The Liturgical/Environment Ministry is looking for some help this Advent/Christmas season.

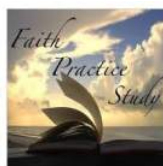

Come and See



Young men frequently approach me as a priest, saying they think they might be called to the priesthood. They often say, "Father, I think I am called, but I also want to get married and have children." That is a perfectly reasonable

perspective. However, after three years of discernment without spending time in seminary, I often responded to them by saying there was no burning bush. Usually, we want God to reveal every detail of His plans for us. One of my favorite saints, Therese of Lisieux, speaks of a story during her childhood when one of her older sisters offered her one doll from a basket of dolls. Therese responded by saying, "I choose all." She wanted to go all in. This experience was a symbol of the experience she wanted to have in her relationship with God. The way we do this is to experience God's mercy in our lives.

How does this work? We all experience hurt and disappointment. Perhaps we hesitate to adopt mercy in our lives. It is a brutal world, survival of the fittest; whoever comes out on top is the winner. Can we live our lives this way without becoming bitter and angry? But perhaps we might say we are Atheists and Rationalists, and we don't believe in God. Even an Atheist experiences hurt, so how do they deal with hurt? Can they understand mercy and forgiveness through their Atheism? Even Atheists want to go beyond themselves, to achieve beyond their hopes and dreams. That sense of transcendence is common to all, and we sometimes view it through our cultural heroes, such as our sports figures.

When we teach our kids, we reward them when they show heroic virtue. That is the sense of the divine in all of us. Thus, we can know that some deity exists. If we define that deity as someone all-powerful, all-knowing, and all-loving, and we are not, we know through our intuition and Scripture that He is merciful. If a Higher Power with those characteristics gives us mercy, we should be merciful also. But then we might say, "That is difficult; I am afraid to be merciful because I am afraid I will be hurt." So, what do we do? We shift our focus and give that hurt meaning. Perhaps God is allowing me to feel that hurt, so I don't recognize my most crucial relationship is with Him, and everything else falls from there. We only get that sense of unconditional love from Him. That is what we tell ourselves when we suffer. We are merciful to others because God allows us to experience unconditional love in our relationship with Him, and through that relationship, we can be merciful to others. Our faith tells us that God loves us unconditionally, even though we screw up all the time. That makes it easier to experience unconditional love like Therese of Lisieux, and the saints experience it.

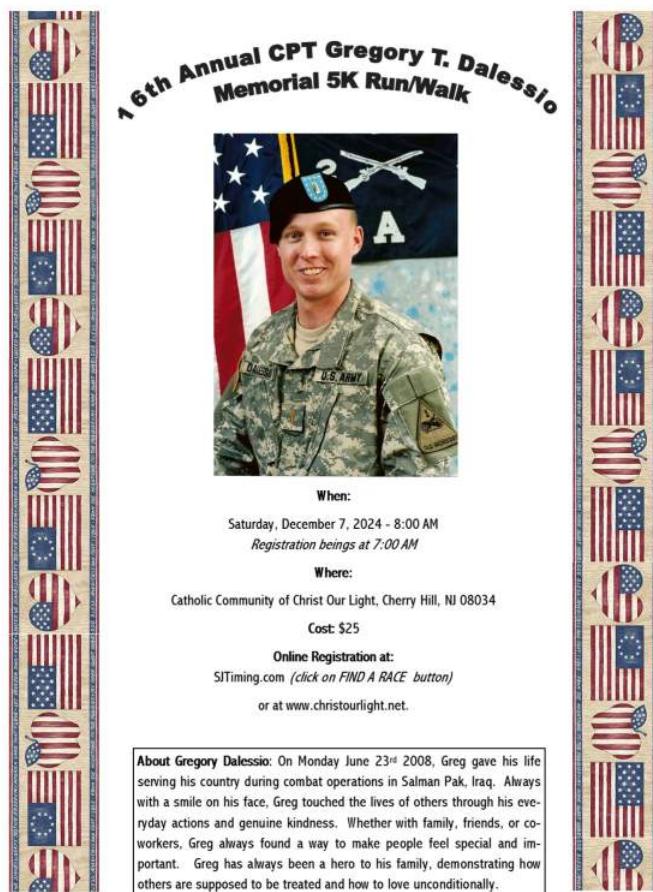

Trex Challenge



Christ Our Light has been collecting plastic bags for Trex for over a year. We are thankful for your continued support. We have helped St. Thomas More earn a bench will begin sup-

porting three local religious groups in the upcoming weeks!

Several parishioners have been asking questions about exactly what plastic Trex can use, here is a reminder. Please review the items that Trex accepts for recycling. The poster on top of the Trex collection box provides this information along with frequently asked questions.

Hard plastics such as water bottles and hard plastic containers are NOT accepted.

Accepted forms of plastic by Trex: Bubble wrap (pop bubbles), grocery bags, (all colors), case overwrap, bread bags, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, produce bags, cereal bags, paper towel /toilet paper overwrap, Ziploc or food storage bags, ice bags (DRY – without metal clips), wood pellet bags, stretch film and pallet wrap, furniture foam wrap.

Plastic that cannot be recycled by Trex: frozen food bags, candy bar wrappers, chip and snack bags, net or mesh product bags, pet food bags, pre-washed salad mix bags, degradable/compostable bags or film packaging, six-pack rings, PPE – gloves, masks, or protective wear, bedding or linen packaging, shiny, crinkly films like floral wrap, vinyl shower curtains or tablecloths.

DON'T SEE YOUR ITEM ON THE LIST?

- **See if the package will stretch when you pull it.** If yes, it can be included.
- If it tears like paper, then please don't recycle.
- Is the package shiny or does it make a crinkly/crunchy sound in your hand? If yes, then please don't recycle.
- General reminder: all plastic must be CLEAN, DRY, AND FREE OF FOOD OR CRUMBS.

Celebrating our 15th Annual Mitzvah Day of Service



Who served?

- We had 101 participants who completed projects at home, at Christ Our Light, or out in the local community.
- In addition to that number, we are grateful for the 161 volunteers that served as a part of a group such as the Resurrection Catholic School 6th, 7th, and 8th grade religion classes, RCS Girl Scout Troop 30311, COL Boy Scout Troop 70, the COL 1st grade EFF class, and the Servus Dei prayer group.
- We had 38 blood donors at our Blood Drive.

Where did they serve?

- We had teams serving out in the community at United Methodist Communities, Palmyra Cove, Saddler's Woods, Good Counsel Home, Ronald McDonald House, Joseph's House, Cathedral Kitchen, the Cherry Hill Food Bank, and Kids Alley.
- Parishioners gathered at home and in the Parish Center to make sandwiches for Joseph's House, Cathedral Kitchen, and St. Bart's in Camden.
- Volunteers decorated placemats, assembled hundreds of utensil packets, and donated winter clothing to unhoused individuals at several local shelters. We also collected and sorted donated goods for the Animal Welfare Association in Voorhees and created crafts for four local nursing homes where we serve Catholic residents. 65 handbags were filled with personal toiletries to donate to residents at local women's shelters such as Volunteers of America.
- We also thank the many parishioners who donated gift cards and other items for those in need to support all of these projects.
