purpose of this special Liturgy is twofold:

- To provide a quality liturgical experience
- To facilitate the proclamation and breaking open of Scripture with the children

What is Children's Liturgy of the Word?

- CLOW is a part of the Mass
- The Church encourages a separate liturgy to allow the children to participate and understand
- Appropriate for children between the ages of 5 and 12
- All are welcome – No registration is necessary
- We meet in the church and the children remain with the assembly and their parents for the opening of Mass
- The children are dismissed by the celebrant after the Opening Prayer.
-

Gather the Children

- The children form two groups: second grade and younger; third grade and older
- They are led to rooms in the Ministry Center of the church
- A candle is lit to remind the children of the presence of the Lord; they are reminded that they are still at Mass.
- A Reading, Responsorial Psalm, and Gospel are read.
- An interactive sharing follows: the children discuss what they heard; what the readings mean to them; practical ways they can incorporate what they heard into their everyday lives.
- The children return to the assembly after the Offertory Procession



VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED

- Adults and teens are needed to proclaim and share the Word of God
- Requirements: enthusiasm and the willingness to share your faith with the children of Christ Our Light Parish
- Scheduling is approximately once a month
- All materials are provided and emailed and mailed home the week before you are scheduled
- Facilitators do not have to come up with ideas – just present them and, most of all, let the

children LEAD you.

- Feel free to come back with the children during a CLOW session to observe
- Facilitators have commented that they learn so much from the children
- As one child said, "CLOW helps me understand; I don't understand all those big words."

Season of Creation



Donation Collection - During the Season of Creation (September 1 through October 4, the Feast of St. Francis) the Care for Creation team will be collecting donations for the Animal Welfare Association (AWA). AWA is South Jersey's oldest and largest no kill animal shelter. We will have a collection box in the Gathering Space during September and October. The shelter can use both used and new items for their animals.

Many items you have in your home can be repurposed for the animals such as clean towels, wash cloths, flat sheets, light weight blankets (NO COMFORTERS). Other items that can be recycled include shower curtain rings, paper bags, socks, golf, whiffle and ping-pong balls, pill bottles (clean and labels removed), craft pom-pom balls, unused straws, and containers with shaker tops. AWA will also accept any cat/dog food (even if previously opened) in its original bag.

New items are also welcome. (Please check out their wish lists online for Amazon and Chewy.) Food items: tuna fish, salmon, dry dog/cat food, cans of dog/cat food, peanut butter, spray cheese, bacon bits. Other: Non-clumping clay cat litter. Dog toys: Kong, rope, plush, nylabones. Cat toys: crinkle pom-poms, catnip, scratching boards. Medical Supplies: pill pockets for dogs and cats; E-collars – soft/fabric, inflatable (NO PLASTIC CONES). In addition, AWA would appreciate any time you could provide as a volunteer. You can check out their website for details. However, the best way to help would be to consider adopting a dog or cat!

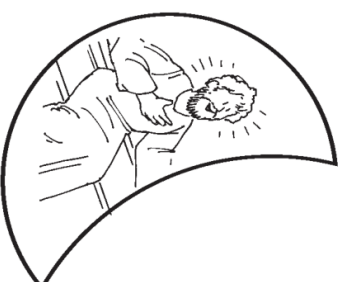
