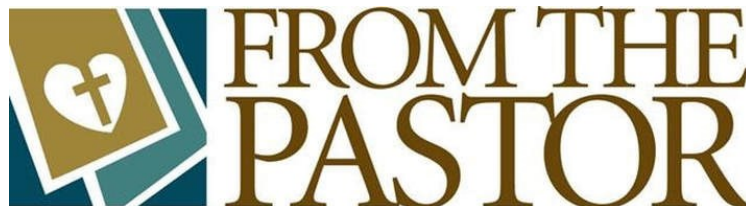

From the Pastor

My dear brothers and sisters,

I just wanted to update you on the status of our Pastoral Council \ Vision 2024. This past Wednesday, Oct. 16th, the Pastoral Council came to a formal close, as did the four Pathway Teams which were extensions of the Pastoral Council. This committed and service-oriented team has served our parish well and we will now look forward to 2025 with great hope and what the Father wants for the Catholic Community of Christ our Light.



It was a decision based on much discernment, reflection and prayer, discussions with my brother clergy, the executive team members of the Council, our trustees, and with Diocesan personnel in charge of Pastoral Ministry.

I believe this is a new time for our parish to deeply discern and reflect on what God's vision is for this faithful community, and this will include a new Pastoral Council. I am hoping that after the feast of the Epiphany, January 6th, 2025, to share a more detailed plan. Some ideas include having prayer and discernment evenings, small faith sharing gatherings, listening sessions with Q and A with as many parishioners as possible to get a clearer and fuller understanding of our path together.

The Pastoral Council functions as an advisory board to the Pastor, so the hope is to establish a new council. This will also be an opportunity for others to discern if they are called to serve in this capacity. Each person has gifts and talents and my hope is that all may have an opportunity to contribute to a vibrant, holy and thriving community.

I believe as we all go through this time of discernment, reflection and prayer, we will discover what God wants along with a new council. The council – as best as possible - will reflect the diversity of our parish because everyone is here... the young and the 'seasoned', our wise elders, as well as folks from different national backgrounds. We know this also includes Catholics who are progressive as well as traditional or anywhere in between. We desire all to find a home here with us.

I wanted to take this time to express my gratitude and recognize the contributions of those who have served on the Pastoral Council. Luisa Foster – Pastoral Council Chair, George Sundell – Pastoral Council Co-Chair, Jeanne Sundberg – Pastoral Council Secretary, Deb Celhar, Janet George, Carla Clarke, Amelia Conte, Susan Schaming, Margee McGill, Deacon Joe Seaman, Carolyn Taylor, and Barbara Long. I also thank all previous members whose terms recently ended. Each loves our parish and have given so much of themselves to serve as volunteers to this Council.

I ask that you keep me, Father Myers, Deacon Joe and Deacon Frank in prayer as we will be meeting regularly to discuss planning meetings, sessions and prayer nights with our parishioners. I will also continue meeting with Mrs. Donna Ottaviano-Britt (Secretariat for Pastoral Outreach, and leader of the Discipleship and Leadership office) of our Diocese for any assistance and guidance she can offer us.

Once again, I thank you all as we enter into this time of renewal. The season of Fall reminds us that much of nature begins to go to sleep especially as Winter approaches, however, with Spring, nature begins to awaken and is renewed. I know this will be true for us as well. What will bud forth will be something new, but also something old, for as the Church grows, it keeps its foundation, but it also develops, as Jesus said, "a wise scribe knows how to bring forth both the old and the new."

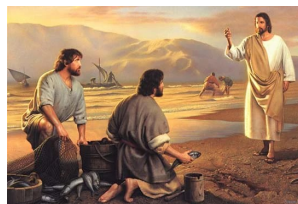

Come and See



The beginning of today's second reading is like the opening of a superhero epic, the start of a cinematic adventure or the introduction to a graphic novel. It is that, in fact, and yet much more. Come and see my superhero.

We do have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens and he is Jesus who is the Son of God. Mark, today's evangelist, admonishes us to "hold fast to our confession". What exactly are we confessing? That we believe Jesus is the Son of God and that he became Man, a human like you and me. He is true God and true Man, a mystery for us to cling to.

Yes, He became like us, here on earth, and was "tested in every way, yet without sin". We want to ask, in every way, really? If we add "of course he did not sin, He was/is God, then we miss the point. He is/was also a human. How did He resist testing in every way? I think as a man he rested on the love of his Father. We also see examples of this when he is tempted in the desert. This is our superhero as obedient Son and God.

And because He was tempted and tested in every way, He is able to sympathize with our weaknesses, here and now in our own lives. He not only knows what we go through, he went through it too. Jesus has empathy and understanding of our thoughts and deeds and omissions that distance us from Him. Remember, He was like us.

Because he became this Man-God, we can confidently approach the throne of grace, ... the Throne of Grace! Can you allow yourself this luxury? What greater gift could our superhero give us? We can enter the throne room and receive mercy! Mercy is when God, out of His lovingkindness, withholds punishment that we rightfully deserve because of our sin. Yes, I'll accept that. We can also enter the throne room to find grace for timely help. Not just mercy after the fact, but real and timely help during temptation and weakness. Can we confess and believe all this?

My superhero epic ends with me holding fast to my confession. I do believe, heal my unbelief.

Chair Yoga

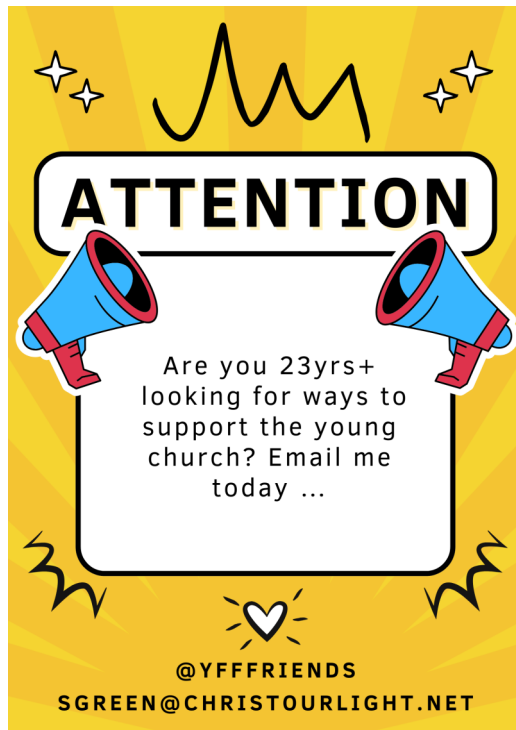


This practice links the movement of the breath with gentler yoga postures. De-stress while you stretch, strengthen, and breathe from the comfort of your chair.
