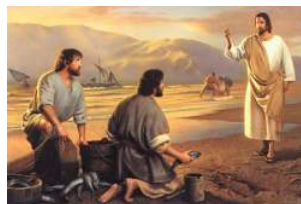

Come and See



Rejoice in the Lord always! I say it again: rejoice!

This Third Sunday of Advent is known as *Gaudete Sunday*, which is from the Latin word

meaning *rejoice*. In our second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians, we hear St. Paul telling us to rejoice. This is a day to celebrate the joy and hope of the Advent season. Our liturgical color changes from purple to rose to signify this emphasis.

The prophet Zephaniah also beckons us to shout for joy and sing joyfully because the Lord is coming to save us. Our salvation is rooted in God's selfless love - as seen from a stable in Bethlehem to a cross outside Jerusalem decades later. Jesus shared God's love, mercy and forgiveness with everyone - including the poor and marginalized. His was a life of love-filled service.

In our Gospel, John the Baptist calls people to prepare themselves for the coming Messiah by changing their lives in very specific ways. We need to live morally and engage in corporal works of mercy. We need to be like Jesus. And when we do, we will experience joy. Does this sound like a strange yet intriguing recipe for joy? *Come and See*... donate to the Toy Store for Sacred Heart in Camden, participate in our Giving Tree or Adopt a Family Programs, offer our time and/or money to support the Cherry Hill Food Pantry, feed those in need through our Sandwich Making Ministry, make a casserole for Joseph's House...or simply spend time with someone who is alone, ill, or in need of support.

Charitable Giving

Year-End Charitable Giving via a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)



If you are looking to lower your taxable income, you may want to consider a QCD. If you are age 70½ or older, IRS rules require you to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. This additional taxable income may push you into a higher tax bracket and may also reduce your eligibility for certain tax credits and deductions. To eliminate or reduce the impact of RMD income, charitably inclined investors may want to consider making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD).

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from an IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity, as described in the QCD provision in the Internal Revenue Code. Amounts distributed as a QCD can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, up to \$100,000, and can also be excluded from your taxable income. This is not the case with a regular withdrawal from an IRA, even if you use the money to make a charitable contribution later on. In this scenario, the funds would be counted as taxable income even if you later offset that income with the charitable contribution deduction.

Please consult a tax advisor to learn more. If you are 70½ or older, own an IRA, and donate to charity, QCDs may make sense for you; consult a tax advisor regarding your specific situation.

Sexual abuse is a crime that must be reported, investigated and responded to so that victims are protected and those who commit abuse are removed from ministry. Water Conservation

10 SIMPLE STEPS TO SAVE WATER THIS FALL



Reduce usage by 65% and use a commercial car wash instead of washing your car at home.

1



Install low-flow showerheads, faucets and toilets.

6



Postpone water intensive yard work, like reseeding your lawn, until conditions improve.

2



Take five-minute showers.

7



Sweep patios, driveways, and sidewalks. Never hose paved surfaces.

3



Turn off water while brushing teeth.

8



Fix leaks around your home and with your irrigation system.

4



Run your washing machine and dishwasher only when full.

9



If you are still watering your plants, lawns, gardens, they require less water in the fall, and use a rain barrel or watering can.

5



Raise lawnmower blades to at least three inches to promote deeper grass roots, which hold water better.

10
