- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Who served?

- We had **99** participants who completed projects at home, at Christ Our Light, or out in the local community. This included several groups, such as COL Boy Scout Troop 70, Marie Lord's 1st grade EFF class, the Servus Dei prayer group, and the Leisure Club's leadership team!
- In addition, we are grateful for the students from Mrs. Hatch's middle school religion classes at Resurrection Catholic School who assembled utensil packets for guests at Joseph's House and made clay hearts for the bereavement program at Samaritan Hospice. 31 sixth graders, 36 seventh graders and 20 eighth graders assisted with these projects.
- There were **27** pints of blood donated at our Blood Drive.



Where did they serve?

- We had teams serving out in the community at United Methodist Communities at Collingswood, Palmyra Cove, Good Counsel Home, Joseph's House, the Cherry Hill Food Pantry, and Urban Promise.
- Parishioners prepared casseroles and sandwiches at home for guests at Joseph's House and individual meals for seniors at St. Bart's in Camden.
- On parish grounds, a team gave a fresh coat of paint to our two single occupancy church bathrooms. Our younger volunteers decorated placemats for guests at Joseph's House.
- We also thank the many parishioners who donated gift cards, clothing for Joseph's House guests, and various items for animals at the Animal Welfare Association shelter in Voorhees.

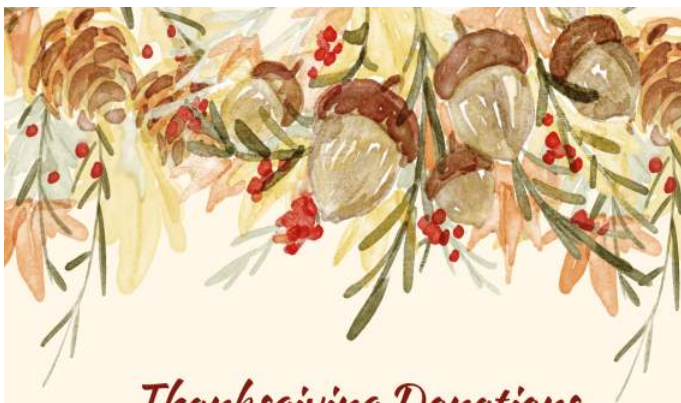

The Youth Faith Formation Teens are Amazing!

It's not too often you hear of people sitting down to handwrite a letter these days. But that's exactly what 17-year-old Antonio Mancino did this past June, and in Italian no less. The recipient? Pope Leo XIV. The Power of a 17-Year-Old's Vision

It all started with a letter—not a text, not a tweet, but a handwritten letter to one of the most powerful people in the world.

Antonio, a 17-year-old just like you, decided to write to Pope Leo.

Why? Because Antonio believes in something bigger than himself. Since his Confirmation, he's felt a genuine **calling** to "bring good to others, to support my community, and bring joy and compassion." Think about that for a second. While most of us are stressing over tests or college applications, Antonio is channeling that energy into service.

His peers and leaders see it. They describe him as the "voice that invites students to take part in serving others," always present with a **servant heart**. Antonio is able to speak to the God given dignity in others - he makes sandwiches monthly with his church community, then brings it to the local homeless shelters.

Antonio isn't special because he's perfect; he's special because he chose to act on his faith. He chose **diligence** over distraction. He chose **willingness** over waiting. He builds his peers up recognizing their dignity as well as the dignity in others outside of his peer group; those abandoned, those afraid, those on the margins through his weekly and monthly commitment.

The Challenge to All of Us

Antonio's letter, and the wisdom it received, isn't just a nice story—it's a challenge to every single one of us. It brought our whole community one huge takeaway: **Renewed Hope!** So, how do we take that hope and make it real in our own lives? It's about five simple, powerful choices you can make *right now*.

1. **Rejoice in the Good.** This is where your **smile** comes in. Don't let the noise of the world drown out the good things happening all around you. Celebrate small victories. A little joy is a contagious force.
2. **Pray.** Taking a moment to connect with your faith—to pause and listen—is an act of profound **integrity**. It centers you and reminds you of your purpose.
3. **Help Others, Especially the Poor.** This is the ultimate test of **honesty/integrity**. Are you living what you say you believe? Look for the overlooked, the underestimated, the person who needs **care**, and offer yours without expectation.
4. **See the Dignity in Others.** Every person you meet—the quiet kid in your math class, the tired cashier, the neighbor you don't know—is worthy of respect. Recognizing their inherent dignity is an act of love.
5. **Continue on the Path of Faith.** This requires **diligence** and **willingness**. Faith isn't a one-time event; it's a journey. Keep learning, keep serving, and strive to become a *pleased witness of the Gospel of Christ*—someone whose actions make others happy and curious about the source of your goodness.

