Parish-wide Call to Prayer to the Holy Spirit

A Parish-wide call to prayer to the Holy Spirit
Discernment, Reflection, and Action Towards a Pastoral Council
Wednesday July 30th in the St. Mary's Room (Parish Center)

They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. (Acts 2:42-43)



I invite you all to join me for a parish wide call to prayer, asking the Holy Spirit, for His guidance, wisdom, and movement to be informed and active disciples of Christ. The call for prayerful discernment, reflection and action began when we were going through our, “Come and See” initiative, which entailed a reflection on, “Divine Renovation,” which Deacon Joe led with our Alpha Sessions.

Bishop Williams is also an avid supporter and proponent of evangelization, which he did in his previous Church by going door to door. Our discernment will be rooted in reflection on our own discipleship and how, why, when, and what we evangelize in our parish and wider community.

We will pray and reflect on the following questions

What is God's plan for Christ Our Light?

What makes Christ our Light special?

How can the parish support our growth in holiness and virtue?

What is needed in the parish to deepen our personal relationship with Jesus?

How have I been a disciple | apostle of Jesus?

This call to discernment is an opportunity to unify our parish around a renewed vision and mission. We will continue to hold prayerful discernment sessions for the next couple of months.

In June we celebrated a first ever in our Diocese, five Sundays that were Solemnities: The Ascension of our Lord, Corpus Christi, The Most Holy Trinity, and the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. It is a most opportune time for us to come together now and answer our call to prayer, discernment, reflection and action. This will help us in our own call to discipleship, our parish's call as a community, and in a wider response to our Diocese and Universal Church.

The discernment evenings will assist in forming The Pastoral Council which will greatly assist me in what will be our first and most important task, to revisit and renew our mission and vision. I hope to have the Pastoral Council established sometime this fall. More information will follow as our discernment evenings continue into September – October of 2025.

LIVING IN THE LIGHT

The Word

Reading for July 20, 2025

Luke 10: 38 - 42

Adults:

When have you given over your worries to God?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Youth:

When do you make time to sit with God and listen to the Spirit working within you?

Children:

In the past week, when have you prayed and when have you done good things for others? When could you have done better?

Come and See



Today's readings gently but powerfully call us to reflect on how we make room for God in the everyday moments of our lives—in our homes, our work, and especially in our hearts.

In our first reading from Genesis, Abraham is sitting by the entrance of his tent during the heat of the day—a time for rest, perhaps even boredom. Yet in this ordinary moment, God arrives in the form of three visitors, and what does Abraham do? He runs to meet them. He prepares a meal, offers rest and shade, and welcomes them with generosity and reverence.

Because of his hospitality—his openness to the unexpected—he receives a divine promise: the birth of a son, a sign of new life.

How often do we rush through our days, missing the

opportunities to be present to the people around us? The parent who needs a moment of calm, the friend who is quietly struggling, the coworker who feels unseen. Abraham reminds us that God often shows up disguised as an interruption. When we make space for others, we are often making space for God.

We hear St. Paul's words in Colossians, which shift the focus inward. He speaks of "the mystery hidden for ages"—Christ in us, the hope of glory. This mystery isn't reserved for the saints or the clergy. It's for you, for us—the teacher, the parent, the retiree, the teenager, the caregiver. Christ dwells in us. When we serve in love, when we listen patiently, when we suffer with grace—we are revealing Christ to the world.

In the Gospel from Luke, we find another household encounter with God. Jesus visits the home of Martha and Mary. Martha is busy, preparing, serving, doing all the right things—many of the same things Abraham did. But she's overwhelmed, distracted, and anxious — how often have we felt these same emotions? Mary, meanwhile, chooses to sit at the feet of Jesus and simply listen. Jesus affirms her choice, not because service is unimportant, but because being present to God must always come first.

This Gospel speaks especially to those of us juggling family life, jobs, volunteer roles, and countless responsibilities. It's easy to feel like Martha—doing everything for everyone and still wondering if it's enough. But Jesus invites us, just like Mary, to pause, to breathe, to sit in His presence. That could be five quiet minutes in the morning, a whispered prayer in the car, or even turning off the noise of our phones to listen deeply to a loved one.

Sometimes, the simplest of messages are the most transformative and profound. Welcome God in the ordinary. Listen deeply. Let Christ shine in you.

Be eager to serve.

Be willing to stop and listen.

Be ready to let the mystery of Christ unfold in daily life.

May we all grow in awareness that the Lord is not far from us, and can always be found in the quiet moments, in the people we encounter, and in the choices we make every single day. Find joy in His presence, acknowledge it in a way that is meaningful for you, and share it with others.
