



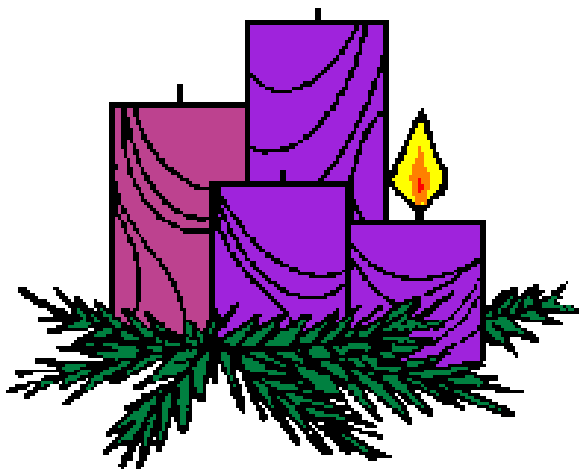

Come and See



Advent always arrives quietly. It doesn't shout or demand attention. Advent invites us to pause, breathe, and listen. The Scriptures today urge us to wake up, to open our eyes

to the presence of God already moving in our lives, and to prepare our hearts for Christ who comes to us in three profound ways: in history at Bethlehem, in mystery through the Eucharist, the Scriptures, the Holy Spirit, and grace, and in majesty when He returns at the end of time.

The prophet Isaiah paints a beautiful vision: all nations streaming toward the mountain of the Lord, walking together in peace. Swords become plowshares. Weapons are transformed into tools for life. Isaiah invites God's people to imagine a different world—a world shaped by God's justice and peace rather than by fear and violence. Advent begins with this vision because Christian hope is not wishful thinking. It is the conviction that God is actively transforming the world, and we are called to take part in that transformation.

St. Paul offers the practical response: *"It is the hour now for you to awake from sleep."* Discipleship demands alertness. We are called to recognize the patterns, habits, and distractions that lull us into spiritual sleep. Advent challenges us to step out of darkness and to *"put on the Lord Jesus Christ"*—to let His way of love shape our attitudes, decisions, and relationships.

Then in the Gospel, Jesus reminds us to remain alert so His Second Coming does not catch us off guard. Ordinary life continues as we wait: eating, drinking, working, and planning. We should not become so absorbed in the our daily routines that we fail to prepare for the next phase of life. This world is not the end of our story.

So how do we stay awake spiritually? Advent offers simple practices: moments of prayer, acts of charity, reconciliation with someone we've avoided, small sacrifices made with love, attention to those who are lonely or struggling. These are the ways we keep ourselves ready—not in fear, but in hope.

This week, let us embrace Advent not as a countdown to Christmas, but as an invitation to begin again. Let us ask for the grace to wake up—to see God's presence more clearly and to walk in the Light of Christ. And through our renewed hearts, may we help reveal God's hope to our world.

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Youth:

What might keep you from recognizing God's presence in your daily life?

Children:

What can you do to be ready for God to come into your heart and your life?

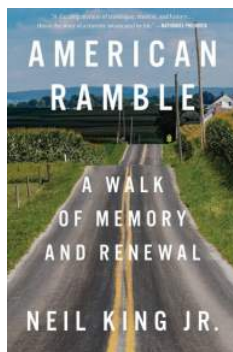

It is a great opportunity for performing service as a family and to meet fellow parishioners. Our sandwich making events take place on the 3rd Sunday of each month from 8-10:30 AM. We invite you to bring beef bologna or turkey, cheese and king-sized loaves of bread. Stay for 10 minutes, or stay for a couple of hours.....whatever your schedule permits. If you would like to get involved with this ministry on a regular basis, or if you are able to deliver sandwiches to the Cathedral Kitchen in Camden, or Joseph's House, please stop by and chat with one of the team members. We can put you on the schedule to deliver and your help will be greatly appreciated!

We look forward to our final event of 2025 on December 21st. Our goal for December is 1,500 sandwiches. With your help, it is achievable! Thank you for all you do in support of this amazing ministry.

Christmas Assistance Programs for Families in Need



If you are in need of assistance for providing Christmas gifts for your children (ages 17 and under) this year, please contact the Parish Office.

All requests are confidential!

Our parish coordinates several programs to assist families in need during this Advent and Christmas season:

- The parish Elementary Faith Formation program coordinates a toy drive benefiting **Sacred Heart Church in Camden's Annual Christmas Toy Store**. This program invites qualified families to shop for Christmas presents at greatly reduced prices for children 12 years and under. Our drive will run from **November 17 – December 5**. All toy donations must be new and unwrapped. Children can bring the donations with them to EFF class or parishioners can drop them off in the Parish Center vestibule.
- Suggested gift donations over \$15 include: sports equipment (footballs, basketballs, Nerf balls/no blasters), dolls (African American and Hispanic), doll accessories (houses, strollers, etc.), Lego sets, games (Connect 4, Operation, Trouble, Memory, Scrabble Jr, etc.), Playskool and Fisher Price toys, and Minecraft.
- Please do NOT donate the following items: stuffed animals, puzzles, coloring books, crayons, Play-Doh, clay, any sports items for soccer, hockey, and tennis, and games such as CandyLand, Chutes & Ladders, and Yahtzee.
- **The Giving Tree** provides gifts to families served by Guadalupe Family Services in Camden. The tree will stand in the Gathering Space Alcove during Advent beginning the evening of Saturday, November 29. If you would like to participate, please take a tag, purchase the requested item, and return the gift to the tree **by Monday, December 15**. Gifts should be returned unwrapped with the tag attached to it, though a gift bag or wrapping paper with tape is much appreciated.