Antonio showed us that you don't have to wait until you're an adult to make a difference. Your **integrity**, your **honesty**, and your **willingness** to be present can change your school, your community, and the world. Be that voice. Be that servant heart. What's the one small act of service you can commit to this week?

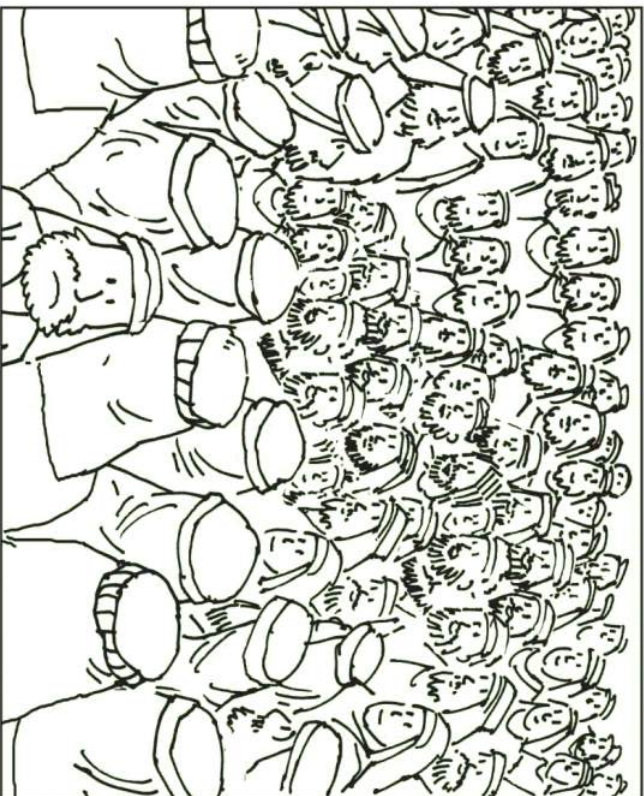

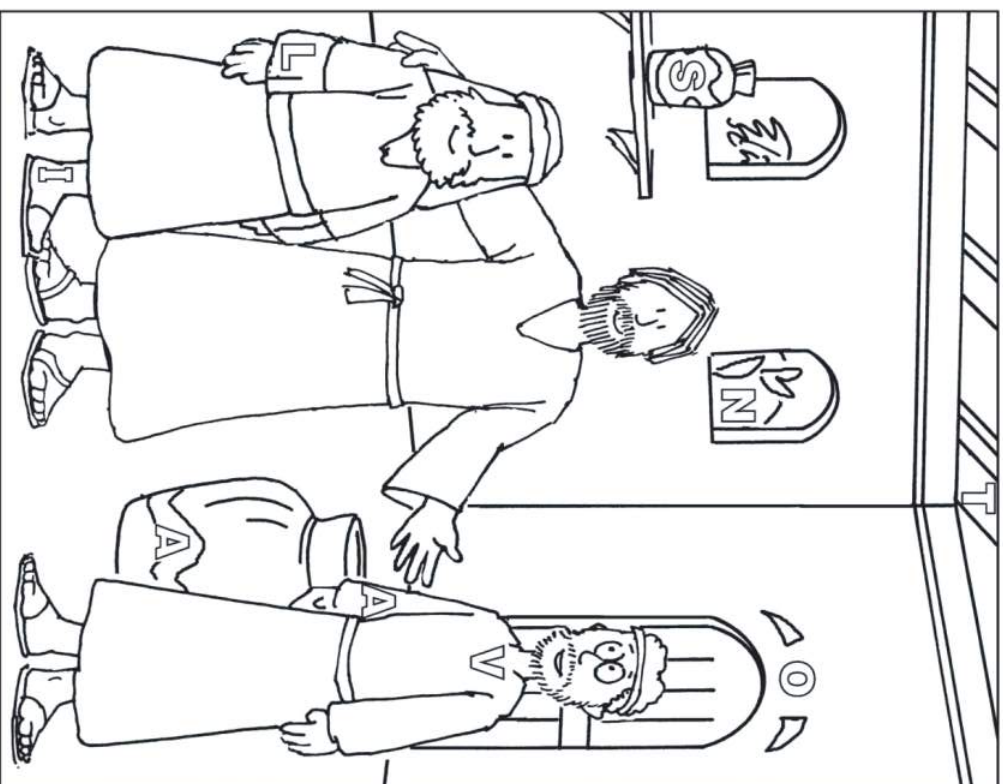
