Micah 5:1-4a

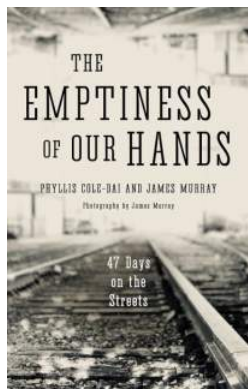

One Book - 2025



The Emptiness of Our Hands by Phyllis Cole-Dai and James Murray.

"For forty-seven days in 1999, the authors lived by choice on the streets of Columbus, Ohio, the nation's fifteenth-largest city. They went to the streets to practice presence: to offer nonjudgmental attention and compassion to everyone they met, especially the chronically

homeless, who are so often ignored, scorned, abused or shunned." They walked out their front doors and lived on the streets of Columbus in the wintertime. Can you even imagine what that was like?

Reading this book and discussing the topic of homelessness will "heighten your awareness of people who experience homelessness and strengthen your compassion for them. The book will inspire you to intentionally practice presence on a daily basis in the various settings of your life." The One Book program will kick off prior to the beginning of Lent and we will read the book over the 47 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday. There will be two discussion sessions (in person or on Zoom) followed by a morning of reflection and action later in the Spring. We encourage you to pick up a copy of the book and journey with us as we "confront what might happen to us and who we would become, if suddenly we had no home."

Charitable Giving

Year-End Charitable Giving via a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)



If you are looking to lower your taxable income, you may want to consider a QCD. If you are age 70½ or older, IRS rules require you to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. This additional taxable income may push you into a higher tax bracket and may also reduce your eligibility for certain tax credits and deductions. To eliminate or reduce the impact of RMD income, charitably inclined investors may want to consider making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD).

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from an IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity, as described in the QCD provision in the Internal Revenue Code. Amounts distributed as a QCD can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, up to \$100,000, and can also be excluded from your taxable income. This is not the case with a regular withdrawal from an IRA, even if you use the money to make a charitable contribution later on. In this scenario, the funds would be counted as taxable income even if you later offset that income with the charitable contribution deduction.

Please consult a tax advisor to learn more. If you are 70½ or older, own an IRA, and donate to charity, QCDs may make sense for you; consult a tax advisor regarding your specific situation.

Come and See



*Blessed are you who believed
that what was spoken to you by
the Lord would be fulfilled.
Luke 1:30-45*

The gospel today tells the story of the Visitation. It is a joyful and spirit filled reunion between Mary and her cousin, Elizabeth. Having learned from the angel, Gabriel, that she will give birth to the Son of God, Mary hurries to visit Elizabeth in the hill country. The spotlight shines on Mary and Elizabeth, two lowly and shamed women through whom God has chosen to begin the transformation of the world.

Both Elizabeth and her unborn child assume prophetic roles, as his leaping in the womb fulfills Gabriel's prophecy, "even before his birth he will be filled with the Holy Spirit" (Luke 1:15). Elizabeth not only prophesies but also blesses. Mary is blessed not only for her status as the mother of the Lord, but also for her trust in God's promise. Mary is blessed because despite all expectations, she will be honored rather than shamed for bearing this child. And she has also been blessed with divine joy because she has believed that God is able to do what God promises to do. Elizabeth celebrates Mary's willingness to say "yes" to God.

By greeting Mary with honor, Elizabeth overturns social expectations. Elizabeth knows from her own experience the cost of being shamed and excluded. In her culture a woman's primary purpose in life is to bear children, so as an elderly infertile wife, she had endured a lifetime of being treated as a failure. God reversed her social status. At long last, in her old age, she is an honorable married woman, pregnant with her husband's son.

Elizabeth continues the pattern of social reversal by welcoming Mary with open arms. She blessed and celebrated Mary, treating her as more honorable than herself. The pregnancy that might have brought Mary shame now brings joy and honor instead. Elizabeth practiced the same kind of inclusive love that Jesus will show to sinners. She sees beyond the shameful of Mary's situa-

tion to the reality of God's love at work even among those whom society rejects and excludes.

Elizabeth's words and actions invite us to reflect on our own openness to the ways that God chooses to act in our world. What is God doing through unexpected people in our society today? Where is God at work through people whom our neighbors and fellow church members often exclude or treat as shameful? Will we listen to the Spirit's prompting when the bearers of God's new reality show up on our doorstep?

May we like Elizabeth and Mary, trust that God is coming to save and free us. May we give thanks that God has taken away our shame and respond to God's love by welcoming the shameful. May we like them, become a community that supports each other as we hope and wait.

Advent is almost over. Soon Christ will be born! We can be like John, who while still in the womb, somehow felt the joy of being in the presence of Christ. May God's Christmas gift to us this year be the JOY that we receive which comes from a faith that appreciates God for working mercifully in our lives in ways that we can see and ways that we cannot see. No matter if we are suffering or feeling elated, we can learn to recognize Christ's presence, and feel joy. Come and See!