- **The "Adopt-a-Family" Christmas gift program** invites parishioners to sponsor Christmas gifts for children of local families in need. Last year we were able to help close to 60 families with physical gifts and gift cards. There are several ways to be a part of the "Adopt-a-Family" program: you may choose to buy physical gifts for a specific family, donate gift cards for a specific family so the parents can shop for their children, or you can donate gift cards/checks to a general program fund for parish staff to disburse among our program recipients. 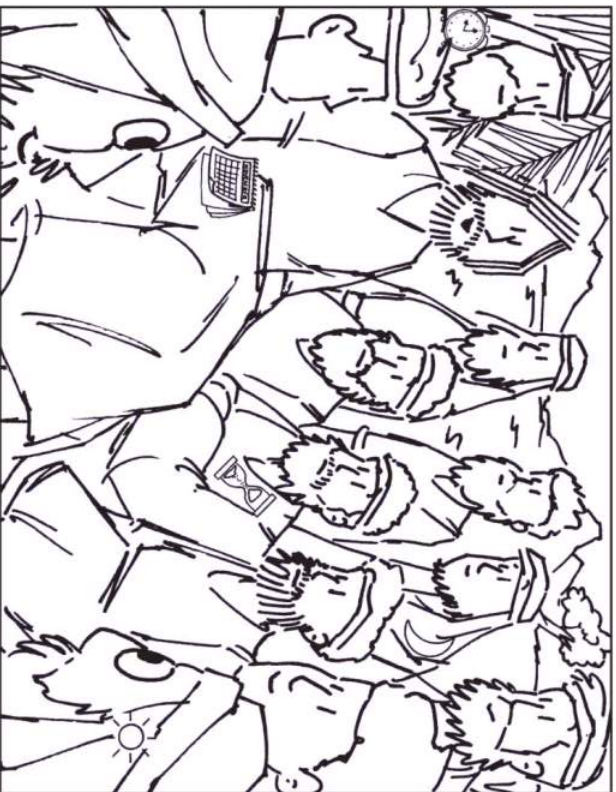

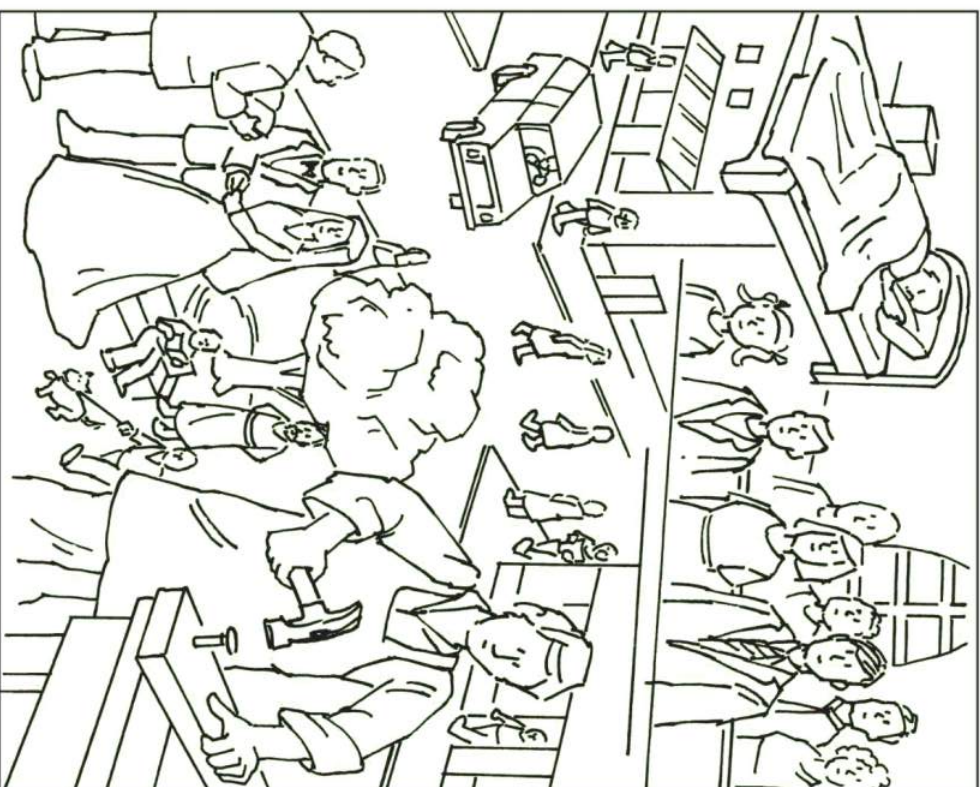
