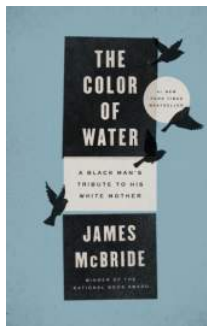


The Liturgical/Environment Ministry is looking for some help this Advent/Christmas season.

The Word

Reading for November 17, 2024
Mark 13:24-32

Adults:

What would you be doing differently in your life if you truly believed you would meet Christ soon?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Youth:

Children:

What would you do for others today if you thought you would not have another chance to do it?

Come and See



"And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory...." Mark 13:24-32

Mark's reading always makes me think of Michelangelo's fresco, Last Judgement, on the Sistine Chapel altar wall in the Vatican City. If you have not had the opportunity to visit the Vatican, I strongly encourage you to search the Internet for images of the fresco. Michelangelo's masterpiece depicts the end of time when Christ's faithful will enter the heavenly kingdom and the damned are cast into hell. The fresco shows that time has passed and it is too late any interventions on our behalf.

The following excerpt from the Nicene Creed succinctly states what will happen "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end".

Mark's reading is often called The Little Apocalypse. The word apocalypse means unveiling or revelation. However, Christ's words hold out hope to the faithful who are suffering now but will receive a Godly reward in the end. Jesus places an emphasis on faithful discipleship during terrible events and trying times. He is calling us to endure and yet be watchful.

Staying awake has to do with spiritual wakefulness and preparing for Christ's second coming. Examples of what we need to do to maintain spiritual wakefulness include:

- Striving to do God's will
- Adopt the attitude and behavior of a servant
- Help those in need
- Practice forgiveness
- Encourage others to learn more about Christ

Jesus is providing a warning about what will happen in the future. He is also providing us with some time for the faithful to prepare to enter eternal life by saying "Come and See".

Family Care Giver Month

National Family Caregivers Month was created to recognize, honor, and raise awareness of family caregivers. According to the National Council on Aging, there are more than 53 million unpaid family members providing care for individuals with health conditions or disabilities. The economic value of this care is estimated to be in excess of \$470 billion.

Various support programs are available to support family members is providing care for an ill or disabled loved one:

- 211 - Confidential multi-lingual service to help connect NJ residents to social services
- Aging and Disability Resource Connection of NJ 877-222-3737 - Assist seniors and care givers in finding NJ based services (both privately and publicly funded)
- Caregivers of NJ (800-372-6510) - This service offers generalized resources for caregivers including advocacy service, references for training, and respite care references.

Caregiving can be stressful and have impacts on work-life balance, rest, physical wellness, and emotional wellness. Resources are available for caregivers as well:

- Care 2 Caregivers (800-424-2494) - Confidential helpline for anyone who has concerns about caring for someone with memory issues.
- Greater NJ Alzheimer's Association (800-272-3900) - Resources include consultations, support groups, education, connection to respite care and community resources.

Christmas Programs for Families in Need



We are already preparing several programs to assist families in need this Advent and Christmas season:



- The parish Elementary Faith Formation program coordinates a toy drive benefiting **Sacred Heart Church in Camden's Annual Christmas Toy Store**. This program invites qualified families to shop for Christmas presents at greatly reduced prices for children 12 years and under. Our drive will run from **November 25-December 6**. All toy donations must be new and unwrapped. Children can bring the donations with them to EFF class or parishioners can drop them off in the Parish Center vestibule.
 - Suggested gift donations over \$15 include: sports equipment (footballs, basketballs, Nerf balls/no blasters), dolls (African American and Hispanic), doll accessories (houses, strollers, etc.), Lego sets, games (Connect 4, Operation, Trouble, Memory, Scrabble Jr, etc.), Playskool and Fisher Price toys, and Minecraft.
 - Please do NOT donate the following items: stuffed animals, puzzles, coloring books, crayons, Play-Doh, clay, any sports items for soccer, hockey, and tennis, and games such as CandyLand, Chutes & Ladders, and Yahtzee.
 - **The Giving Tree** provides gifts to families served by Guadalupe Family Services in Camden. The tree will stand in the Gathering Space Alcove during Advent beginning the evening of Saturday, November 30. If you would like to participate, please take a tag, purchase the requested item, and return the gift to the tree **by Monday, December 16**. Gifts should be returned unwrapped with the tag attached to it, though a gift bag or wrapping paper with tape is much appreciated.
- The "Adopt-a-Family" Christmas gift program invites parishioners to sponsor a local family in need. Last year we were able to help close to 60 families with physical gifts and gift cards. There are several ways to be a part of the Adopt-a-Family program: you may choose to buy physical gifts for a specific family, donate gift cards for a specific family so the parents can shop for their children, or you can donate gift cards/checks to a general program fund for parish staff to disburse among our program recipients. Technology and Innovation:
