Reading for March 9, 2025

Luke 4:1-13

Adults:

What does Jesus mean that people do not live on bread alone? What do you need to live?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

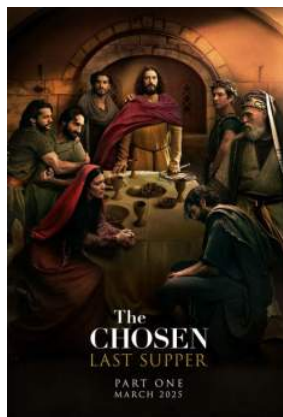

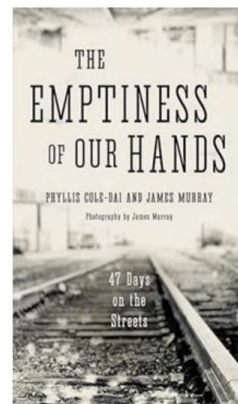
The Emptiness of our Hands: 47 Days on the Streets

We were delighted to have over 70 people sign up for our kick off event with the author, Phyllis Cole-Dai last week. She was inspiring and shared the impetus for her 47 days on the streets with the homeless in Columbus, OH: "I was trying to get at something utterly heart breaking . . ." Phyllis depicted how she aimed to be present to every person she met. We too are challenged and called to be present by keeping our minds, thoughts, and heart where we physically are. This practice enabled her to see and know the sacred in others; Jesus invites each of us to do as He did.

Two big 'takeaways' were: 1) *Don't let what we can't do prevent us from doing what we can;* 2) *As we enter into our own pain or another's, it is easier when we are not alone in our trying.*

As you enter Lent, you are invited to read the daily entries in the book to 'come and see' as you discover the sacred in yourself and others.

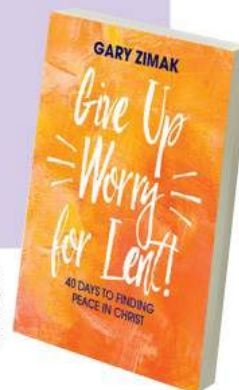

Trex Challenge



Our next Trex Challenge starts on March 1. We have 12 months to collect 1,000 lbs. We will be working on our third TREX bench. Thank all of you, your friends and relatives

who contributed plastic last year. Please continue to save plastic from our local landfills and bring it to the Trex bins that are located in the church, Parish Center entrance, and Resurrection Catholic School.

Do take a few minutes to review the items that TREX wants for recycling and what they cannot use. The poster on top of the TREX Box provides this information along with frequently asked questions.

Remember the plastic they use is not what is recycled by our townships. **Hard plastics such as water bottles and plastic are absolutely not acceptable for making TREX products.**

ITEMS ACCEPTED BY TREX COMPANY: Bubble wrap (pop bubbles), grocery bags, (all colors), case overwrap, bread bags, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, produce bags, cereal bags, paper towel /toilet paper overwrap, Ziploc or food storage bags, ice bags (DRY – without metal clips), wood pellet bags, stretch film and pallet wrap, furniture foam wrap.

DO NOT INCLUDE THESE ITEMS: frozen food bags, candy bar wrappers, chip and snack bags, net or mesh product bags, pet food bags, pre-washed salad mix bags, degradable/compostable bags or film packaging, six-pack rings, PPE – gloves, masks, or protective wear, bedding or linen packaging, shiny, crinkly films like floral wrap, vinyl shower curtains or tablecloths.

DON'T SEE YOUR ITEM ON THE LIST? See if the package will stretch when you pull it. If yes, it can be included. If it tears like paper, then please don't put it in the bin. **Is the package shiny or does it make a crinkly/crunchy sound in your hand?** If yes, **DO NOT RECYCLE IN THE** NexTrex bin.

Reminder: All plastic must be CLEAN, DRY, AND FREE OF FOOD OR CRUMBS.

50 Years of CRS Rice Bowl

It started with a desire to make a difference.

In 1975, Catholics in Allentown, Pennsylvania, prayed, fasted and gave alms to help people suffering from famine in the Sahel region of Africa—marking the beginning of what would become CRS Rice Bowl. Since then, generations of Catholics across the United States have come together each Lent with one common goal: to end global hunger.

It continued with a commitment to ending hunger.

In the 50 years since, we've been deeply moved by the commitment and impact you've had on this shared mission. CRS Rice Bowl has been proud to bring stories of hope to you and your family—stories about how our sisters and brothers are engaged in activities that break the cycle of hunger and build health and resilience. Stories of people like Hongkham in Laos.

We met Hongkham in 2016, when she was volunteering as a cook at her children's school, which provided free school lunches for students. Her family also received monthly food rations through a Catholic Relief Services program after her husband fell seriously ill and they had to sell their farm. Over the next eight years, Hongkham became a mentor in her community—sharing knowledge and fostering a network of cooks who now rotate duties and make sure the children always have a warm meal to look forward to. Four of her six sons grew up on school meals, and they stand noticeably taller. Her husband's health also improved, and he now works as a carpenter with two of their sons.



When COVID-19 spread across the world, hunger was already deepening. Other problems have contributed to the current food crisis, like conflict and wars, climate change and the rising cost of food. Now, millions of people are living without access to the food they need to live a healthy life. This is dangerous, especially for children who need the right nutrition to grow.

Over the next 40 days, we're going to meet families in Nigeria, Guatemala and Bangladesh who don't have enough to eat. Whether this is the first time you're participating in CRS Rice Bowl, or you were one of the founding parishioners from Allentown, Pennsylvania, we must come together to hear their stories and address this urgent need—because everyone deserves plenty to eat.

In this holy season, let us recommit to our global family as we pray.

Jesus, Bread of Life,

As we encounter you in the Eucharist this Lent, nourish us with your love, unite us in communion with our sisters and brothers, showing us how we are connected. Transform our hearts, that we may be moved to share bread for life with our global family and work for a world where all can thrive. Amen.

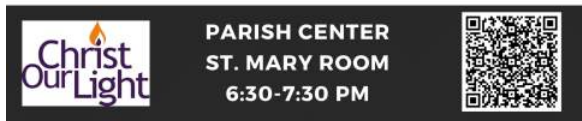
