- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God’s presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God’s presence and be still, surrounded by God’s love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God’s nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

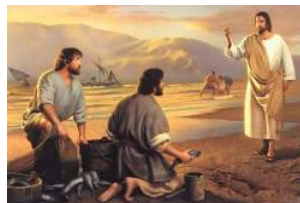
New Director of Worship & Music

Come and See



The first reading today features the *Shema*, a prayer that is at the center of Jewish identity and faith. It is so important that it is prayed at morning and evening services, on high holy

days, and even as the last words uttered by a Jewish person before death. The *Shema* is so sacred because it speaks precisely to the heart of both the Jewish and Christian faith: there is only one God who deserves our praise and fidelity. In the second reading, we are reminded that Jesus transcended the Jewish law with his self-sacrificial offering motivated by love. Then the Gospel brings both of these ideas together, reminding us that we love and serve one God but we do so by serving others.

In the same way that our Jewish sisters and brothers pray the *Shema* daily to remain focused on God, how do we as Catholics choose to remind ourselves of the many ways God sustains and guides us? And how can we evaluate how effectively we are reflecting God’s love to others? If you’re looking for an idea, I recommend the *Examen*, a method of prayer developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola which is a meditation on your daily activities and emotions. The *Examen* invites you to acknowledge both what you’re grateful for and how you may have fallen short in living as a disciple of Jesus. Many variations of this prayer have been developed, but the point is that this is just one way to create a practice of prayerfully reflecting on who we are as Christians and what we’re called to be.

Chair Yoga

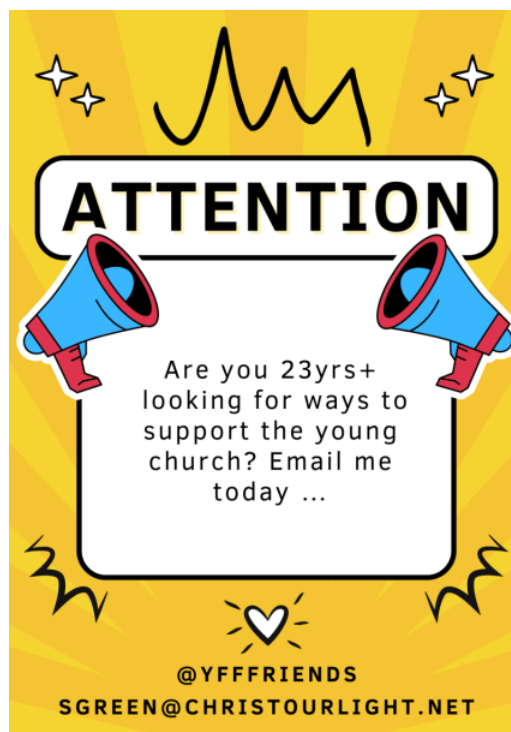


This practice links the movement of the breath with gentler yoga postures. De-stress while you stretch, strengthen, and breathe from the comfort of your chair.

Celebrating our 15th Annual Mitzvah Day of Service



Who served?

- We had 101 participants who completed projects at home, at Christ Our Light, or out in the local community.
- In addition to that number, we are grateful for the 161 volunteers that served as a part of a group such as the Resurrection Catholic School 6th, 7th, and 8th grade religion classes, RCS Girl Scout Troop 30311, COL Boy Scout Troop 70, the COL 1st grade EFF class, and the Servus Dei prayer group.
- We had 38 blood donors at our Blood Drive.

Where did they serve?

- We had teams serving out in the community at United Methodist Communities, Palmyra Cove, Saddler's Woods, Good Counsel Home, Ronald McDonald House, Joseph's House, Cathedral Kitchen, the Cherry Hill Food Bank, and Kids Alley.
- Parishioners gathered at home and in the Parish Center to make sandwiches for Joseph's House, Cathedral Kitchen, and St. Bart's in Camden.
- Volunteers decorated placemats, assembled hundreds of utensil packets, and donated winter clothing to unhoused individuals at several local shelters. We also collected and sorted donated goods for the Animal Welfare Association in Voorhees and created crafts for four local nursing homes where we serve Catholic residents. 65 handbags were filled with personal toiletries to donate to residents at local women's shelters such as Volunteers of America.
- We also thank the many parishioners who donated gift cards and other items for those in need to support all of these projects.

