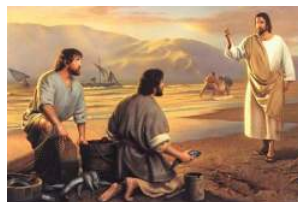

Come and See



"Five loaves and two fish are all we have."

Glory to God in the highest! The miracle of the loaves and fishes is one of the most well known

stories in the bible, and with good reason. Aside from the Resurrection, it is the only miracle that is written about in each of the four Gospels. I have always assumed that the reason for this is that there must be something special about this particular miracle or the impact it had on the people who witnessed it, but as I read it again this year, I find that something different is standing out to me.

I am thinking about the need to be satisfied. Everything we do seems to be in search of satisfaction. We want job satisfaction or satisfaction in our relationships. Each day we need to satisfy our hunger. So many of us spend endless hours trying to do just a little bit more or get a little bit more of something so that we can be satisfied. In the end, most of us find that whatever we get is not enough to fulfill that need, but that doesn't mean that our efforts are worthless. It is part of our human nature to do these things, yet much like the loaves of bread and the fish, they are not enough.

In the gospel, the apostles worry that what they have to offer will not fulfill the need of the crowd that has been gathered for so long to listen to Jesus. Perhaps, the apostles may even have been worried that by giving what little they had, that they themselves would go hungry. They, after all, were probably hungry too. The key moment is when they turn to Jesus and say, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have." They didn't know what to do and realized that they needed guidance from Jesus. In response, Jesus doesn't just perform a miracle, he teaches them, and in turn us, how important it is to know that only with God's help will our offerings be enough. Not only do we need to give everything that we have, we need to surrender to the idea that we cannot find satisfaction alone. We need to give what we have to God so that He can make it more than it seems. Only by doing this, will we ever be fulfilled.

If we can come to see the necessity of God in our lives, we will be open to the true satisfaction that can only come from being united in love with Him. Only then will our bread and fish be enough.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.

- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Elementary Faith Formation

IMPORTANT: Christ Our Light, in compliance with the Diocese of Camden's sacrament guidelines, requires that students have a full year of religion classes prior to preparing for the sacraments of 1st Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist. Students wishing to prepare for the sacrament of Confirmation must attend religion classes consistently from 1st through 8th grade.

- Water (favorite and main source)
- Sports and Electrolyte Drinks
- Fruit and Veggie Juices
- Water-Rich Veggies: Cucumbers, Lettuce, Tomatoes, Zucchini, Mushroom, etc.
- Water-Rich Fruits: Watermelon, Apples, Peaches, Berries, etc.
- Smoothies and Soups

Standard Hydration Goals

- **Children 4-8 years old**
 - 5 Cups or 40 ounces
- **Big Kids 9-13 years old**
 - 7-8 Cups or 56-64 Ounces
- **Teens:**
 - 8-11 Cups or 64-88 ounces
- **Adults:**
 - 10-13 Cups or 80- 104 Ounces

Hydration Goals Change

- You may need to drink more water if:
 - You change altitude, live in a hot climate
 - You exercise
 - You experience vomiting diarrhea or fever
 - You talk for a living like a teacher or a counselor
 - You lose a lot of fluid while you sleep via sweat or mouth breathing
 - Medical History, breastfeeding or pregnancy

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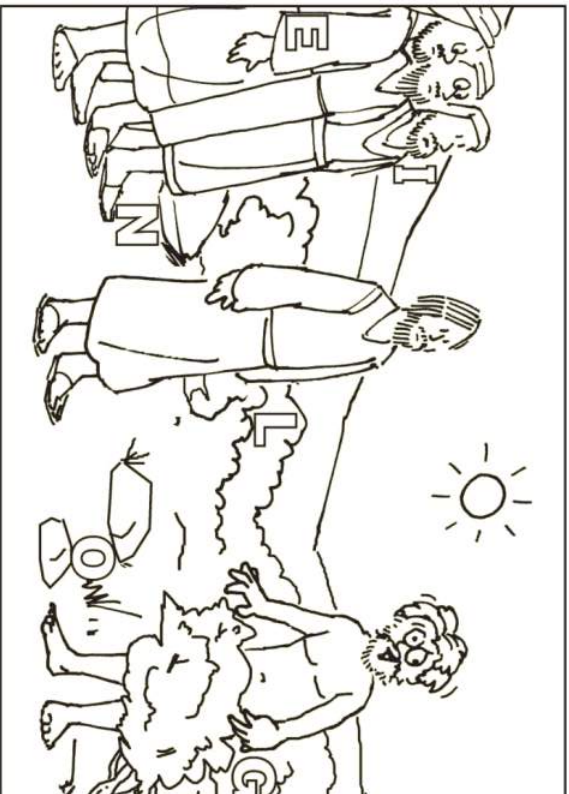

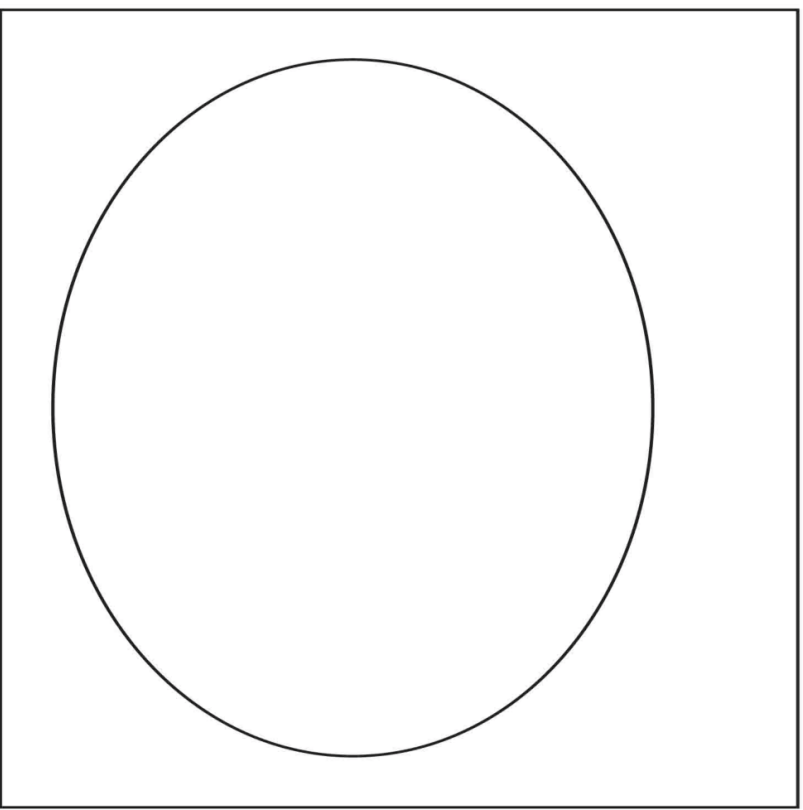
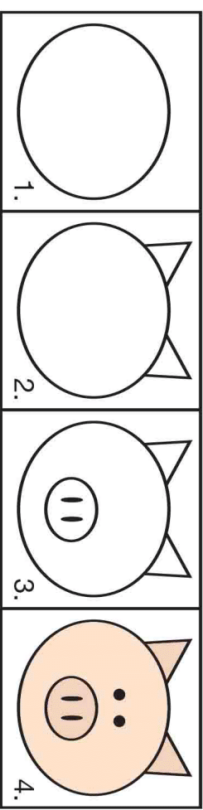
