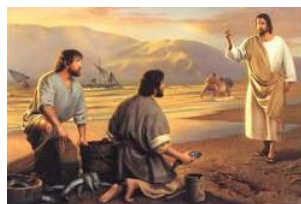

“See, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? In the desert I make a way, in the wasteland, rivers.”

Isaiah 43:19

Our God is an awesome God. He makes a way in the desert and puts rivers in the wasteland. His graciousness and mercy towards us know no bounds. “Neither do I judge you ... Go, and sin no more,” Jesus says, offering a second chance to the woman caught in adultery in today’s Gospel. Reading for April 6, 2025

John 8: 1-11

Adults:

What is the difference between being righteous and being self-righteous?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Think about the choices you made this week. How did God help you make good choices? What got in the way when you didn't?

Children:

How does Jesus help you do what is good and avoid what is not good?

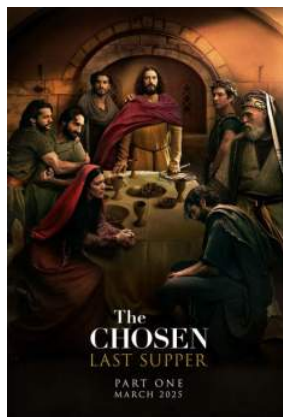

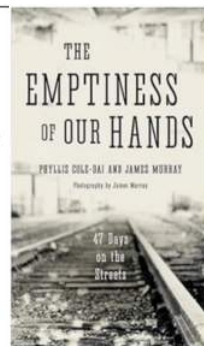

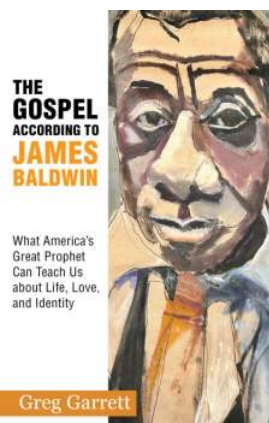

Care for Creation - Palmyra Cove Beach Sweep



Save the Date: Saturday, April 12th will be the next NJ Clean Ocean Action Beach Sweep at Palmyra Cove.

Because of the tides, the Palmyra Cove Beach Sweep starts at 9:30 AM and ends at 12:30 PM, which is a later start time. Volunteers will collect trash and recyclable items on the shore of the Delaware River at Palmyra Cove. Each group will have one volunteer who will tally all debris found and notate in categories such as plastic bottles, plastic caps, snack wrappers, and balloons. All tally sheets will then be tabulated from over 80 NJ beach sweep sites. A yearly report that combines the spring and fall beach sweep is sent to the State of New Jersey. Parishioners of all ages including school age children, families, scout troops, and seniors are all welcome to be "citizen scientists" for a day. If you wonder what you can do to help the environment, this is definitely something to consider doing. Why? The results of yearly reports have changed New Jersey regulations. Shore townships have banned plastic straws after receiving the reports about the number of straws collected and how those plastic straws were found to have killed fish and wildlife. The law banning plastic bags in New Jersey grocery stores is a direct result of the NJ Clean Ocean Action reports.

Another reason to volunteer for this environmental service project is the organization. Palmyra Cove will have a captain from Clean Ocean Action to check registrations and answer any questions you have. The sweep provides grabbers, bags, and gloves. There are red flags to mark items that the sweep captain will tell you to flag and not pick up. A final plus is that the Palmyra Cove building is open and the sweep has table with water, juices, and various snacks. (The website encourages volunteers to bring buckets to collect trash rather than use plastic bags.)

You can join a group from Christ Our Light by going on the NJ Clean Ocean Action website and follow the directions for the April 12th Beach Sweep. Our beach sweep is in Burlington County, Palmyra Cove. To give Christ Our Light volunteers credit and be listed in the annual report, be sure to put Christ Our Light Catholic Church in the space for organization or group. On the southern fringe of the Sahara Desert, the Sahel region spans Senegal, Mauritania, Mali, Burkina Faso, Niger, Nigeria, Chad, Sudan and Eritrea. In the Sahel, temperatures are high and rain is uncommon. In 1976, during a long drought, crops failed, livestock was lost and a lack of food threatened the lives of millions of our sisters and brothers.

It was in that same year that Catholics from around the world participated in the 41st International Eucharistic Congress held in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The theme of the Congress, "The Eucharist and the Hungers of the Human Family," emphasized the central role of the Eucharist in addressing the spiritual, emotional and physical needs of people, particularly in the context of challenges such as hunger, poverty and social injustice.

The Eucharist makes visible our communion with our sisters and brothers and our shared responsibility as one human family. As Catholics, we believe no person should go hungry; however, our world is currently facing levels of hunger that experts believe could be the new normal. That's why it is more important than ever for us to recommit each Lent—and throughout the year—to supporting our global family experiencing these challenges.

As we near the end of these 40 days, let us reflect on what our Lenten journey has meant for us and how the pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving impact not only our lives but also the lives of our sisters and brothers in our local community and around the world. As we strive to live in true global solidarity and are nourished by the Bread of Life, let us share bread for life to ensure everyone has enough to eat amid this global food crisis. When we come together to tackle hunger, there is no limit to what we can achieve.

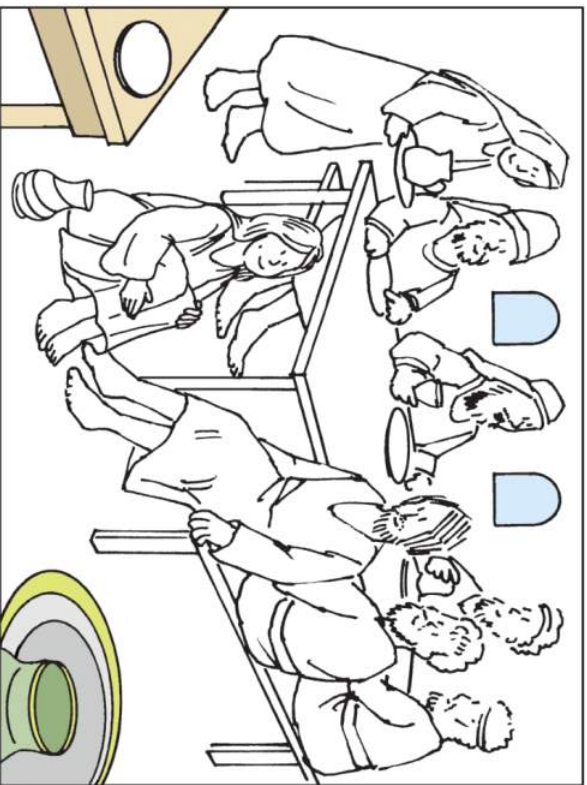

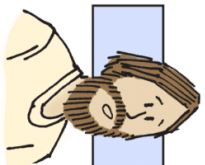
