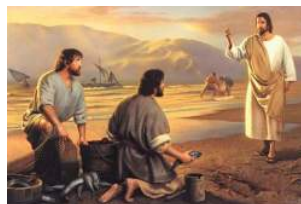

Come and See



As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. 1 Corinthians 12:12-30

In today's second reading, Paul's metaphorical use of comparing the human body to Christ illustrates that there are many parts that form a human being while relating these parts to the composition of Christ and his holy church. Each part of our body and the church demonstrates that each part (member) possesses characteristics which have common, diverse and interdependent features.

Regarding common features, all our body parts have many similar needs for items, such as, oxygen, blood flow, and nutrition, in order to function and thrive. Similarly, Catholic church members have a common bond through their baptism with the sacramental use of the same holy water. Through our baptism, the church members have a common faith and belief in Jesus.

In terms of diversity, the human body has various systems, organs, limbs, and senses. Each system has specific functions and strengths that can be very different from other parts of the body. Likewise, the church members bring diverse talents and skills that contribute to the Christian mission of our congregation. Although, the members' talents and skills are individual and different, they are important to the church's ministry and culture. We can think of these talents and skills as our spiritual gifts.

Finally, the parts of the body and the church have respective interdependence with each other. All of the various systems in the body and church have to work together in order to produce healthy functioning and good outcomes. If a part of the human body or the church begins to weaken, or is not functioning properly, there is a response in an attempt to heal and become better. The body will try to repair itself. The church will draw on its members' talents and skills in becoming more Christ-like.

If you know someone who needs or seeks spiritual healing and growth, invite them to "Come and See" to experience Jesus's welcoming to be a member of the Body of Christ.

- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

- Adults and teens are needed to proclaim and share the Word of God
- Requirements: enthusiasm and the willingness to share your faith with the children of Christ Our Light Parish
- Scheduling is approximately once a month at the facilitator's availability
- All materials are provided and mailed home the week before you are scheduled
- Facilitators do not have to come up with ideas – just present them and, most of all, let the children LEAD you.
- Feel free to come back with the children during a CLOW session to observe.
- Facilitators have commented that they learn so much from the children
- As one child said, "CLOW helps me understand; I don't understand all those big words."

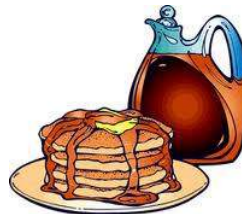

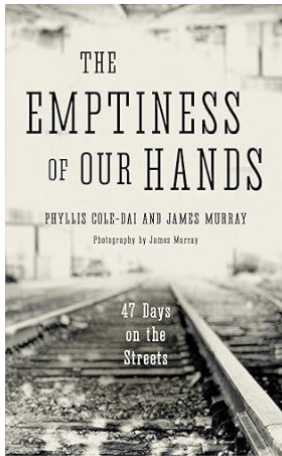
Need help with your rent? The **State Rental Assistance Program** will accept pre-applications for the rental assistance waitlist from **Monday, January 13, 2025 at**

9:00 a.m. through Friday, January 31, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. You can apply online at the NJ Department of Community Affairs website.

Applicants must be at least 18 years old (or an emancipated minor) and must be New Jersey residents to apply. 6,000 eligible households will be selected through a lottery system and placed on a waiting list to be eligible to receive vouchers as they become available.

One Book



The Justice and Outreach Commission's One Book Committee calls YOU, yes YOU! Wherever you are on your faith journey, YOU are invited to join our CoL community this Lent to grasp a deeper awareness of homelessness. We will read, reflect, and dialogue about *The Emptiness of our Hands: 47 Days on the Streets* by Phyllis Cole-Dai and James Murray. This book chronicles their lived experience, by personal choice, on the streets of Columbus, Ohio. Phyllis and James went to the streets to practice presence: *to offer nonjudgmental attention and compassion to everyone they met, especially the chronically homeless who are so often ignored, scorned, abused and shunned.* The book is a meditative daily chronicle of their lived experiences, including photographs by James constructed from trash. This book will thrust you out the door of your comfortable home straight into the unknown.

What comes to mind when you hear the term 'homelessness?' One need not travel far to encounter homelessness in our region. Perhaps you have an image of homelessness; have you ever encountered a homeless person and engaged in a conversation? Did you step on the gas pedal as the light changed at a traffic intersection versus lower your car window to see Jesus in the person?

The devastating fires in Los Angeles have left thousands homeless . . . families, faith groups, the elderly, immigrants, generations who lived in the same communities for many years, and even wealthy movie stars discover themselves homeless in a matter of minutes! All their possessions, treasures and the life they lived gone! Has watching the Los Angeles tragedy evolve altered your thoughts of homelessness? Remember that Mary, Joseph, and the infant Jesus were homeless as he was born in a stable!

I am hopeful that pondering the aforementioned may lead you to be curious. Curious about the deeper reality of homelessness and recognition that any one of us could be steps away from homelessness! A natural disaster, loss of employment/income, fire, flood, addiction, etc. could lead to homelessness. I ask you to consider God's invitation to reflect on your talents and gifts and ask yourself: 'What might I do to make a difference?' Yes, YOU: *our school families, faith formation communities, ministry leaders, parents, grandparents, staff, altar servers, cantors and choir members, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, and clergy.* Will you join us with your curiosity and openness?

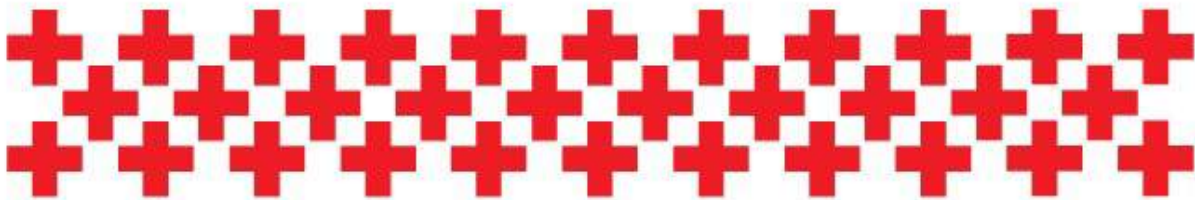
