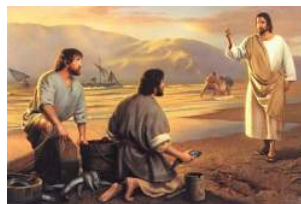

Come and See



During the second reading today, that is taken from Colossians 1:15-20, we learn "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; all things were created through Him

and for Him. But what does that really mean? To me it says that Jesus is showing us what God is like, even though we can't see God. He existed before everything was made and his hand created the world. Jesus is God made visible. To be a disciple of Jesus says I want to learn from you and live like you. The classroom phrase that I use with my students, W.W.J.D. What would Jesus do in this situation?

In Colossians 1:15-20, St. Paul gives us one of the most beautiful and powerful descriptions of Christ. He reminds us that Jesus is not just a teacher, a healer, or a prophet. He is God made visible.

If we want to follow Jesus, we should start by putting Him at the very center of our lives. In today's world this can feel like something that would be hard to accomplish. We can easily get distracted by the noise of the world. Our schedules, responsibilities, fears, and even good things like work or family. But Colossians reminds us that Jesus isn't just part of our life; He is our life. Everything else flows from Him. When we stay close to Christ by prayer, the sacraments, Scripture, and service—our lives begin to make sense. We find peace, direction, and stability.

Our role as disciples is to reflect His image, just as He reflects the image of the invisible God. This doesn't mean we have to be perfect. It means we strive to live in a way that honors Him: forgiving others, standing up for the vulnerable and sharing our faith with love. Our daily actions—how we treat others, how we pray, how we serve—become a way of pointing others to Christ. As disciples, we are part of something much bigger than ourselves. We don't walk alone. We are connected to Christ, our church and one another. Discipleship is not just a personal journey.

As we journey through the Year of Jubilee, we are reminded that this is a special time of renewal, forgiveness, and freedom. This is a time to return to God and be restored. Whether we are traveling on vacation, visiting loved ones, or making a pilgrimage, each trip is an opportunity to live out our faith. Every conversation, every encounter, and every new place we step into can be a moment to witness Christ through kindness, prayer, and joy. Let this Jubilee year inspire us to travel not just for rest, but with purpose—as disciples on the move, spreading peace and hope wherever the road takes us.

Let us walk this path of discipleship together, renewed by God's love and ready to share it with others.

Just wanted to share an update from our recent cultural immersion week! On June 21st, our team headed to **Montego Bay, Jamaica**, to serve with **Mustard Seed**

Communities. It was an incredible experience working with residents who have a range of disabilities. We got to share our love and companionship, and also lent a hand with some much-needed work projects to improve MSC's facilities.



It was awesome to see Fr. Jon Thomas, Robert, and Aidan from Christ the King working in the trenches. They spent 2 days building a trench to help with water drainage!

Daily Mass was especially full of revival, music and dance. Anna and Alyna, young adults from Christ Our Light, stepped up as new liturgical ministers. We even got to celebrate Corpus Christi with the Montego Bay Catholic community at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral. And yes, we absolutely enjoyed some Jamaican coffee after that three-hour Mass and procession! We also squeezed in visits to some famous Reggae spots, craft markets and experienced a beach day at Doctors Cave followed by dinner.

We had the privilege of working with residents living with various disabilities, sharing our love and companionship while also completing vital infrastructure projects. This journey also offered us **simple living**, with dorm-style accommodations and no AC (though the nights were surprisingly cool!), truly taking us out of our comfort zones and fostering a deep sense of **community and fellowship**.

The work was tough but truly **sacramental**! A huge thank you for your generosity! We managed to raise over **\$7,000**, which went straight to the program needs and helped support our trip. Honestly, seeing your generosity in action felt like witnessing answered prayers – it was truly transformative!

One of the most important things is that many of the residents and staff may never get to travel.