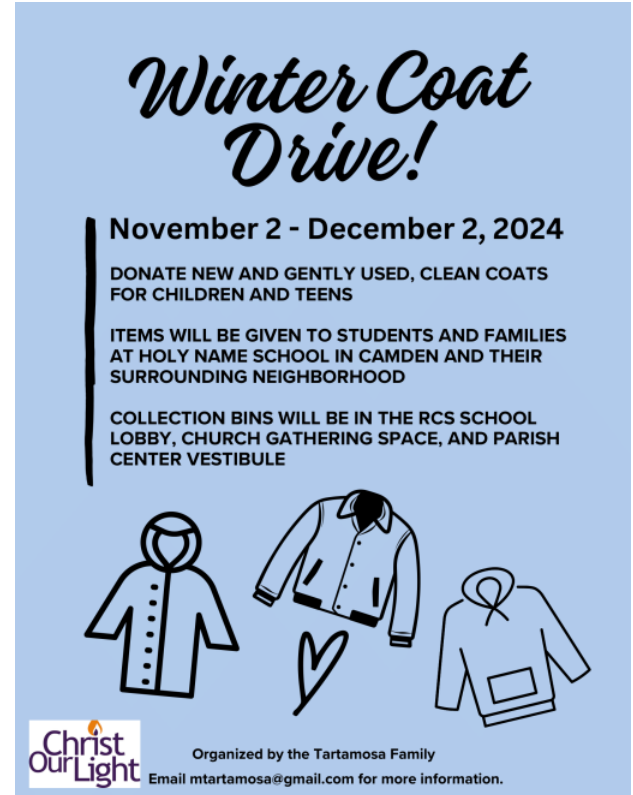

Donation Guidelines

Guidelines for Donating Items

If you are looking for a place to donate unwanted household items, please call the Parish Office for suggestions.



Please do not drop off unsolicited donations of books, clothing, medical supplies, cookware, appliances, clothing, etc. in the Church or Parish Center unless the donation is labeled for a specific recipient or is intended for a parish-coordinated donation drive. We thank you for your support!

Donations Accepted Year-Round:

- The COL Food Pantry always needs staples like toilet paper, laundry detergent, soup, tuna, canned dinners (like Chef Boyardee), peanut butter, jelly, canned vegetables, rice, beans, cereal, etc. We can only accept nonperishable goods since we do not have a pantry refrigerator.
- Sr. Mary Berryman of the SSJ Neighborhood Center collects red, white, or black beans (in bags or cans) and toilet paper in the Gathering Space monthly (see bulletin for dates) as well as baby diapers, wipes, toys, and larger men's t-shirts in the Parish Office.
- Sr. Helen Cole of Guadalupe Family Services collects baby diapers and wipes in the Parish Office.
- Joseph's House volunteers collect frozen homemade casseroles monthly in the Servers' Room freezer. They also collect coffee, tea, sugar, creamer, snacks and baked goods, bottled water and other drinks, men's and women's clothing, new socks and underwear, toiletries, backpacks, luggage, blankets, and towels on the table in the Servers' Room.
- Helping God's Precious Infants (a local pro-life ministry) collects used sneakers in a bin outside of the Ministry Center Conference Room.
- Clothing that is too worn to be donated can go in the blue bin for textile recycling in the parking lot close to the main entrance.

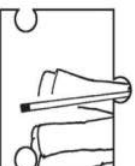
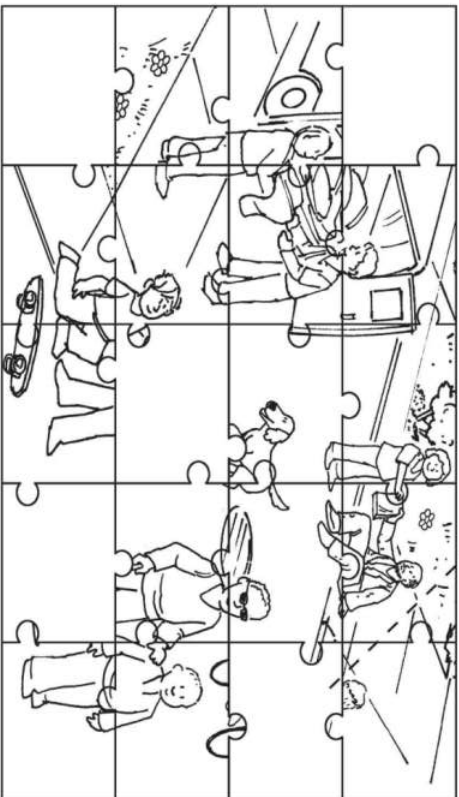

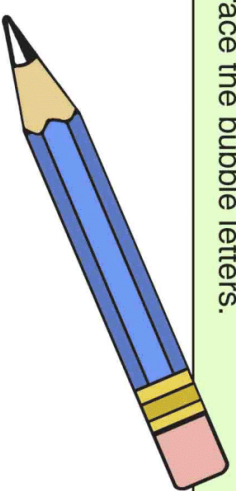
