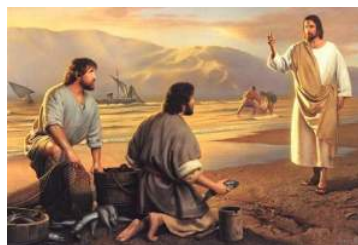

Come and See



In today's gospel, John the Baptist is heralding a life-changing message to all of us. Throughout history, when messengers were sent out from the ruler's palace, they would

shout their message ("Hear ye, hear ye!") for all of the people to hear. The message was typically of life-changing importance. That is exactly what John the Baptist is doing when he cries out, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" John the Baptist's message is still applicable today. Are we hearing it this Advent? Do we sense its importance, or are we just going about our usual December routines?

How can we do what John is urging? How can we repent? One obvious answer is to turn to the sacrament of repentance that Jesus gifted us...the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Sure, we all have lots of reasons for not going. Know that those reasons are definitely coming from Satan, who would do any trick to prevent you from receiving this grace. Jesus gave us this sacrament, this gift of grace, when He told his disciples after His resurrection, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained" (John 20:23). Our priests serve as instruments of God's mercy and love in this sacrament (and they don't remember what everyone tells them, in case that is a worry). I know when I wrong someone I love, I'd prefer to apologize in person, and by going to confession I am apologizing to Jesus (through the priest) and receiving Jesus' forgiveness and blessing in person.

As we go into this new week, let's ask ourselves if we are truly repenting this Advent season. Do we take better care of our cars than our souls? Do we work hard to keep the interior and exterior of our cars clean? If the windshield is dirty (which we can see more clearly when driving toward the sun than when driving away from it), do we wash it to see better? Let's take our soul to the carwash and wash it clean of sin in the sacrament of reconciliation. Let's drive with clear vision toward the Son. Consider going as often as you take your car to the carwash. Let's keep our souls clean from the stains of sin so that when Jesus does come again we are ready.

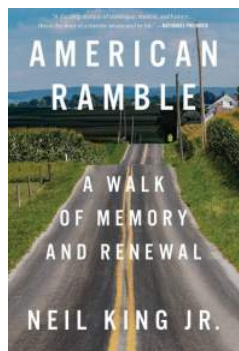

Holiday Stress Management

While the holidays are often considered a joyful and celebratory time of year, they can be particularly stressful or lonely for many people and for a variety of reasons. Some of these reasons (such as the loss of a loved one or distance from family and friends) is unavoidable. However, there are some stress that can be lessened, even just a little, with a few helpful hints.

- **Accept Imperfection:** Clinical Psychologist Neda Gould of Johns Hopkins reminds us not to set the bar too high for ourselves. By setting unrealistic expectations or impossibly high standards for ourselves, we can wind up feeling more pressure and more stressed as we prepare for the holidays as well as disappointed or upset if our celebrations do not meet these standards.
- **Keep a Focus on What Really Counts:** When stressors arise (ex. long grocery lines, delayed packages) try to keep that frustration in context and not let it ruin your entire day.
- **Respond with Kindness:** We never know what is behind someone else's behavior. When we encounter a challenging person, that individual could be scared, hurting, or even stressed themselves.

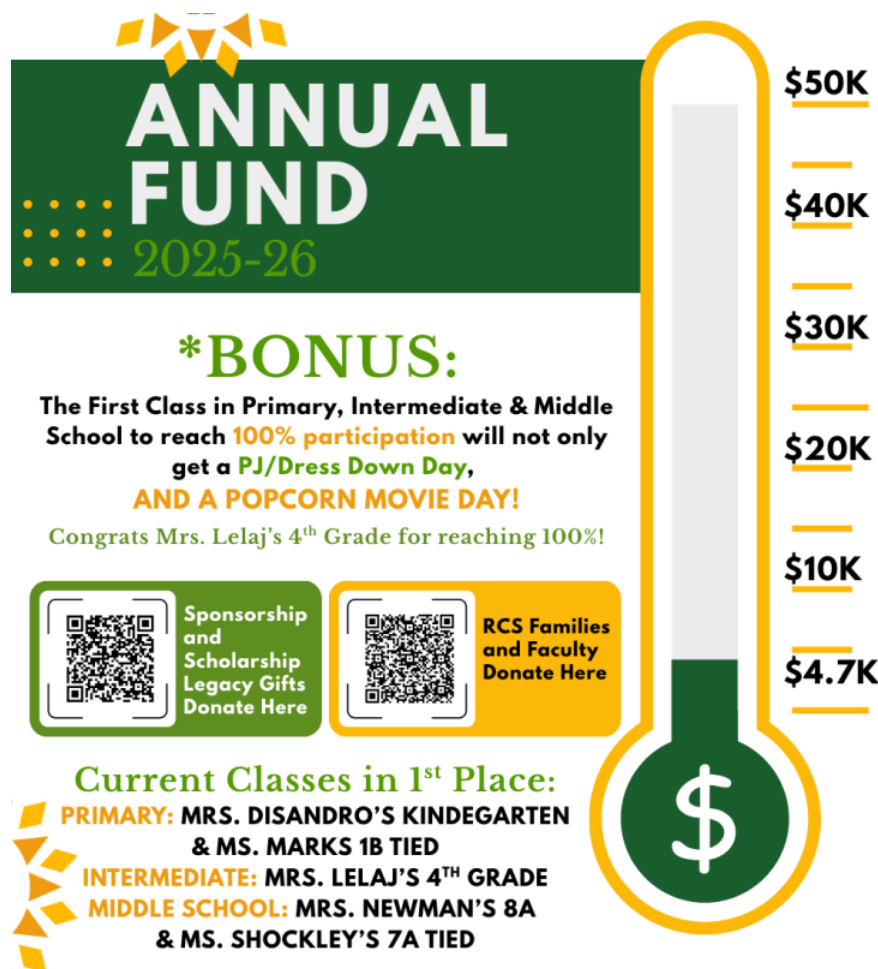

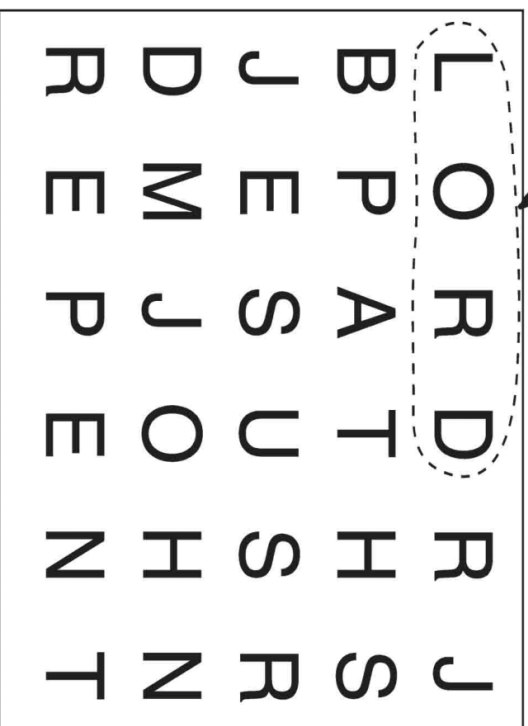
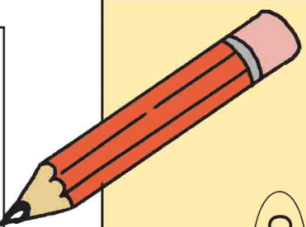
